APK basketball falls to University in FHSAA state tournament

"I can't quibble with our kids' preparation, their desire, how hard they worked, how hard they cared for each other. I'm just really, really, proud of them," said coach Scott Williams after the first round of the 2024 FHSAA Class 7A Boys Basketball State Tournament.

Sadly, the 2024 Apopka basketball campaign has come to an end. Although over, the season proved to be very successful and inspiring to both the boys' and girls' programs. The unwanted end came at the hands of University High School in the first round of the 2024 FHSAA Class 7A Boys Basketball State Tournament.

"We played hard! We just had that stretch in the third quarter where we couldn't make shots. It's hard to win if you can't make shots, and to our credit, we didn't take many bad shots. We had great looks and we were playing together," said coach Scott Williams

letic battle. It opened with University's star player, Mo Kamara a 6'8" 200-pound big man, finding a lane right to the hoop and slamming an emphatic dunk. In that moment, I knew this was going to be one of those games that you can't look away from,

Coach told me the game plan to deal with University and their uberathletic big man was all about spacing and rotations. He explained that what makes Kamara's game so special when he's playing is how the team plays around him. He is always surrounded by four guys on the court that can shoot very consistently.

The first quarter started badly for Apopka. The Cougars came out with no reservations throwing hay-makers. The Cougars were up 7-0 in the first minute of the game. Apopka couldn't keep up with the athleticism of Kamara and the spacing of the rest of the Cougars. Soon, Apopka found their footing and began slowing down and halting the rolling University offense.

As I said it was a battle of athleticism, one in which Apopka was ready to compete. Down 9-2, Apopka needed a bucket to slow down the Cougars and early on were having trouble getting anything to fall. Jahi Bowden decided it was up to him to get some air of his own. Coming off a steal and assist

from Daren Leath, Bowden found himself alone on a fast break and went up and finished a one-handed slam that gave Apopka the energy and momentum they needed to get back in the game.

Although still down, I saw a smirk go across every Darter's face when that happened. It was a "we won't back down moment" for the team that fueled their play for the rest of the contest. Apopka did well to come back in the first quarter thanks to them shutting down the Cougars' passing lanes resulting in multiple steals and fast breaks.

The first quarter ended with Apopka trailing 11-9. The Darters only allowed four more points after the Cougars' 7-0 run to start the game. The Darters went 4-for-18 from the floor, had four steals, and 10 rebounds in the first. The Cougars went 5-for-9 from the floor, had two steals, two blocks, and nine rebounds in the first.

The second quarter went better for Apopka on the offensive side, but not on the defensive side. Apopka played great right

The Apopka Baseball team started their season this week with the Big Blue Classic at Lake Brantley where they faced Lake Brantley on Tuesday, February 19, Lake Howell on Tuesday, February 20, and Oviedo after press time on Thursday, February 22.

Apopka fell to Lake Brantley 1-0 in a game that was uncharacteristic for the Darters. I wasn't able to make it to the game so I can't tell you all of the specifics, but I'll do my best. The Darters only had one hit all game and a .045 batting average and .045 onbase percentage as a team. To be fair, the game wasn't even decided until the bottom of the seventh when Lake Brantley scored the first run of the night. Apopka also had three errors to Lake Brantley's zero.

The Patriots didn't have a great showing either, but they did score when it mattered most and objectively, played a better game than Apopka as a whole. Lake Brantley had six hits to Apopka's one, a .222 batting average, and a .250 on-base percentage.

"We didn't swing the bats well at all against

Lake Brantley. Matter of fact, we only got one hit and got shut out," said coach Bobby Brewer.

Pitching wise, Apopka did ok. Braylon Reynante pitched for 6.2 innings and allowed five hits, one run, one walk, and four stolen bases. He struck out five Patriots and faced 28 batters. Reynante had a .185

OBA and a .214 OBP and threw 78 pitches.

Lake Brantley's pitcher, Nick Burgos, pitched for seven innings, allowed one hit, had nine strikeouts, and faced 22 batters. Burgos had a .045 OBA and a .045 OBP and threw 81 pitches.

While it was a slow and unsuccessful night for

the Darters, they made up for it the next night against the Lake Howell Silver Hawks.

