# Apopka boys' soccer snaps Lake Brantley win streak with a draw

The Apopka boys' soccer squad hosted the Lake Brantley Patriots for a rivalry matchup on Tuesday, January 16. The Patriots were 10-3 coming into the game and on a six-game winning streak that Apopka ended as the game finished as a draw. The boys are now 6-7-2 and sit sixth in 7A District 3 only above Evans who is 0-6-1.

Lake Brantley put the pressure on from the whistle. They started with aggressive forward runs with far overhead passes from the Patriot defense focused on trying to catch the Apopka offense sleeping. Apopka did well to shut this down by keeping their defense up to catch offsides calls on the Patriots and clearing the ball as soon as it touched the ground.

For the first part of the first half, Lake Brantley had most of the possession and kept it center-field or on Apopka's side of the field. But whenever Apop-

ka got the ball, they made great work on the attack and even had some shots on goal early on. Apopka's offense was focused on counterattacking the aggressive Lake Brantley offense and punishing their mistakes by forcing the ball back to the Patriots' side on a fast break. They did well to spread and create opportunities, but off-target and overpowered shots kept them from scoring early.

The first goal of the game came in the 33rd minute from Lake Brantley's Emilio Bacardi on a near impossible angle in

# History of success for AHS girls wrestling, on a roll this season

The Apopka Blue Darters have demonstrated a prime to take the next step past perennially placing inside top-10 decisiveness. A number of elements can be used as measuring sticks through roughly the first third of the season.

Final place of no worse than fifth place among the individual bracketed tournament meets are the most direct and obvious means of measurement, though. The Blue Darters are also a perfect six wins in as many opportunities among two dual meets as well.

"Obviously, a satisfying continuance of results as the season has progressed," Apopka coach Bruce McMillian said. "What we have done so far does not mean a repeat, let alone bettering, though.

There are a number of steps before the last. However, the start we have put together is the first step."

The standings for nine of the last 10 state championship meets have included the Blue Darters among the top-10. Last season, Apopka placed third with five wrestlers competing. Total of five wrestlers was an increase from three during the 2020-23 season. Six wrestlers through the first five meets have produced legitimate potential of qualifying for the state championship meet.

Hananeel Gregoire (100 pound weight class), Shelby Sherman (110), Nehemie Gregoire (135) and Jada Jones (190) qualified last season and have placed no worse than second this season.

However, Dalliane Thompson and Michelle Hernandez have placed in-

side the top five as well.

There is only one class in the sport of girls wrestling.

"We have done as much as possible to position ourselves at this point of a season for a better result at the state championship meet, though," Mc-Millian said. "Even better than perennial top-10 at the state championship meet and into a second medal contention at the least.

The sport of girls wrestling has also taken on a higher profile and equal status at the same time as the Blue Darters' even better start than last season's finish.

A state championship meet has been held for girls wrestling by several other sanctioning bodies since before 2000. Last season the sport of girls wrestling


The Apopka Blue Darters boys' basketball went 1-2 in their games after press time last week, losing to Edgewater, Ocoee, and defeating Wekiva. Now 8-9, the team still sits third in the 7A District 3 standings under Lake Brantley (10-5) and Evans (11-6).

## Apopka @ Edgewater (70-37)

On Wednesday, January 10, the Blue Darters traveled to Edgewater for the first round of the OCPS Metro Conference Tournament. Facing a foe they had met earlier in the season and lost to, the Darters were eager to show their improvement since their first matchup. When they met, the Eagles were 12-2 and trying to bounce back from only their second loss

of the season.

The first quarter was

a slow quarter with most possessions for both teams ending in no points. Edgewater struggled to make shots, was giving away the ball, and was not battling for offensive rebounds. Apopka was moving the ball well, but still had trouble with turnovers and missed open shots.

The Darters went 5-for-13 in the first quarter scoring 10 points. Edgewater went 5-for-11 from the field in the first quarter bringing in 10 points as well.

