

## **Owner offers Errol Estate golf course to city for \$6.3M**

Mayor says city not interested

The owner of the defunct Errol Estate golf course has offered to sell the property as is to the city for \$6.3 million in cash, a figure based on the owner's 2020 appraisal that was made public.

5th Hole Investments

LLC, headed by the family of Julian (Larry) Klein, enclosed the proposal with a May 31 letter to Mayor Bryan Nelson and the Apopka City Council. The letter was copied and sent to city finance director Blanche Sherman regarding the property's utility liens.

The golf course itself includes nearly 380 acres and 170 net usable acres, located west of Wekiwa Springs State Park and north of U.S.

441 in Apopka.

The as-is \$6.3 million cash offer includes a proposal to pay two Errol Country Club utility liens with an outstanding balance of about \$295,000.

The letter mentioned the city's \$4.7 million acquisition of Camp Wewa to preserve the campsite for public use. Whereas Camp Wewa is about 70 acres, Errol has over five times the acreage at about 380 acres.

"The City, after purchasing the Errol property, could use, operate, lease, re-sell, and/or partition the property, for various public opportunities," the letter states. "The [future land use]-residential acreage could be sold for development to recoup purchase costs. Non-usable land could be converted into perpetual conservation, which would drastically re-

## West Orange Trail Bridge reopens

Bridge is part of \$4.5 million West Orange Trail overhaul

Battling inclement weather on Saturday morning, the community celebrated the grand reopening of the recently upgraded West Orange Trail Bridge, a local landmark users said they are excited to use again following months of closure.

On Saturday, May 31, attendees celebrated the reopening of the nearly 20-year-old bridge located at the U.S. 441/Orange Blossom Trail at South Forest Avenue in Apopka. Among the highlights were a fun run, bike and walk led by the Apopka Run Club, a ribbon cutting and a drone photo from the top of the bridge.

To make the bridge safer and more enjoyable for multimodal use, the county helmed I said, 'Well, we can be as the \$2 million project from good as Winter Garden and October 2024 to this past April. The upgrade involved structural repairs like metal replacement and cosmetic improvements including pressure washing, painting the bridge trim and grooming palm trees. New amenities include emergency placards and wayfinding signs.

trict 2 Commissioner Christine Moore told the crowd at the ceremony. "I was talking to many of you before, and Oakland.' What did you all tell me? We could be? Say it again, we can be --- ['Bet-ter!' the audience responded] That's right. We're going to be better." The bridge refurbishment was part of the \$4.5 million overhaul for the estimated 22-mile West Orange Trail, which got at least 20 miles of new asphalt, signage, and edging for erosion control. The 30-year-old trail runs from the Killarney

Station west of Oakland to Welch Road in Apopka.

The Orange County Parks and Recreation budget provided the money for the entire trail project.

## **Council to review** proposal of sleeper buses for homeless

Idea arose from law prohibiting public sleeping

A Winter Garden and Cocoa-based homeless outreach organization proposed the concept of sleeper buses to the city of Apopka as a means of helping people move off the streets and toward a life of independence and self-sustainability.

Scott Billue, founder and CEO of the nonprofit Matthew's Hope, presented the proposal at the June 4 Apopka City Council meeting, a proposal he said would cost the city nothing.

According to Billue, a sleeper bus will pick up people and park overnight in a location between 7 p. m. and 7 a. m. the next morning. One bus will accommodate 20 homeless people for a maximum of three days.

for one sleeper bus, the first bus is expected by year's end, with subsequent buses following a 120-day timeline.

Billue emphasized that the sleeper buses will not solve homelessness.

"Anybody who talks about eradicating homelessness clearly doesn't understand it," he said. "But what we can do is we can make a dent in it. We can make a change in how we approach it because doing the same old, same old is what's going to get you the same results we're seeing right now."

The idea for the sleeper busses arose from the passing of Florida House Bill (HB) 1365 in 2024, which "prohibits counties & municipalities from authorizing or otherwise allowing public camping or sleeping on public property without certification of designated public property by the Department of Children and Families."

"I wanted you to be here because today is the day that we are going to activate and reinvigorate this whole trail area," Orange County Dis-

"The commitment is we need to finish the trail," Apopka Mayor Bryan Nelson said. "We have this 22 miles from here to Clermont, which is awesome. We love it. We love it. All we have to do now is to finish from here to neighborhood lakes at the Lake County line."