Apopka defeated Lake Howell 5-3 in a game that had its ups and downs. It started great with Apopka coming out very hot scoring two runs in the first

WHS girls basketball make it to Regional Finals in FHSAA state tournament

Very few considered the Wekiva Mustangs a favorite to win during the state playoffs with a solid, but far from spectacular, eye-catching 16-9 regular season record. Yet, the record is the very reason Wekiva took to the court on Thursday, February 22, for the Class 6A Region 2 final (past press time). The regional final was also an all-District 6A-6 affair as the Horizon Hawks advanced with victories over the New Smyrna Beach Sharks and Martin County Tigers.

Facing the most challenging schedule in Class 6A Region 2 provided the Mustangs with the knowledge of how to manage the rough and tough, give-no-quarter, take no-quarter disposition of the playoffs.

Then a disappointing performance during the District 6A-6 championship tournament provided Wekiva with the other ingredient needed to navigate the state playoffs. The Mustangs won the semifinal round but had to rally from a double-digit deficit during the fourth quarter. A 6-0 run midway through the third quarter pushed Hori-

zon into the lead for good and the district champion-ship.

"The actual way we played was no different than during the regular season during the district championship tournament or the state playoffs," Middleton said. "As I said after the district championship tournament, lacking playoff experience had a lot to do with the unsettled play during both. The only way to learn how to manage and incorporate the much more intensely distinct character and atmo-

WHS baseball to keep the steady improvement going into season

A familiar face is in a new place and position as the Wekiva Mustangs begin the 2024 season. Brian Tatai is charged with overseeing the Mustangs' attempt to take the next step beyond a 19-7 record and opponents' victories are no longer assured by walking onto the field. An assistant last season and native of Dearborn, Michigan, Tatai was promoted to head coach during the offseason.

The next step is also within the context of a steady continuing progression. Wekiva has improved the overall record from 1-8 to 7-16 to 10-14 since 2020. An above .500 record was recorded by the Mustangs for the first time in over a decade last season. Wekiva will also for the first time in over a decade attempt to post a record over .500 during consecutive seasons.

"The end result and most tangible positive towards winning or negative towards losing is noticed first in any sport," Tatai reiterated. "However, the end results are the product of executing the subtle actions properly and making the right decisions. There were many reasons for the improvement in the overall record last season. All grew out of and were predicated on understanding why subtle actions are so important between last and two seasons ago.

"If subtle actions aren't executed properly and the right decisions made, the tangible positive endings don't happen. Proper execution and correct decision making becomes second nature with

repetition. Everything a team aspires to accomplish during the offseason grows out of the opportunity for repetition when participating in fall ball."

Winning during the postseason will also accompany improving the record as topping the list of next steps. A 6-2 loss during the first round of the District 6A-7 championship tournament ended last season for the Mustangs. The contest was tied at 2-2 heading into the bottom of the sixth inning.

Wekiva has risen and grown out of understanding the importance of subtle action with aggression first and foremost. In particular, base running and establishing scoring threats through base running has been the impetus of the overall aggressive play.

"Proceeding under the cliché of we will take our chances with aggressiveness in all three phases of the game and are willing to live with the results either way," Tatai said. "We would rather fail in the attempt to be aggressive as opposed to not taking the risk at all and hoping for a positive outcome.'

Last season 165 out of 173 stolen base attempts were successful, a percentage of 95.4 and 6.4 per contest. The aggressive approach or ambition isn't limited to the direct and tangible means of the stolen base though.

"The bar for stolen bases was set last season," Tatai said. "However, this team will not be the same as last season's. As far as repeating the number if reaching the potential, this team will be competitive in matching the number. Sev-

eral new subtle wrinkles of pursuing aggressiveness have been incorporated into our play. We want the opponent to feel pressure from an aggressive approach in general. We want the opponent to feel pressure from being forced to focus on more than the batter-pitcher relationship all the time though.