The Darters weren't playing significantly better than they had all season or better than they did when they first faced Edgewater. It was more that Edgewater wasn't playing as well as they had all season.

Coach Scott Williams talked with the boys after the first quarter about the importance of boxing out because of the difference in size and strength.

In the second quarter, Apopka was still neck and neck with the Eagles but by halftime, things were starting to go south. Apopka held a lead in much of the second quarter until about halfway through the quarter when Edgewater called a timeout.

Williams was telling the boys to stay calm and play their game while the Edgewater bench was livid with their performance. After the timeout, the Eagles

# Bobby Biaggi is Wekiva's new Athletic Director

Seasoned and experienced, Bobby Biaggi has taken over the reins of the Wekiva Mustangs High School's athletic department. Biaggi was officially named the athletic director of the Wekiva Mustangs for a second time soon after the 2024 calendar year began.

"Leaving the Cypress Creek Bears a second time was not an easy decision," Biaggi said. "My time as part of the Bears' athletic department was enjoyable. There is something to be said about working 21 years at the same school. A number of productive and meaningful relationships need to exist. However, few schools are still developing the attributes which make up the overall character and personality. Wekiva provides an opportunity to put my fingerprints on the more specific direction the unrealized potential has yet to be realized. A lot can still be learned as part of the situation. Serving as the Mustangs' athletic director is a great opportunity to continue to grow and develop career-wise because of that

rareness "Yet, for as attractive as the rarity of that opportunity is, there is no substitute for the quality of life. In particular, the quality of life is finally having the means to be logistically closer to my family and thus spend more time together. Our home in Winter Springs is considerably closer to Wekiva than Cypress Creek. Distance between jobs for my wife as a

teacher at Dream Lakes Elementary is much closer as well. The border with Orange County also makes the distance much closer, as far as the relationships with my sons. Both attend schools in Seminole County.'

While a graduate assistant at the University of Central Florida and a part of the Knights' athletic department, Biaggi met his wife. Kelli who was a student-athlete at the time.

"The passion for athletics grew and developed and was not unusual," Biaggi said, "but athletics are a challenge. Obviously, defeating an opponent is the tangible and general chal-

"Several more subtle and underlying challenges which when met add up to the general challenge of winning exist though and have not changed. That list of subtle and underlying challenges includes discipline, focus and commitment. Again, when a youth, and today, the list remains the same. A sense of satisfaction and the effort being worthwhile occurs when meeting the challenges. Then there is the adrenaline of competition. My motto became a position in athletics is better than none.

However. Biaggi's progress towards a career in athletics began as a youth growing up in Tampa. The first attention he drew as an athlete came while at Jefferson High School Dragons, competing in the sports of football, soccer, baseball as well as track and field.

"So I knew a career in athletics was the right fit while willing to go the extra mile. However, I wanted to pursue a career in an area specifically allowing for the work to be with youth. My character and personality are the right fit for serving as a positive influence on youth through a common passion for athletics and overseeing administrative responsibilities. The position of athletic director is an opportunity to pursue

The path the majority of coaches follow before moving into athletic administration was not followed by Biaggi though.

Biaggi completed the University of Florida's Bachelors of Science degree in Exercise Sports Science during 1996. The Masters of Arts in Exercise Physiology was earned from UCF. Granted by the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, a Certified Athletic Administration Certification is held by Biaggi.

Upon matriculating to Knights' athletics, Biaggi began his career as a graduate assistant, working primarily with the football and baseball teams.

Then in 1999, Cypress Creek came calling as Biaggi accepted the head athletic trainer position. At the time, the Bears' athletic director was Al Saour and Biaggi's place among high school education soon turned to athletic administration. In an unofficial capacity for eight school years, Biaggi served as an assistant athletic director and Saour's right-hand

bass to help his stringer. So that kinda tells you about his catch. But hev, you get a check for winnin' not for showin' up. So, no matter how you get it done, just







Davis continued to play a great game being active all over the field as a true midfielder. The Apopka defense also was steady; the only shots they allowed in the final 15 minutes were from penalties that gave the Patriots free kicks right outside of the box on multiple occasions.

turned it on.


