The boys fell to the Evans Trojans, who went all the way and became District Champions, 65-53. The girls fell to the Ocoee Knights in the Dis-

trict Championship game 51-24.

Although making it farther in the District Tournament, the girls (some-how) did not rise high enough in the FHSAA rankings to be granted a seat in the State Tournament like the boys did. The boys had their first game of the State Tournament on Thursday, February 15, against the University Cougars.

Girls' vs. Ocoee in Dis-

trict Championship: L (51-24)

The girls had a really tough outing against a strong, experienced, and well-coached team. The Ocoee Knights are the top team in our district, as proven in the District Tournament, and one of the best in the Central Florida area.

The Knights are ranked 44 in the state, 13

WHS girls’ basketball fall in District Championship

A 6-0 run was the difference between the Wekiva Mustangs returning to district championship status and a bruising loss to the Horizon Hawks.

Hosted by the Edgewater Eagles, the decisive run during the District 6A-6 championship tournament final began with 1:58 remaining in the third quarter. Horizon never relinquished the lead after the run and held on for a victory by the score of 46-44 last Friday, February 9.

However, after a one season absence, the Mustangs returned to the Class 6A FHSAA playoffs as the #5 seed for Region 2. The fourth seeded Kathleen Red Devils provided the opposition and as the home team for the first round on Wednesday, February 14 (past press time).

“The short term is often thought of first and obviously earning a berth into

the playoffs is a satisfying feeling,” Wekiva coach Jerry Middleton said. “We are thinking about the next contest being a part of the playoffs. A season of hard work, a lot of time and expenditure of energy has paid off. An opportunity to keep playing and experience the one time of the season excitement the playoffs bring has been earned.

“Getting back to the playoffs is a foundation in place achievement though. Another group and class have created the opportunity to leave its fingerprints on the Mustangs program. This is unique in itself from the perspective of where we came from at the end of last season. Then we can position ourselves to regain the previous status of perennial state championship contender in only one season.”

Other contests played during the first round of the Class 6A-Region 2 field matched #8 New Smyrna Beach Sharks vs. #1 St.

Cloud Bulldogs, #7 (Orlando) East River Falcons vs #2 (Stuart) Martin County Tigers and #6 Lake Minneola Eagles vs #3 (Winter Garden) Horizon Hawks.

There are four regions across the state of Florida. Each of the regions consists of four district champions. The 16 district champions earn an automatic bid into the playoffs. St. Cloud (District 7), Martin County (8), and New Smyrna Beach (5) also claimed district championships in Region 2.

Another four teams in each district earn wild-card berths. Won-loss record, the opponents’ records and the opponents’ opponents’ records are used to calculate the power rankings, which then determine the wild cards and seedings.

The Mustangs fashioned a solid (and worthy of consideration) overall record of 16-10. However, the strength of 7.19 is the highest among Class 6A-Region 2 and 13th in

the entire (Class 6A) state. Four of the entries competing in Class 6A-Region 2 are members of District 6, as well.

“Poise was lacking (during the championship final),” Middleton said. “We eventually settled down but only somewhat. Turnovers were the biggest problem for both teams as far the highest number of all the statistics. However, 10 points were scored off turnovers against us and the catalyst for the run. When a turnover is committed the effect isn’t only one less possession. The opponent is given one more possession too. Eliminate just two turnovers and, not only are points off turnovers decreased by 20 percent, we win!”

Taking place over the course of six possessions, the run turned a 31-30 Wekiva lead into a 35-30 deficit. The 31-30 lead was also the only lead the Mustangs owned. Four turnovers were committed

by Wekiva along with two unsuccessful field goal attempts during the run. The Mustangs’ two unsuccessful field goal attempts were sandwiched between two turnovers at the beginning of the run and then the end.

Horizon actually committed more turnovers in total and by a 21-20 count.

Nonetheless, “difference among turnovers was a far more negative impact to our cause and beneficial to the Hawks,” Middleton said. “Holding a team to 46 points despite 20 turnovers is impressive and says a lot about the defense’s performance. *If only one* of the turnovers during the run is eliminated, Horizon scores only four consecutive points instead of six. Momentum and dynamics of the contest gain a far more intense impact when the lead increases from four to six points. Then the score is the most tangible difference. Score is tied and we still have an *opportunity to win* in overtime *at the*

least.”