In 2024, Orange County celebrated its 200th anniversary, and the Orange County Parks and Recreation Division celebrated its centennial

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## Impact fees provide key funding to support growth

Impact fees charged by counties and cities is the method for growth (new development) to pay for the new infrastructure needed to support a thriving community.

These impact fees are levied on all new construction, including residential, com-

mercial and industrial to pay for new water, wastewater, reclaimed water, police, fire, recreation and roads that are needed to support the new jobs and residents moving into the jurisdiction.

At the City of Apopka and all other Central Florida municipalities, we are constantly looking at the impact fee charged to make sure that we are charging an adequate rate for the improvements needed to meet the demand. State law demands that we charge an appropriate impact fee rate but not an excessive rate, and the city must hire consultants to verify that the rate we are charging is not excessive.

Over a decade ago, new roads

creased cost of road improvements.

Southwick Commons, an affordable housing complex currently being built within Apopka city limits, paid a total of \$418,176 in transportation impact fees for the 192 units under the old rate to help with traffic congestion in the southeast side of town.

The two new affordable housing complexes being built just outside of the city limits on Marden Road and Plymouth Sorrento Road had their transportation impact fees of \$4,604,347 waived by the Orange County Commission. The Orange County Board of County Commissioners voted to waive transportation impact fees for qualified affordable housing projects. The county transportation impact fee waived is based on its urban/suburban transportation impact fee. These two county projects impact city residents that use Plymouth Sorento, Marden and Apopka-Ocoee roads. Transportation impact fees are a critical funding source for expanding road capacity but cannot be used for general maintenance. It is critical that our state and local governments work together to make sure that we have the funding to maintain and improve our state and local roads to provide the necessary transportation infrastructure needed for residents.

## Tips to promote good local advocacy

Advocacy. I want to share some observations from serving on the Orange County School Board and Orange County Commission to help you elicit better outcomes. This column will focus on advocacy at the local level.

Advocacy at the local level has two distinct areas. One is more personal or smaller maintenance concerns and the other large community-wide concerns. If your garbage wasn't picked up, if your storm drain is plugged, if street signs or crosswalks are faded, or you notice a traffic control device (stop sign or signal) is malfunctioning, contact 311 or my office at 407-836-5850.

This past weekend, a superb corridor chief, Larry Branan, asked for my help. Thus, I drove and inspected Edgewater Drive through downtown Lockhart for him. He wanted my ideas for his volunteer corridor care team to complete this fall. Plus, I help him better engage the county public works staff. This is a team sport!

The timing of reporting a concern is also critical to your success at advocacy. I wouldn't recommend calling or texting an official on holidays or weekends. I also don't recommend showing up at a clean-up or big event hoping to find 10 individual minutes of attention. I recommend writing an e-mail, calling the office, or making an appointment.

Secondly, how can you better advocate for solving large, systemic problems like overdevelopment, destruction of the environment, lack of infrastructure, affordable housing, etc.? First, know that most elected officials recognize these gargantu-

an problems. They likely ran for office out of a sincere desire to serve and solve these issues. Remember a hasty response might have unintended consequences.

I personally follow and attend conferences hosted by national groups. Strong Towns, Florida Main Street, Florida Association of Counties, and Florida Redevelopment Agency are superb organizations. I'm scheduled to take a CRA 101 course in August. You can also get ideas on solutions from experts. Advocate with your local officials utilizing proven solutions.

There are many ways to successfully engage with your county or city staff and leaders. Additionally, join a civic organization, an HOA board, sports organization, or one of my District 2 people groups.

This Saturday, June 7, we are cleaning up Clarcona Road in Southern Apopka, and on June 14, we are painting the Apopka Pass. There is power in groups that actively assist. I hope you ioin!

and repaving were covered in large part by the gas tax that you pay at the pump, and these dollars supported state, county and local roads.

In the last decade, cars and trucks have become more fuel efficient and their MPG has increased by over 20%, which translates into 20% more cars on the road paying the same amount of gas tax.

If you take into account the approximate 10% of EV cars on the road today, the gas tax is not coming close to covering the cost to maintain and improve our roads.

To make up that difference, the city continues to supplement the streets budget with more gencross the stage.

To prepare, the school board held a budget workshop where we discussed all the challenges we expect to face in the coming

severely under-enrolled schools.

Under-enrolled schools are a drain on the district budget since there are not enough students in the school to generate the funding needed to operate the school fully. The district has to supplement these schools. Therefore, it makes good financial sense to move kids from over-enrolled schools to these schools to optimize enrollment and funding.