The Darters also struggled in transition not bringing in any fast break points compared to the Eagles, who had 22 points in tran-

"They're really good, and we can't line up and play with them if we're gonna make mistakes like missing layups and throwing the ball away the way

we did. Until we play smarter, we can't win a game like that" Coach Williams said after the game.

"The game is pretty simple. The first way to win is to not lose. And so for the first half, we didn't lose...but in the second half, we did a lot of losing things. We didn't defend well, we let them get wherever they wanted, and we were terrible with our ballhandling decisions and our spacing. We missed 10 layups. So now what we've done is we've beaten ourselves and we're playing a really, really great basketball team. There is no way to survive that."

#### Black Bears are off limits unless you have a permit As our temperatures warm up and the wildflowers start blooming, the bears come out of hiding. Cubs are born in January and February, which means mother bear is foraging and looking to defend her cubs.

The full name of the Bear Rule is the Florida Black Bear Conservation Rule 68A-4.009, Florida Administra-

The rule means that, although the Florida black bear was removed from the list of State-designated Threatened Species (68A-27.003, F.A.C.) in June 2012, it is still unlawful to injure or kill bears without prior authorization from the Commission.

The rule also states FWC will continue to engage with landowners and regulating agencies to guide future land use to be in line with the objectives of the Florida Black Bear Management Plan.

You are not allowed to "take" a bear. The Bear Rule relies on the definition of take in Rule 68A-1.004, F.A.C., which includes pursuing, hunting, molesting, capturing, or killing, or attempting those actions, whether or not such actions result in possession of the bear. In addition to take, Rule 68A-4.009, F.A.C., generally prohibits anyone from possessing, injuring, shooting, wounding, trapping, collecting, or selling bears or their parts or attempting to engage in such actions without prior authorization from FWC.

Violation of the Bear Rule is a criminal misdemeanor, which can result in fines up to \$1,000, and/or up to 1 year in jail, and/or the loss of recreational licenses for 3 years for a first offense. Multiple offenses can result in higher penalties, longer imprisonment, and/or permanent suspension of recreational licenses.

FWC does not consider it to be a violation of the Bear Rule to scare a bear off your property by yelling, banging pots and pans, using an air horn, honking a car horn, shooting with paintball pellets, or using bear spray. Please follow the FWC guidelines on how to safely scare a bear from your property. You can also use a motion-sensitive device (e.g., Critter Gitter®, Water ScareCrow®) that displays flashing lights, emits loud noises, or deploys a spray of water when something approaches the device.

The Bear Rule describes situations in which FWC can issue permits to allow the intentional take of bears. For example, the collection of scientific data needed for conservation or management of the species or taking bears that are causing property damage when no non-lethal options can provide practical resolution to the damage, and the Commission is unable to capture the bear. Additionally, Commission Rule 68A-1.004 defines bears as a game species, 68A-9.007 defines the special use bear permit, and 68A-13.004 allows for the opening of a bear hunt.

#### The complete rule:

(1) No person shall take, possess, injure, shoot, collect, or sell black bears or their parts or to attempt to engage in such conduct except as authorized by Commission rule or by permit from the Commission.

(2) The Commission will issue permits authorizing intentional take of bears when it determines such authorization furthers scientific or conservation purposes which will benefit the survival potential of the species or to reduce property damage caused by bears. For purposes of this rule, activities that are eligible for a permit include:

(a) Collection of scientific data needed for conservation or management of the species;

b) Taking bears that are causing property damage when no non-lethal options can provide practical resolution to the damage, and the Commission is unable to capture the bear.

(3) The Commission authorizes members of the public to take a bear in an attempt to scare a bear away from people using methods considered non-lethal. Staff shall authorize specific methods and situations that qualify for this authorization at http://MyFWC.com/bear/.