Damage resulting from the miscues was negated by the Mustangs’ defense after committing the first two turnovers. Turnovers were then committed by Horizon and a missed field goal followed Wekiva’s unproductive possessions. However, Amaya Mitchell turned potential into fruition on the next three possessions, scoring all six of the points. Offensive rebounding was equally important. All three of the field goal attempts converted by Mitchell were tipped in after the previous bounced off the rim.

With 5:38 left, the Hawks led by a 42-36 score, the largest enjoyed after completing the 6-0 run.

Horizon theoretically left the door open for Wekiva to win, but executing a highlight reel play was needed. Only 1.6 seconds remained as the Mustangs inbounded the ball from

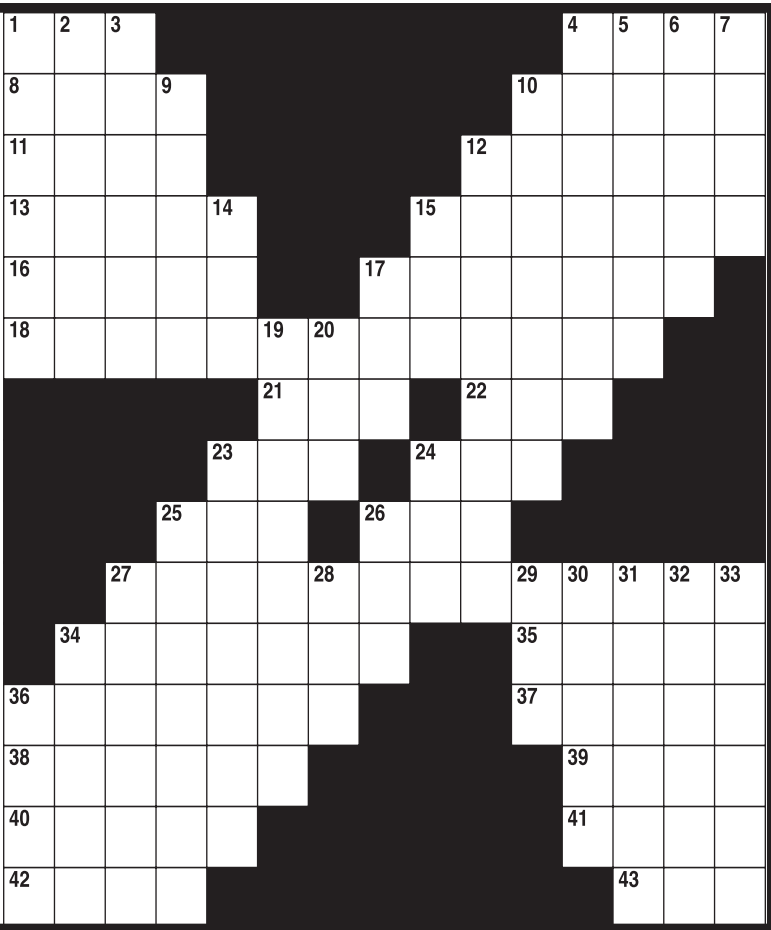

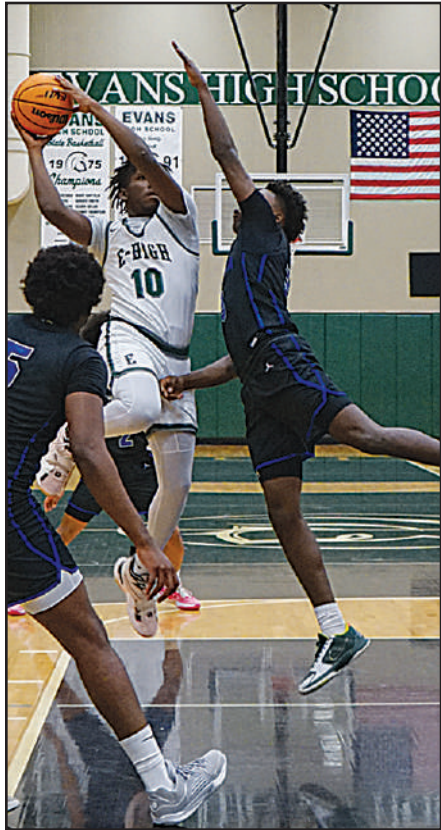

in Class 7A, and had a schedule strength of 7.31 this year. The Darters on the other hand are ranked 222 in the state, 50 in the class, but had a schedule strength of 7.67.