"We don't want the opponent to feel the need of stopping a runner from scoring after reaching second base on the previous play. We want the opponent to feel the need to stop a runner from scoring after reaching second base during the play. The same applies to the cut off throw. We want the opponent to feel pressure from where is and the accuracy of the cut off throw during the play in progress. We don't want the opponent to feel any less amount of pressure because the play stops and use the time between plays to refocus on the possibility. team's skillset as a whole and personal approach developed, the line-up will not be static from contest to contest either," Tatai said. "We aren't going to use the same and traditional lineup for every contest.

"I believe the traditional make-up of a line up as far as the speedy, contact hitters at the top and the team will take its chances with strikeouts opposed to home run power hitters is still applicable. However, not every individual match-up or with the opponent lends itself to the traditional lineup is the best. Nor will I move a player just one position down in the line-up. out of the gate in the second quarter and tied up the game quickly. The Darters continued to get great looks in transition coming from steals that were the result of them shutting down the Cougars' passing lanes.

Jermichael Johnson took it upon himself in the second quarter to show who was the most athletic on the court. It seemed like Johnson felt challenged by Kamara and it stepped his game up to the next level. Johnson was all over the court on both sides of the ball. He was saving wouldbe turnovers, going for crazy flying put-back dunks, and making spot-up transition threes.

Even with the help from Johnson, Apopka wasn't able to keep up with the Cougars in the second quarter and headed into the locker room at half, trailing 27-21. The Cougars outscored the Darters 16-13 in the second quarter. Apopka shot 5-for-13 from the field in the second quarter, had eight rebounds, five assists, and one steal. University shot 7-for-10 from the field in the second quarter, had four rebounds, five assists, and one steal.

Coming out of the locker room Apopka needed a change in pace and to get back into the game quickly. But the third went the opposite of how the Darters needed it to. It was one of those quarters where nothing would fall for Apopka; even their good shots couldn't find the bottom of the net.

"Fight! Fight harder than you've ever fought. Play more together than you've ever played. Do not play discouraged. Men do not play discouraged," said coach Williams in a timeout late in the third quarter.

But it wasn't enough, even with the great play from Apopka on defense and offense it seemed the

game just wouldn't go in their favor in the third at all. University went on a 9-4 run in the third quarter and put themselves up 36-25 going into the fourth quarter.

"So we were down

six points, and we came out right away and got a couple of buckets, but it just dried up. I don't recall there being a repetition of 'Oh that's a terrible shot, oh that's a bad shot,' it was just that we were missing and it's kind of been who we are and it has been the thing that we've worked on relentlessly. I don't like the thought of saying 'we are not skilled' because we are very skilled...but we're not good shot makers. And when you're playing a team that good (University) and you let it stretch out to 11 or 12 points at the end of the third quarter in this gym... you can't just try to guard 'em; we're going to have to try to make the game crazy. And, man, did we do some good things, and we missed some things ,aahh...that's what hap-

Apopka shot just 2-for-8 in the third quarter, collected five rebounds, one assist, and three steals. University shot 4-for-8 in the third quarter, collected six rebounds, two assists, and two steals.

As the fourth quarter began the University gym began to rumble and really get loud. With every trip to the basket, the stands would rise to their feet and collectively pause as the shot was taken, and then immediately roar whether it was a miss or a make.

The game was so close, yet so far, as Apopka was still having its offensive troubles and getting no help from the officials when attacking the paint. Apopka stayed behind a steady 10-12 points in the fourth quarter, and every time they put a dent in the score, it seemed University was rewarded with a trip to the free-throw line on the other end.

The Cougars were getting the whistle every time they went up for a layup or any shot in the paint that resulted in a lot of easy points for University. With just three minutes left in the game, the Cougars were up 46-36.

Apopka gave everything they had in those last minutes and brought the game within eight points with under two minutes to play as the Cougars led 50-42. In a timeout, Williams told the team "It's ok, it's ok," trying to control the emotions of his guys and get them to realize how close the game really was.

Apopka played amazing defense and even had some great last-minute looks offensively, but the same problems plagued them as they had all game as the Cougars kept finding themselves at the line. When they weren't at the line, University was playing keep-away moving the call with speed and coordination to keep it out of the Darters' hands.

The Cougars defeated the Darters 57-48 and ended the 2024 campaign and three seniors' dreams of a deep playoff run. After the loss, Williams was still nothing but proud of his team and their performance

against such a strong team. "When you have kids

ing to respond to you asking to give more than they think they can give. 

sphere of the postseason is experience."