These are difficult discussions that are likely to continue throughout the summer and school year, not only in our school district, but in school districts across the state.

"June is the start of summer break, making it the perfect time to equip them with

lifesaving skills before they spend time around water during the summer months," YMCA of Central Flori-

da District Vice President of Operations Kristen Cole said.

The Y will hold one free

Safety Around Water class every week for eight weeks at the Downtown Orlando YMCA Family Center. In addition to teaching children water safety tips and skills each week, the Y will also provide free swim gear to each participant.

"Seeing the confidence and joy on their faces as they learn to swim is a powerful reminder of why this work matters," Cole said.

The partnership between the Y and the Homeless Coalition began in summer 2022, when the Homeless

Coalition asked the Downtown Orlando YMCA for summer programming. As a result of this connection, the Downtown Orlando YMCA will have taught over 80 children from the coalition by the end of the summer.

"Drowning prevention is one of our core causes, and we believe every child deserves access to swim safety - regardless of their circumstances," Cole said.

## City lifts irrigation limit

The city of Apopka has lifted its public notice of water supply conservation as of Tuesday, June 3.

"We quit Tuesday," Mayor Bryan Nelson said in a June 4 interview. "We no longer have a water restriction."

As of press time on Thursday, the irrigation public notice was still on the city website, but Nelson said staff would be removing it.

Because the city already sent out the current water bill to customers, the announcement of the lifted water conservation notice won't be published in monthly newsletter that accompanies the bill, Nelson said.

On April 28, the city ordered a communitywide mandatory restriction on water usage because of "an increasingly faster depletion of the water supply being observed at the City of Apopka Potable and Reclaim Water Plants."

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Under the restriction, irrigation activities were permitted only before 10 a. m. and after 4 p. m. on alternate days, and irrigation activities were limited to 15 minutes per zone. The city had asked

both residential and commercial customers to not lay down new sod until the water restrictions were lifted.

Violating the restrictions meant a written warning for the first violation, a \$50 fine for the second violation, a \$100 fine for the third violation, and \$500 fine for subsequent violations. Each day that any violation exists was considered a separate offense.

When the public notice was enacted, the drought level was D1 (moderate) to D2 (severe). Apopka saw just 0.05 inches of rain in April, but that was followed by 10.9 inches in May, according to RainDrop.

So far this year, Apopka has received 15.81 inches of rainfall, which is just above the average of 15.73 inches.

## **Dream Lake ES explores possibility** of optional school uniforms

Other schools in district have policy in place

Dream Lake Elementary School is exploring the possibility of implementing an optional school uniform policy for its student body.

The decision to explore school uniforms began after an April meeting of Dream Lake's School Advisory Council (SAC). Following the meeting, a parent survey went out to the community on May 2 and received more than 300 responses.

The SAC was set to vote on June 5 — if a quorum is present — on the survey feedback, which will then be used to decide on school uniforms, Dream Lake Principal Dr. Carol-Ann Clenton-Martin said. The vote was to take place past press time.

Dream Lake Elementary School is not the only Orange County Public Schools (OCPS) location to consider a school uniform policy or enact it.

"It's not like we will be the first," Clenton-Martin said.

"That's not the case. But now I will say this: There are Title One schools and there are affluent schools and there are other schools. But this school, if it were to even move forward, would not be the very first Orange County Public Schools that has uniforms."

SAC is comprised of families, teachers and administrators, including Clenton-Martin, who discuss guidance at a school and make recommendations to the school administration. A SAC is different from a Parent Teacher Association or a Parent Teacher Organization because the latter conducts fundraisers for the school and provides volunteer services, district spokesman Michael Ollendorff said.

The issue became a hot topic of discussion after an individual posted in a local Facebook group about a possible vote on Dream Lake school uniforms. The May 22 post had received 127 comments as of June 3.

"Dream Lake Elementary parents...a meeting is scheduled for June 5 at 4 pm to vote for or against school uniforms next year," the post said. "It seems unfair to schedule a meeting during the summer with only 2 weeks notice & during hours when many people are at work or will be away due to previously scheduled vacations. How do you feel about school uniforms?"

Clenton-Martin called the Facebook post "misinformation" and noted that it wasn't authorized by the school.

"It's just been a little interesting point of contention," Martin said. "Our parents and their voice are being captured in the survey, and what happened with [the Facebook post] is not even really reflective of how our internal school community is dialoguing about the topic."