The Knights were just a better team and a lot of that can be attributed to their seniority, talent, and chemistry. The girls had an amazing season and made it to the second round of the District Tournament against a team that will most likely make a deep run in the State Tournament.

The Darters, as coach Brittany Hardy told me on many occasions, wasn’t built like a lot of these other programs. They didn’t have the size, strength, skill, or even the experience to compete on paper. But they surprised everyone. Especially their opponents.

The game was decided in the first half by Ocoee. The Knights outscored the Darters 37-13 in the first half. Sadly the second half was not the miracle Apopka needed. They were outscored again 14-11 in the second half, a better showing on defense but still struggling offensively against Ocoee.

One of the major

drawbacks for Apopka in this game was turnovers, specifically unforced turnovers that resulted in easy points for the Knights. Ocoee had 32 steals as a team, that’s 32 turnovers from Apopka just from steals. Another weak point was rebounds for Apopka as they allowed Ocoee to collect 25 offensive rebounds. Apopka could not box out or prevent second chance opportunities and Ocoee flourished through their struggles.

The win from the Knights came from the hands of senior Micah Hannah who collected 11 points, five rebounds, three assists, nine steals, and a block. Helping her were junior Jayla Weiser with eight points, three rebounds, eight assists, and two steals, and senior Ak-enya Slaughter with eight points, one rebound, two assists, and five steals.

Boys’ vs. Evans in District Semifinal: L (65-53)

The boys played a great game against a very good team and just couldn’t come away with the win.

“We did a lot of good things. I thought we competed hard. What we didn’t do is, we didn’t weather the storm very well with our emotional energy. We allowed ourselves to get

frustrated, we allowed ourselves to get discouraged, and you can’t win in the playoffs if when things get tough you get discouraged and you wither. And I thought we withered a little bit. But to our credit, we finished strong, we finished the way we wanted to finish, and I continue to believe that we’ll be a playoff team, and they (the team) have earned it,” coach Scott Williams said after the game.

It was a game that got away from Apopka quickly as they were outscored 37-25 in the first half. Evans collected 15 points in the first quarter compared to Apopka’s 11 and were running on all cylinders early on. Evans went on an 11-1 run in the first three minutes of the first quarter.

Apopka played hard to get right back on Evans’ tail, and, from the help of two blocks as well as Daren Leath, Larson Taylor, and Jude Angervil, who collected points at the line and from the field. Apopka went 4-for-17 from the field and 3-for-8 from the free throw line in the first quarter compared to Evans who went 5-for-14 from the field and 4-for-6 from the free throw line.

The second quarter was not as good a showing for the Darters as they

were outscored 22-14 and went into the locker room at halftime down 37-25. The start of the second quarter was a bucket-for-bucket sprint with both teams exchanging points or trips to the free throw line. Angervil had a block, a steal, rebounds, and multiple points in the first five minutes of the second quarter. Apopka was playing well on both sides of the ball.

As the gym grew louder with the seriousness of the game, Evans started their late second quarter run. With the help of the free throw line and great finishing inside Evans was scoring at will while Apopka was being called for a defensive foul on every possession.

In the second quarter, Evans shot 8-for-13 from the field and 4-for-9 from the free throw line. Apopka shot 4-for-13 from the field and 3-for-4 from the free-throw line.

The third quarter was Apopka’s worst outing of the night, and the separator for Evans. Apopka had the worst offensive and defensive quarter at the same time which was a disaster for them but a blessing for Evans. The Trojans exploded for 20 points as Apopka collected 10.