There are four regions across the state of Florida. Four districts make up each region. Each champion earns an automatic berth into the FHSAA playoffs. The four other berths are of a wild-card nature and determined according to the FHSAA power rankings.

Wekiva 42 Kathleen 38

For the third consecutive postseason in as many contests, the Mustangs fell behind early. However, Wekiva played with much more poise and persistence. A usually strong defense seemed even more intensely stifling from the Red Devils' perspective. The 38 points scored by Kathleen was the lowest number of the season and 14.5 below the per contest average. The Mustangs have given up less points during eight other contests though.

Tangibly and measurably, a lead not as assertive and comfortable as during the district championship final emerged at the end of the first quarter. Then Wekiva opened the second quarter with a 9-0 run. During the first two minutes of the second an 11-7 deficit was erased and building a 16-7 lead followed. Nor would the lead be relinquished.

"For about 95 percent of the contest though, we used a zone on defense for the first time this season," Middleton said. "Nor had the Red Devils faced a zone. Kathleen rebounding wasn't nearly as efficient as had been. In particular,

the Red Devils' two best rebounders were held to under 10 combined. The zone was the catalyst for enforcing our will early and setting a tone."

ChiChi Wang tipped in a missed field goal attempt to begin the run. A trey from the left side of the baseline came next from Tierra Coleman. Another missed field goal was tipped in by Wang. Wekiva's run concluded with a pair of free throws from Coleman. All nine of the points were scored in or the result of transition. A much different start than the previous postseason contests carried Wekiva to besting the per contest average by 20 points. After the exchange of the first possessions, the Mustangs trailed for the only

time and by a 1-0 score.

Tiera Coleman erupted for 25 points. A onetwo punch for scoring was formed with Senaya tallying 18 as well. The most important points were the first six though. From the left wing, Coleman sank a three-point field goal attempt to start the go-ahead for good run. Another trey from Coleman upped the lead to two possessions just 12 seconds later. St. Cloud's errant pass in the backcourt was intercepted by Wang who then passed to Coleman. "A variety of presses were used by the Bulldogs with great success during the regular season," Middleton said. "In particular, turnovers created transition and easy opportunities for St. Cloud to score. from a new concept but effectively executed. Turnovers committed by us against the two presses the Bulldogs used were limited. Losing the opportunity to see a possession to the end is often thought about as the effect of turnovers. Another possession is gained by the opponent as well though. Turnovers were actually on the lower side but still roughly two to

one in our favor.

"Advantage in turn-

overs was combined with difficult field goal attempts taken. The run was the product of forcing St. Cloud into contested and low percentage field goal attempts. None of the field goal attempts were taken without a hand in the face and body in front of the shooter. Long field goal attempts equal long rebounds. Long rebounds equal gaining possession of the ball around midcourt and transition opportunities. The press created problems for every opponent. For the most part, we were the first opponent to manage the press. Not knowing how to deal with an opponent unaffected by the press had a cumulative effect over the course of the contest. Managing the press was because of a difference in poise.'

Coleman totaled seven points during the run. With two each, the rest of the points making up the run were tallied by Asanya and Wang.

"Once again, we enforced our will early, as early as possible this time," Middleton said. "After taking the lead, conditioning had a part in the victory though. We wore the Bulldogs down as a team in general. Lack of ballhandlers was exposed more importantly. The point guards were unable to take a break from handling the ball. Perhaps the impact was even more mental than physical."

Only 4:39 into the contest, Wekiva held an 18-3 lead.

The score was 21-5 at the end of the first quarter and 36-20 at halftime.

Victory was secured with a run of 9-0 run at the start of the second half. The

St. Cloud was able to cut into and turn the lead into manageable during the fourth quarter. The lead was never threatened though. On four occasions, the lead was decreased to seven points. Points were scored by the Mustangs on the next consecutive possessions though.

The same statistical game plan as during the regular season was executed to perfection. Field goal percentage was only 40 percent for Wekiva, but St. Cloud's converted at pace of 28. Sixteen points out of 20 attempts were added to the total from the free throw line.