Ollendorff said the post was filled with incorrect information because it conflicts with OCPS's summer schedule.

"Schools are closed, effective end of business today," he said in a May 30 interview. "All instructional staff is done for the year, and the only people who would be on campuses would be the administration and 12-month employees who, for instance, like the registrar when people are coming in to register students. Then starting next week is when we go to four-day work weeks, and the schools will only be open Monday through Thursday."

Dream Lake Elementary School is a K-5 school located on North Park Avenue. As of May 15, it had a student enrollment of 684, according to the OCPS website.

duce maintenance expenses. Parks & Recreation opportunities could be achieved by either re-selling or transferring property directly to Errol HOAs, as opposed to any City-funded ventures."

5th Hole's proposal letter mentioned that the city once wanted the creation of a recreational taxing district.

"If the City wants public ownership of a large portion of the property, then the City should take on that ownership themselves in good faith," the letter states. "We submit that the residents do not want to form a taxing district, however, the City could still pursue that goal as a potential publicto-public transaction."

Calling the \$6.3 million as-is cash offer a "fair" proposal, the letter states that 5th Hole reserves the right to illustrate that the property could fetch a higher value depending on the property's development potential: "This offer alone does not constitute a perpetual exclusive hold on the property for the City's consideration. The property

may otherwise be sold to a third party at any time."

On Wednesday, Mayor Bryan Nelson told The Apopka Chief that the city cannot afford the property and he has no plans to respond to the letter.

"We don't have \$6 million to spend on the golf course," Nelson said. "I know they have an offer from somebody to buy the property, but I guess they think they can get more money than that."

On Monday, City Com-

missioner Diane Velazquez said she was surprised by the letter and and emailed city staff, including interim city administrator Radley Williams, Sherman, city clerk Susan Bone, and city attorney Cliff Shepard. She questioned the city's interest in purchasing a private golf course.

"I don't think the city has the money for that," Velazquez said. "If we had \$6.3 million for that property, then we should be fixing Golden Gem [water reclamation pond] because that's what it's going to probably take to fix Golden Gem and then some. And it's a private golf course. I don't understand why the city would even be interested in purchasing that."

She said the city's Camp Wewa purchase was a different matter because it benefits the community.

"It benefits the public because they can go use Camp Wewa," Velazquez said. "They can rent Camp Wewa

[as a venue]. We have camp for the kids. But buying a private golf course in a residential neighborhood? That's more for a private developer to come in and buy that, not the city."

Commissioner Nadia Anderson contacted city staff to better understand the existing agreement regarding the closed Errol Estate golf course. She said she was not aware of any recent discussions about the defunct golf course acquisition.

"There is some type of agreement that's in place that I currently do not have a copy of, but once I actually see that agreement, I know there's some type of stipulation agreement that took place prior to me being in office," Anderson said.

For many years, the Klein family faced an uphill battle in maintaining the golf course's viability, to the point where the city stepped in to help with the property's maintenance. Developers such as Celebration-based Signature H presented the golf course

owner with proposals to save the golf course.

Julian (Larry) Klein, who died in 2018, was spending \$50,000 to \$60,000 a month on the golf course's operational costs.

In 2018, Signature H proposed the New Errol concept, including a renovated golf course, a boutique hotellodge and a community water park, among the amenities. The proposal received City Council approval but never moved forward because 5th Hole Investments and Signature H dissolved their working relationship. Since then, the golf course, clubhouse and tennis courts closed and the clubhouse was torn down.

Last summer, 5th Hole Investments listed the former golf course at Errol Estate for \$7.5 million through the Orlando commercial real estate firm Foundry Commercial.

In 2020, the Errol Estate Recreation District Advisory Committee met to seek options for a possible Errol Recreational District, but the plan didn't gain traction.

leaders and learned that the bill's purpose was to move people toward services. The entire state budget for addressing homelessness is \$35 million, whereas Matthew's Hope's budget for covering 17 municipalities is \$15 million, Billue pointed out.

The type of liability involving sleeper buses would depend on what the agreement between the parties would look like, according to city attorney Andrew Hand.

"One of the things I'll mention for the city to be liable would require some sort of negligence or some sort of intentional act on the city that would give rise to liability in the first place," Hand said. "But again, I think it just matters as to what the ultimate agreement is between the organizations, and certainly you can request insurance so coverage is provided for the city area."