The Trojans went

7-for-19 from the field and 5-for-6 from the free throw line in the third quarter. The Darters went 5-for-16 from the field and had no trips to the free-throw line in the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, Apopka showed their well-known brand of determination and their reputation for being a fourth-quarter team. Apopka came out and outscored Evans 18-8 in the fourth quarter. The Darters went 5-for-10 from the field and 8-for-15 from the free throw line. The Trojans went 3-for-8 from the field and 0-for-4 from the free throw line. The game ended with Evans winning 65-53.

Sadly that great display in the fourth was not enough to cut away the 22-point deficit they faced coming into the fourth quarter with the score at 57-35.

The difference makers in this matchup were Evans’ ability to shoot from three-point range efficiently, Apopka’s turnovers and Evans’ ability to turn them into points, and Apopka’s lack of interior defense.

The Trojans shot 35.3 percent from three compared to Apopka who shot 9.1 percent. Evans brought in 6-for-17 of their shots beyond the arc for 18 points. Apopka brought

in 1-for-11 for just three points.

Apopka has gotten better with their turnovers but still has their troubles. In this game it seemed each turnover they committed resulted in points for Evans. The Trojans had 19 points of Apopka turnovers and Apopka only had 15 turnovers. On the other hand, Evans only had 12 turnovers which Apopka only turned into eight points.

And finally, Apopka’s usual brand of interior defense just was not up to the challenge of the gritty and strong fishing of the Trojans. Evans brought in 30 of their 65 points from inside the paint, and after that forced Apopka to guard more hastily in the paint resulting in 25 trips to the free-throw line throughout the game.

Although the Trojans ended Apopka’s District Tournament dreams, they can rest their heads knowing they were beaten by the soon-to-be champions as they head into their first game of the State Tournament.

Apopka played their first game of the FHSAA State Tournament against the University Cougars on Thursday after press time.

ford, and Principal, Lyle Heinz.

The ASC has been an integral part of the renovation and reconstruction process and has been there every step of the way. The improvements and construction started mid-to-late last year as ASC member and parent of varsity player Avery Ashford, Durrand Ashford told me. As we walked around the grounds, he showed me and explained to me the plans for the future, and right now as a group of workers were taking down the current bleachers to replace them with new ones.

Already completed in the list of improvements are: a new custom drainage system to better manage run-off and prevent field flooding; new clay and leveling for field; new sod around the perimeter of the field (up and down 1st, and 3rd bases and backstop); new and improved irrigation for new sod for the field and around the new bleacher section; new Announcer Booth with walkout platform for media,new Announcer and PA system with state-of-the-art electronics and speakers; new visitor dugout with water fountains; new player protective fencing for home and visitor dugouts; new design and concrete viewing area for new seating and bleachers to better accommodate the large

and growing support, participation and crowds; two new stadium bleachers for a total of three bleachers; and repaired and improved field lighting.

Durrand said that in April 2024 OCPS is scheduled to start construction of new home dugout that will include a locker room, player area, bathroom, new concession area, and hope for an area for laundry. Construction is set to be completed by the first game of the 2025 competitive season.

ASC has done - and plans to do - a lot more now that the season is underway, and that includes: the media day; end-of-season banquet; uniforms and replacements; the windscreen for the perimeter fence of the field (OCPS only provides for the outfield); concession stand equipment; and fundraising. ASC has an annual goal of fundraising \$15,000 and “approximately 90 percent goes directly to support the Apopka softball team.”

ASC is made up of parents who want more than anything to support the future and development of their daughters and the program as a whole for future success. I got to talk to a few in my time at the event, and it is very much a family more than a team or program.

the building Ocoee attack and end the first inning.

Apopka was up 2-0 going into the second inning and was hitting well as they did all night but couldn’t get anything to turn into runs. The second inning ended for Ocoee the same as the first did as they couldn’t secure any runs.

Apopka was able to turn in another run in the third inning and propelled themselves to 3-0 before

the change went into the bottom of the third. Defensively, the third was trouble for Apopka as at one point the bases were set to be loaded with one on the way home. But a double play from Apopka getting one out at home that would have resulted in a run otherwise and then to first base to get the batter out shut out the danger from Ocoee.

The third inning ended with Apopka still ahead 3-0 after a touch-and-go inning

fielding-wise.