(4) The Commission will provide technical assistance to land owners and comments to permitting agencies in order to minimize and avoid potential negative human-bear interactions or impacts of land modifications on the conservation and management of black bears. The Commission will base its comments and recommendations on the goals and objectives of the approved Florida Black Bear Management Plan. The plan can be obtained at MyFWC.com/Bear.

set after qualifying describes the profile. However, there is more to this program than last season's qualifiers. Purpose and work required to achieve the purpose of maintaining the numbers began last season timewise. Daliane and Michelle watched and learned from what was watched last season. Performances reaching a good enough level to qualify began with heeding the talk.

"Taking the required action because heeding the talk has been the norm throughout the season. Best possible situation means in the position to match last season's total of qualifiers or perhaps more. Positioning ourselves is a continuation of the motivation to not waste any practices, an opportunity to improve one step at a time.

Advancement of each individual entry during each weight class tournament is based on a field of 16 during the regular season

Even with Sherman unable to compete, Apopka placed in a tie for fourth at the Girls Knight Out (Ocoee Knights hosting) and Lady Bears Classic (Cypress Creek Bears). Twenty-three teams competed at both meets with the Blue Darters final place among the top 21 percent. Apopka claimed the 2023 Grenadiers Girls Grappler Classic. (A story about the meet can be found in

the December 22 issue.)

During the Girls Knight Out on Friday, January 12, the Harmony Longhorns captured the championship with 183.5 points. Next in the standings were the Jones Tigers (144 points) and Gateway Panthers (128). The host Knights tied the Blue Darters for fourth place (124).

Individual championships were claimed by Hananeel Gregoire and Nehemie Gregoire. Hernandez (second), Jones (second) and Hernandez (third) placed under the Apopka banner.

All seven Blue Darters wrestlers competing won at least one match while a team record of 21-6 or .778 winning percentage was compiled. Sherman was unable to compete due to concussion protocol. Protocol was cleared this week though.

Apopka won 17 matches against only four losses for a winning percentage of .810.

Individual weight class championships were claimed by Hananeel Gregoire, Nehemie Gregoire and Jones. Hernanadez captured fifth place after losing

the first match.

Rounding out the Blue Darters' roster was Elianna Lavoile, competing in the 105 pound weight class.

A potential maximum of 30 points were left on the table with Sherman unable to compete.

"Consistency at the most basic and fundamental level is putting in the work to develop the talent, McMillian said. "Each Apopka team passes down to the next the first and foremost importance of developing talent is only possible when the behind the scenes work, practicing is done. "I think we have a genuine opportunity to do even better than we have as far as consistently placing inside the top-10. The first of what will hopefully be a streak of placing inside the top-three was achieved last season. Placing in the top-five or even three is the next step.

"However, chasing the end overall goal of taking the next step remaining the priority is not easy. We can't lose sight of what we are doing at each and every meet during the regular season. If we aren't focused solely on the meet we are competing in at the time, we don't perform well. Wrestling is like every other sport. A poor regular season means no postseason qualification."

# Hoops: APK falls to Ocoee but defeats Wekiva for second time

Apopka @ Ocoee (53-48)
For the second round of the OCPS Metro Conference Tournament, the Darters faced off against district opponents, the Ocoee Knights. The Knights were 9-6 when the Darters faced them and coming off a 71-59 loss to Windermere in the first round of the tournament. The free throw differential would be the difference in this matchup.

The first quarter would set the stage to come with Apopka and Ocoee being neck and neck fighting for every possession. Apopka went 4-for-11 from the field in the first quarter bringing six of their points from threes and the rest from inside the paint. Ocoee went 3-for-11 from the field and brought in three of their points from the free-throw line.

The second quarter went similar to the first with Ocoee just barely outscoring Apopka 18-16. The Darters went 7-for10 from the field shooting great going into the locker room. The Knights went 7-for-17 from the field and brought in three of their points from the free-throw line.