Billue assured the City Council that Matthew's Hope has several layers of insurance, which is "my greatest expense," he said.

Mayor Bryan Nelson suggested the city could pay for insurance if partnering with a church and see what local churches would partner in giving extra services.

The Apopka City Council has agreed to consider a formal agreement at its next meeting, June 18, for approval for Matthew's Hope to park sleeper buses in the city.

According to wyldoaks.com, Wyld Oaks' development plan includes 200,000 square feet of retail, two hotel sites, a medical campus of approximately three acres, and around 4,000 residential units.

"I'm excited to share the development plan for Wyld Oaks, including updates about several new co-creators," Beninati said. "My vision for the future of real estate development in Apopka is one where Wyld Oaks serves as a blueprint for sustainable, community-focused growth that

attracts investment, creates jobs, and positions Apopka as a vibrant destination that benefits generations to come."

Beninati sees his partnership with the chamber as crucial to the development of Wyld Oaks.

"The opportunities to connect with the business community at events like the Real Estate Expo have been vital to establishing this new economic center that will serve the booming growth in Apopka," Beninati said. "The chamber understands and shares our vision for Wyld Oaks as a catalyst for the region's continued growth, and we're looking forward to more opportunities to collaborate."

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


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### Franklin Vaden Blackman

## Planning Commission

On the consent agenda on June 4, the City Council voted to reappoint members William Gusler, Wes Dumey and Mary Norwood. All of their current terms are set to expire on July 6, and all three indicated they wanted to be reappointed, according to a city staff report.

Gusler and Norwood were originally appointed to the Planning Commission in December 2018 and were reappointed in July 2022. Dumey was first appointed in July 2022.

Commissioner Nick Nesta began the discussion by asking if the provisions in the land development code (LDC) regarding absences and discussions are being followed. He also asked who oversees adherence to the LDC within the Planning Commission. Bobby Howell, interim executive director of the Community Redevelopment Agency, said the Planning Commission chairman oversees that.

Because the city is moving forward with city charter amendments, specifically term limits for the mayor and commissioners, Nesta proposed adding term limits to the LDC for the Planning Commission.

"It's always good to have new blood coming in to give new outlooks and opinions, especially with a growing city," Nesta said.

Howell said the LDC would need to be amended to include term limits for Planning Commission members, similar to the city charter amendments.

Nesta asked about the timeline for amending the LDC and whether the council would consider term limits for the Planning Commission.

Howell said the LDC will have to be rewritten to be consistent with the city's comprehensive plan, which is expected to be reviewed in July.

The comprehensive plan rewrite would be impacted by Senate Bill 180, which addresses emergency preparedness and response in the state. Both the Florida Senate and House passed HB180, but it is awaiting action from Gov.

Nesta asked if any Planning Commission members' terms are expiring within the next year, to which Howell said he has to check the records to confirm.

"I request that we add this as an adjustment to the LDC as we're coming along with our normal timeline," Nesta said. "Again, it's going to mimic our [city] charter, and I think it's advantageous to do."

The Planning Commission was created to serve as the city's local planning agency to evaluate plans and make recommendations, including development plans, amendments to the LDC, zoning map and future land use maps.

The Planning Commission usually meets on the second Tuesday each month at City Hall, with extra meetings scheduled depending on the volume of applications or the subject.

All seven members must reside within city limits and are appointed to three-year terms by the mayor and approved by the City Council.



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

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## Rolson resigns, blames transfer portal for departure

Former coach says 20 players left program after spring game loss

#### By Marshall Tempest Reporter

Former Apopka head football coach Jeff Rolson says he resigned on May 30 because the transfer portal has made it impossible to maintain the high standards that propelled Apopka's program into a perennial powerhouse. Rolson pointed to the de-

parture of 20 players after the spring game as the breaking point that sparked his surprise announcement last week.

"It's been increasingly more difficult to achieve and maintain the standard that we've set in the past, over the last 25 years," Rolson said in a Monday phone interview. "We've just lost a bunch of kids, and it's hurt us."

Rolson said the transient nature of the game is evident

after every loss.

"After the first-round loss in the playoffs, eight guys left right then," he said. "Then you get through spring and finish the spring game, and you have a bunch of guys walking out the door. You cannot survive losing 20 kids off a 4–5 team with one of the tougher schedules in central Florida."

Rolson's decision to step down came after six seasons at the helm of the Apopka football program, three of which ended in the state championship game. Overall, Rolson amassed a 55–23 record and three seasons of at least 11 wins.