In the fourth, Apopka exploded for three more runs as they cleaned up the preseason game early. The fifth inning for Apopka was nothing exciting, but they sure didn’t slow down. Their hitting stayed solid and the fielding and pitching had gotten stronger all night.

The fourth and fifth innings for Ocoee were much like the ones before as Apopka polished up

their fielding as the night went on Ocoee’s attack didn’t get much working for them. The game ended with Apopka up 6-0 for an easy victory in their first preseason game of the 2024 campaign.

“Our approaches to hitting were pretty good, and when we needed a bunt, we got the bunt down and moved the runners. I think it’s a great start for the season. It’s preseason you know; we’ll see a lit-

tle bit better of a showing on Thursday, (February 15). The most important thing that we are looking forward to is that it’s been ten months since we played a home game at our field, and we’ve made a lot of improvements to our field. And we are going to be extraordinarily pleased, and, happy, and thankful to be playing a home game this Thursday against a pretty good Timber Creek team. And that will be a better

measurement of how good we are because they did pretty well here,” coach Mike MacWhithey told me after the game.

“I think we played good. We threw with three different pitchers, we gave up zero runs, and I think it was only five hits. A couple of those were close calls that we could’ve done a little better, our approaches at the plate were solid, and

the baseline defending. A pass from the baseline was knocked down by three Horizon players about five feet beyond center court and the clock expired.

“Trajectory of the ball on offense was bad, every skill, shooting, dribbling, passing, every skill, during both contests” Middleton said. “When opportunities to take high percentage field goal attempts were created, we didn’t consistently follow through. We were emotionally and mentally tight and hesitant. Focus was not on the process of getting from point a to b in our play as consistently

as during the regular season.”

The first quarter was controlled by the Hawks while executing a 10-0 run. Wekiva answered with a 17-4 run allowing them to take control of the second quarter.

Scores after each quarter were 15-6, 25-23 and 37-32, respectively.

Tierra Coleman (23), Jasmine Pooler (15) and Makayla Bell (6) accounted for all of the Mustangs’ points. Only 10 points were scored by Horizon’s leading scorers, Sienna Astorino and Mitchell. Six players tallied at least six points for the Hawks though.

Field goal percentage

was also only 37 percent for both teams. However, Horizon produced a 10-6 advantage in offensive rebounds as just enough of more attempts at 51-46 were taken to win.

A late rally lifted the Mustangs to the championship final and eventually a final score of 45-43. During the semifinal contest against Lake Minneola, the deficit was as many as 13 points early in the second half and 10 entering the last quarter.

The lead was held by the Mustangs for only 1:02 and once. However, the 1:02 was the last of the contest. Pooler converted two free throw attempts and

then Wekiva held on for the victory.

Including converting five of six field goal attempts during the fourth quarter, Pooler was the Mustangs’ high scorer with 14 points. Six players tallied points for Wekiva as well. The Mustangs also converted eight of 10 free throws during the fourth quarter and 15 of 19 in total. Only two free throw attempts were taken by Lake Minneola during the fourth quarter and eight out of 15 in total were converted.

“Lacking playoff experience had a lot to do with the unsettled play during both contests though, Middleton said. “The only

way to learn how to manage and incorporate the much more intensely distinct character and atmosphere of the postseason is experience. Hopefully, we got enough playoff experience to have moved past the unsettled play. Of course, we don’t have the luxury of time anymore. One bad contest, even one stretch of consecutive possessions with unsettled play can end a season. We found out during the district championship tournament.”

The berth into the 2024 FHSAA playoffs is the 11th over the last 12 seasons and the first for Middleton as the Mustangs coach.

“Goal of every team is

to advance from the regular season to the postseason,” Middleton said. “We have achieved the goal.

“How’ and aesthetics of ‘how got to’ the postseason don’t matter once the berth is earned. Teams in the postseason have positioned themselves to keep advancing is what matters. Cliché, but ‘because’ doesn’t change, the postseason is the second season and a new start. Everyone has the same record of 0-0 and can keep advancing. Doesn’t matter if the first or eighth seed, everyone advances by the same means. Win the next contest.”

pretty spot-on. The defense was mostly flawless, I think we had one error, and that was a tough play on a really fast girl that we just made a poor decision on.”