Apopka outscored Ocoee 11-10 in the third but were then outscored 13-11 in the fourth. With the deficit just a hair too much to come back from, the Darters fell to the Knights for their second loss of the tournament.

Like I said earlier, this was a battle at the charity stripe with Ocoee getting 26 visits to the free throw line while cashing in on 19 of them, and Apopka only having 12 trips and collecting four of them.

Other problems for Apopka in the game were fouling, which sent the Knights to the line so many times. Apopka collected 18 fouls and turned over the ball 15 times to Ocoee's nine. Those turnovers led to 10 points for Ocoee.

It was a good game and a good performance by the squad,

but little things like turnovers and fouls are the rock in Apopka's shoes, preventing them from going at full speed.

#### Apopka vs. Wekiva (46-34)

In another great rivalry matchup the Blue Darters and Mustangs met up in the third round of the tournament ready to prove themselves after each losing both of their previous games in rounds one and two.

The first quarter was a low-scoring one with Apopka taking the early lead 8-5 by the end of it. The Darters went 4-for-9 from the field in the first quarter, and the Mustangs went 2-for-7 and brought in one point from free throws.

Apopka began to distance themselves from Wekiva in the second quarter, ending it up 22-14. The Darters went 3-for-7 from the field in the second quarter and brought in six of their points from three and six points from the free throw line. The

Mustangs went 3-for-9 in the second quarter and also brought in six of their points from threes and one point from free throws.

In the third quarter, the Mustangs outscored Apopka, for the first time all game, 13-11 but still were trailing going into the fourth quarter 33-27. The Darters went 4-for-9 in the third bringing in another six of their points from threes and one from the free throw line. The Mustangs shot 4-for-12 in the third and brought in four of their points from the free-throw line.

It wasn't as exciting a fourth quarter as Apopka and Wekiva's last matchup with the lead changing every possession, but it did end with the same result, Apopka winning. The Darters outscored the Mustangs again in the final quarter 13-7 and brought a victory to their tournament performance. Apopka shot 4-for-6 in the final quarter bringing in another six of their points from threes and three from the free

throw line. Wekiva shot 3-for-9 from the field in the final quarter.

Apopka shot great from three cashing in on six of their 14 attempts which was the difference maker in points. The Darters also had twice as many trips to the line as Wekiva with 18 attempts making ten of them. Wekiva turned the ball over 15 times but only allowed Apopka seven points from turnovers. And, both teams struggled in transition only scoring two points each.

Apopka played great all around with eight assists, 23 rebounds, five steals, and seven deflections. Wekiva played a good game too with six assists, 19 rebounds, four steals, and three blocks.

Apopka and Wekiva have one more matchup this season on Friday, January 26, slated for a 7 p.m. tipoff at Apopka.

Most importantly as far as the future plans were concerned, Biaggi impressed the administrators while learning the ropes of athletic administration. When Saour resigned at the end of the 2007-08 school year and already established within the department, an offer was made to Biaggi to become the next athletic director.

"The previous athletic directors did an excellent job of laying down the groundwork for a championship culture to exist," Biaggi said. "Having a championship culture is the product of repetition, a foundation which is relied on over and over during the course of a sustained period of time. Even though in place and solid, tangible results usually take time to be realized because understanding how to rely on the foundation is a learned experience. During the first few years, all of the teams had modest aspirations, a .500 record and being competitive were at the top of the list. Then the teams' ambitions were to advance to the postseason tournaments or qualify for the state championship meets (individual based sports)."

Biaggi previously

served as Wekiva's athletic director between 2018-2020. As an athletic trainer, Biaggi has remained up to par with qualifications, maintaining athletic trainer certification through the National Athletic Trainers Association.

"Eventually and over the past five or six years, a handful of teams have continued to progress towards realizing deep runs into the tournament is the norm," Biaggi said. "Most noticeably, boys and girls basketball have recently advanced to the state championship final-four as well.

"However, the department progressing be-

yond the current juncture is only possible with the existence of a more strenuous focus on drawing support from the community. Talent itself has great potential. 