Apopka High School has not announced a replacement yet, but with the fall season approaching, it will need to fill its head coaching vacancy quickly. Apopka athletic director Aaron Crawford did not respond to a request for comment.

Before taking over at Apopka in 2019, Jeff Rolson

## Apopka baseball coach leaves for Ocoee job

Bobby Brewer says being at Apopka is no longer fun

Ocoee High School announced Thursday the hiring of former Apopka head baseball head coach Bobby Brewer, who stepped down last week after six seasons on the job.

The news came just days after Jeff Rolson's sudden resignation as head football coach, leaving Apopka without leaders for two major sports programs.

"I'm going to miss wearing that Blue Darter jersey," Brewer said. "I'll miss the boys because we always got along well with the kids. I'll miss the coaches, and I'll miss all the games. But the biggest thing is, to the parents that really miss them."

The switch to a rival Apopka area school, Ocoee, is a shock to some who know Brewer's storied history with the Apopka baseball program. Brewer's influence spans decades as a player, assistant, and, most recently, head coach.

As a three-year starter at first base from 1977–79, Brewer had the rare honor of playing under three of Florida's most respected coaches while a Blue Darter at Apopka High School: Pete Dunn (1977), Chip Gierke (1978) and Sonny Wise (1979). He was a key contributor to the 1979 team's Final Four run.

Brewer returned to the program as an assistant coach during the Sonny Wise era, helping guide Apopka to state prominence and even national top 10 rankings in the 1980s and

I think it's just about camaraderie. People don't always see the camaraderie between the police and fire departments. I think this shows that camaraderie between those in charge of public safety for the city of Apopka."

Apopka Fire Chief Wil Rivera-Sanchez echoed McKinley's sentiments but was more excited about the outcome. He said it's important for the community to see first responders in this light outside those stressful situations you would normally find yourself in when dealing with police or firemen.

"It's also about giving that opportunity to kind of unplug and get away from the real life of what they (first responders) deal with on the day by day and being able to enjoy themselves."

## Apopka teen places fifth overall in open-water mile swim

Keira Druck placed first overall in the women's category

Keira Druck, a 13-yearold Apopka native, finished fifth overall in an open-water mile swim at Doc Lucky's Golden Mile in Orlando last week.

Druck collected prize money, a medal and more while continuing to improve as the long course season, her bread and butter, approached.

Druck had a fantastic outing at The Golden Mile, finishing fifth out of 229 competitors and first overall in the women's division. With a time of just under 19 minutes, 18:53:53, she shattered the 13–14 age group record time. Druck was the only woman to finish in the top 10. The five men who finished after her were all older than Druck, between the ages of 14 and 18.

Druck said when she fin-

ished fifth ahead of so many, including men who were older and seemingly stronger than her, her other competitors were shocked to see her. She said they were looking at her with shock and awe. They couldn't believe she finished ahead of them.

She impressed the crowd as well.

"One dude that finished behind me came up from the water and looked at me like I was crazy," Druck said. "Then I looked over, and people (in the crowd) were waving at me, and I looked around and behind me, thinking they were waving at someone. But there was no one standing behind me. I did not know who that was waving at me."

The Golden Mile is a one-mile open-water fundraising event in which over 200 people between the ages of 10 and 74 compete. The event benefits the Lake Crane Restoration Society, a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving and enhancing the environmental quality of Lake Cane in Orlando.

With her 18:53:53 finish, Druck earned \$1,000 as the first overall female competitor, an award, flowers and some merchandise. She was also allowed to leave her name signed on a door for first-time swimmers in the event.

Druck prefers the pool and is not traditionally an open-water swimmer, but she has recently had the oppor-

The peak times for catchin' bluegills and shellcrackers is May and June, right around the full moons, and the full moon for this month is next week, Wednesday, June 11th, at 3:45 in the mornin'. That's when it will reach full phase, but accordin' to info I found, the best time to view it will be the evenin' of Tuesday, June 10, just after sunset when it rises in the southeastern sky. Now, you're on your own as to guessin' how the fish think!

I've been reportin' that folks are catchin' plenty of panfish on Lake Kissimmee, right around the pads. The water temperature is just right for bluegills, and they should be bitin' in all

of our lakes this month. The bluegills will spawn from April through October but May and June are the peak months. By the reports I'm gettin' so far this month, they're bitin'! So go get you some red worms or crickets or grass-shrimp and head out to catch a mess of fish for supper. And, make this a family outin', because the whole family can get in on the action!