Leadership is not mandated. Leadership is shown and followed, instead of mandated. And those three girls (Sarah Sosa, Jaylen Gonzalez, and Brooke-Lynn Hildebrand) seem to do a good job of that.”

The answer is given as to how to calculate Social Security benefits

Dear Rusty: I appreciate your recent article dispelling the myth that politicians have stolen Social Security money. As a CPA, I dispel this myth repeatedly to clients who falsely claim SS funds have been raided. But another thing I deal with often is how SS benefits are calculated. I know the formula for determining each person’s benefit amount is complex, but I have had to explain numerous times that those who put the most into Social Security get the lowest rate of return and those who put the least in get the highest return based on the way the benefit formula is structured. I get tired of people complaining that monthly Social Security payments are higher for retired doctors and other highly paid individuals. Can you please explain how Social Security is weighted in favor of lower income workers? Signed: Tired

of the Misunderstandings.

Dear Tired: Please don’t be frustrated. Because of the program’s complexity, Social Security is prone to misunderstanding, and educating the misinformed is an important professional duty we share. Here’s how each person’s SS benefit is determined:

The first thing to know is that each person’s SS retirement benefit is not based on their financial contributions to the program. Social Security’s purpose is to provide a benefit which replaces a portion of the person’s pre-retirement income, so the SS benefit is based on actual lifetime earnings, not on the payroll taxes withheld from those earnings.

Security has your lifetime earnings record (obtained annually from the IRS) and that record determines your “primary insurance

amount” or “PIA.” Your “PIA” is initially determined in your eligibility year (usually age 62) and is the amount you will get if you claim for benefits to start exactly at your full retirement age (FRA).

To develop your PIA, Social Security first adjusts (indexes) each year of your lifetime earnings (up to the annual payroll tax cap) to account for inflation. They then select the 35 inflation-adjusted years in which you earned the most, from which they compute your average monthly earnings over your lifetime (this is called your Average Indexed Monthly Earnings, or “AIME”). They then break your AIME into three segments, the first of which includes a majority of - and possibly all of - your AIME. They then take a percentage of each segment and total those three amounts to determine your PIA. The first segment

is the largest and 90% of that first segment contributes most of your PIA. Smaller percentages of the other two segments (32% and 15% respectively if your AIME is higher), are then added to the first computation to arrive at your full PIA - the amount you get if you start benefits in the month you reach your FRA. Note that since most of the PIA comes from the first large segment of each person’s AIME, lower income workers get a higher percentage of their lifetime average monthly amount.

Since benefits are based on earnings, those with lower lifetime earnings do, indeed, get a smaller benefit than those with higher average lifetime earnings, but the percentage of pre-retirement replacement income lower income workers receive is higher than for those with higher monthly average lifetime earnings. The So-

cial Security benefit for lower income workers is typically about 40% of their pre-retirement average monthly income, while those with higher lifetime average earnings may get a benefit as little as 20% of their average monthly pre-retirement earnings. In that sense, the Social Security benefit formula is progressive and weighted in favor of lower income workers. Nevertheless, albeit a smaller replacement percentage, higher income workers receive a higher monthly SS benefit because of their higher lifetime earnings. Even so, those higher earners did, indeed, contribute more payroll taxes from their higher earnings.

So, each person’s SS retirement benefit amount is a percentage of their pre-retirement income. Coincidentally, those with higher pre-retirement income also contributed more to the Social Security

program than did those with lower earnings. But their higher SS benefit amount is based on their higher pre-retirement earnings, not on payroll taxes paid from those higher earnings.

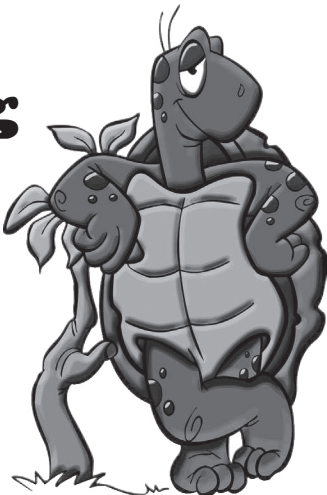