The bass fishin' is doin' pretty good on the Harris Chain. My fishin' buddy Rick Mullins is fishin' with his brothers-in-law Greg Fugate and Carl McIntosh from Kentucky. They've caught over 15 bass up to four pounds over the past two days. They'll be fishin'

together all week hopin' to catch a biggun. And they'll be fishin' all over Central Florida, includin' Johns Lake and the Butler Chain. I hope you three guys have a great week, and I'll give everyone an update next week on how y'all did.

Congrats to Kennie Steverson from Umatilla who won the American Bass Anglers Top 150 Solo tournament last weekend. It was held out of Venetian Gardens Ski Beach on Lake Harris. He weighed in 10 bass over two days; they weighed 47.30 pounds. For his work (and fun), he got a check for \$4,500. He said he caught all of his bass by fishin' the shell bars. He could see the fish on

the shell bars with his livescope. If there weren't any fish on the shell bar, he would go fish the next shell bar. He says he never locked through any locks either day.

Finishin' in second place was Aaron Yavorsky of Palm Harbor. He weighed in 42.49 pounds; he also caught big bass of the tournament. Aaron's big bass hit the scales at 9.26 pounds, and that got him an additional \$1,000 to go along with the \$2,000 that he won for second place!

If you've been wantin' to go fishin' in our great state of Florida, and you didn't have a fishin' license, well, I have some good news for you. This weekend, June 7 and 8, you can try fishin' in salt water for free on those two days. And the followin' weekend, June 14th and June 15th, you can fish in *fresh* water for free! The FWC has set aside these next two weekends to allow residents and visitors to explore fishin' here in Florida. So get the family, and let's *all* go fishin'.

I really hope you get a chance to go fishin', especially now that you don't need a license for the next two weeks.

again in the early 2000s. He became head coach prior to the 2020 season and brought stability to an Apopka baseball program in transition.

But perhaps Brewer's most iconic achievement came outside high school baseball — as head coach of the 2001 Apopka Little League team that captured the national title and advanced to the Little League World Series final. Though they fell to Taiwan in the championship game, the team was dubbed "America's Team" and brought national attention and pride to the Apopka community.

Over his six years as head coach of the Apopka baseball team, Brewer amassed a 91-48 record, a 2022 Regional Semifinal appearance, and three District Championship appearances.

Brewer's departure from Apopka comes after a  $14-10\ 2025\ season\ where\ the$

tunity to step outside of her comfort zone and attack the open water.

In the long-course season, Druck will race 400, 800, and 1500-meter races, which are all shorter than a mile. So, Druck's preparation should allow her to see a big improvement in her times. Druck told me she hasn't swam a mile in a pool in over a year, so she hasn't seen her improvement yet, but she will very soon.

This week started Druck's pool season, as she competed in a meet that began Thursday and will end Sunday. This would have been her first mile race in a year, and her time will be very important for her seeding in the state championships, as it will be the only mile race she competes in before state.

Druck said her goal time

In the 2025 season, Apopka played a majority of its home games away because of problems with the new facilities' construction in the early months of the year. The Apopka baseball and softball complexes were supposed to be completely operational by the time the season started, but they were not, forcing home games to be rescheduled into mid-March.

These complications raised questions from players' parents and the community about the program, which put stress on this season and the team's personnel.

Brewer told the Chief this week that the most significant reason he is stepping away from the program is that it's just not as fun as it used to be for him. He clarified that the joy he has gotten from working with his players has been what has kept him here for so long, but he wants a new perspective.

"You got to have fun doing this," Brewer said. "And again, it's just to the point where things ain't like they used to be. I love being a Blue Darter. I really enjoyed my time with the players, and I really enjoyed my time with the parents who supported the programs. And sometimes it only takes a few things or people to make it not. And I'm just not having any fun."

Now, at Ocoee, Brewer may face off against his former players come spring next vear.

"I'm gonna be rooting for the guys every time they play anybody," Brewer said. "If we get a chance to play them, and I don't know if we will, obviously I want us (Ocoee) to win. But the kids know who I am and that I like to win. I'll root for them

against anyone else. I'm with them to the finish line."

Despite his departure, Brewer told me he really does believe the Apopka team will be amazing next year. He said that just because he took the Ocoee job doesn't mean he doesn't believe the team he left is capable of success.

"I think they should be one of the top teams in all of Central Florida next year," he said. "They've got a great player in every position on the field. This year, the maturity level will play a big role because the team will be totally senior-oriented, especially the pitching staff. And it's gonna kind of hurt my feelings a little bit because it's not me there, but I needed a change of scenery."

Apopka athletic director Aaron Crawford did not respond to a request for comment for this story.

had already built an impressive coaching resume. His early coaching journey took him through various roles in Illinois and Missouri during the late '90s. He was a part of the coaching staff for Apopka's 2001 state championship team and a defensive coordinator for the 2003 Valdosta, Georgia, squad that made a run to the state finals.

After that, Rolson began to find chances to be a head coach. He was Osceola High School's head coach from 2006 to 2009, guiding the team to a Class 5A state runner-up finish in 2007. After that, he spent two seasons (2010–2011) as head coach at Panama City Rutherford High School before joining Rick Darlington's Apopka coaching staff as a defensive coordinator, before Darlington left in 2019.

Rolson told the Chief the biggest reason he stepped down last week was that he didn't see himself being able to help the program be successful in this new era of high school football. He said that he is old school in his coaching approach, and in the age of the transfer portal and programs pandering to players, he doesn't fit.

Rolson said his mission is to teach his players and the members of his program how to be men. Through toughness, discipline and accountability, he said he tried to mold young boys into responsible men, better husbands and better fathers who can face real challenges in life.

"I want them to be mentally tough enough to deal with that adversity and do it the right way," Rolson said. "What we do now is, 'Hey,

I don't like what I'm doing,' or 'I don't like what they said,' or 'I don't like how hard I gotta work,' or 'I don't like this, that or the other. I guess I'll just go over here.' And that's teaching people nothing."

Rolson said his situation became untenable.

"I can't go out there and coach right now," he said. "That's not a good situation for me or the kids. They need a fresh start."

Rolson said he is his most prominent critic, and anyone who knows him knows that's true.

"Nobody wants to win more than I do," Rolson said. "Nobody wants to have a great program more than I do. Nobody wants to see Apopka flourish and have great success and produce men of character like I do. I want that as much or more than anybody else out there. But I'm just not the guy to do that for them right now. And that just became apparent when we got 20 kids leaving. That's not something you can survive. And obviously, whether they would say that or not, I feel like it reflects on me."

Rolson said this spring has been about rebuilding and refitting the team. He knew it would be tough, but he was up to the challenge — until the spring game happened.

Apopka fell 31–14 to the Jones Tigers on Friday, May 23. The score tells a different story than the reality of the game, where Apopka showed obvious growth and competed against a very strong program. The Blue Darters moved the football offensively, but that didn't matter to many players.

Rolson said while other schools and programs can poach

Apopka players with promises of scholarships, offers, and state championships, he can't recruit at all because Apopka can't enroll new students.

"We're at capacity, so all we do is lose kids," he said. "I don't want to recruit kids anyway. I would want to play and win with Apopka kids. And we just can't do that anymore right now."

Rolson said he has a problem with promises of grandeur from other schools and wouldn't operate his program like that even if he could.

"I'm not gonna lie to kids," Rolson said. "I'm not gonna tell them they're gonna get scholarships. I'm not gonna do those things where I make empty promises that I don't know I can keep."

Rolson says the recruiting bothers him because it shouldn't be that way, but he does not blame the student athletes for trying to control their own destiny.

"I don't look at the kids and say, it's a kid problem, it's a societal and cultural problem," Rolson said. "I just don't like the fact that we lose a bunch of kids and to programs that have never, and probably will never, have the kind of success that we've had and very mistakenly listen to the promises of scholarships and offers."

He said the grass is not always greener on the other side, but it is always greener where you water it. No matter where you go, you won't be successful unless you want to be. You have to work at it every day, and it's not easy. He said a lot of student athletes now just want to be guaranteed to win without the required effort.

"I think I'm from a time

of responsibility and commitment," Rolson said. "That's not where we're at right now. So that's not what I want to be a part of."

Rolson said he has no plans to continue coaching elsewhere and will enjoy his off time with fewer responsibilities. He also said that he is not retiring and will continue to work at Apopka High School if there is a place for him in the fall.

Rolson said he is blessed to have been a part of such an important program when he looks back on his time at Apopka, and he relishes the relationships he built.

"I wouldn't have traded it for the world," Rolson said. "I wish I could have been better. I wish I could have done more. I have no regrets; I'll always treasure it and wish them the best of luck."
