Softball’s overwhelming victory over University, loss to Windermere

The Apopka Softball team, like the baseball team, split their games after press time last week beating University in a game that seemed unfair and falling to Windermere in a nail-biting game that came down to the last inning.

Apopka vs. University: Win 15-0
In a three-inning 15-run rule game Apopka spared no time in sending the University Cougars back to Orlando early last week. The Darters scored nine runs before I could even get to the field all in the first inning. Then did even more damage in the second inning scoring five more runs.

To say the least, I was shocked. Now I won’t say that Apopka was playing particularly amazing it was more that the University just wasn’t up for the challenge that the Apopka Softball team are. Everything from their pitching to their fielding couldn’t hold up as walks and errors filled up University’s stat sheet. Apopka had 13 runs on just 15 at-bats and did it all in three innings. The team as a whole had a .462 batting average and a .704 OBP. The girls didn’t slow on the attack either as they stole 15 bases with two Darters stealing three a piece (Brooke-Lynn Hildebrand and Jaylen Gonzalez.) Pitching and fielding wise Apopka did great, even better than when at the plate. Sarah Sosa was the lone pitcher for the Darters in the game and threw 51 pitches against 12 batters. Sosa kept the University batters to a .000 OBA after not allowing a single hit or run. She also had six strikeouts, just two walks, and hit one batter. Apopka’s biggest players of the game were Sosa as I said before, Taylor Smith, and Avery Ash-

ford. Smith has been a menace at the plate and didn’t slow down against University where she tallied two hits, one run, and four RBIs on three at-bats with a .667 batting average and OBP while also stealing two bases. Ashford had her plays on the other side of the ball where she collected six putouts and two assists while collecting an RBI at the plate and stealing a base for her team. **Apopka vs. Windermere: Loss 5-4** “It’s kind of only officially game two, so there is that process of learning the roles and where are you going to play and where

are you going to fit in and what is your job. We have 17 on the roster and that’s a large amount of young ladies for only nine spots that play so we gotta have those specific roles and they have gotta be defined, and you as a player have to know what that role is and you’ve gotta execute that role whether it’s coming in as a pinch runner and you are supposed to be dialed in, which we weren’t in that game. We weren’t dialed in so knowing your roles is going to be important,” said coach Mike MacWithey after the game.

WHS girls basketball didn’t allow Horizon a chance to come back

On to the state final four and after winning eight of the last nine contests. The loss to the Horizon Hawks had the biggest impact on what would become the Wekiva Mustangs stay-the-course march to Lakeland though. Horizon defeated Wekiva on February 9 to complete the run to the District 6A-6 tournament championship. However, during the rematch and regional final of the FHSAA Class 6A playoffs, the Mustangs’ ability to execute was never challenged after the first four minutes. The lead was

ing to Horizon in the district championship final) from our perspective. The Mustangs have now advanced to the state final four nine times over the last 11 seasons. The 2023-2024 team is the first Jerry Middleton and staff have coached to the state final-four though. “Style and fashion in which we played during the district championship tournament was no different than the regular season,” Middleton reiterated. “As I said after the district championship tournament and once again, lacking play-off experience had a lot to

I think we even brought guys off the bench that were hitting that rock today, so it was a good win for us, but any win is a good win for us,” said head coach Bobby Brewer after the Ocoee

game. **Apopka vs. Oviedo @ Big Blue Bonanza Day 4: Loss 8-6** The matchup against Oviedo was a rollercoaster of a game. Slow at times and explosive when it wasn’t. The worst part about the loss was that on paper and on the stat sheet Apopka should’ve won. Every stat suggests that Apopka should’ve come out on top, and it just didn’t fall that way. Apopka had a higher batting average of .321 than Oviedo’s .208 while also having 42 plate appearances to Oviedo’s 35. Apopka had nine hits to Oviedo’s five and had two doubles, a triple, and a home run compared to Oviedo’s one double and one homerun. Apopka even had an OBP of .548 to Oviedo’s .457. The first two innings were quiet for both Apopka and Oviedo as the game was scoreless going into the third. But the Darters struck fast and true in that third inning grabbing three

runs to put them into the lead. The Lions wouldn’t end the third without answering though as they challenged the Darters three runs with one of their own before going into the fourth down 3-1. The fourth inning was another quiet one for both Apopka and Oviedo, and,

after the top of the fifth, went scoreless for the Darters, you thought the pattern would repeat. But it didn’t. Oviedo exploded for four runs in the bottom of the fifth and turned the game right on its head. Apopka now down 5-3 go-

AHS looks to repeat or improve on last year’s playoff run

Apopka Blue Darters’ women’s wrestling has been a model of doing more with less. No more than six wrestlers have qualified for an individual state championship meet over the course of the 16 seasons the Blue Darters have been competing in the sport. Final standings have never included Apopka outside the top-20 though.

However, third place was earned for the second time in the program’s history last season. The next logical goal is to consistently repeat the achievement. A decisiveness in the direction of prime to take the next step past perennially placing inside the top-five has been demonstrated throughout the regular season.

Then the FHSAA postseason has been nothing but the same. The Blue Darters placed third during the first two rounds of the FHSAA postseason, the District 5 and Regional 2 championships. Held this weekend (Feb. 29-Mar 2), four wrestlers have advanced to the state championship meet.

Classifications do not exist in women’s wrestling.

“Every season has begun with potential to place again at the state championship meet and steadily grows,” Apopka coach Bruce McMillian said. “This season is also no different. The wrestlers understand consistency in terms of getting the most out of the numbers or with the efficiency has been established.

The sport of girls wrestling has also taken on a higher profile and equal sta-

tus at the same time as the Blue Darters looking to secure consistent top-five status.

A state wrestling championship meet for girls was held by several other sanctioning bodies before being taken over by the Florida High School Athletics Association. The 2023-24 season marks the third with the Florida High School Athletics Association as the sanctioning body.

“However, establishing consistency with the end result and getting the most grows out of not wasting the opportunity to improve during practices,” McMillian said. “Consistency among how and what we practice followed by preparation for meets must first be understood by the wrestlers.”

Team totals are made up of the points gained by each individual wrestler. A certain number of points are gained by individual wrestlers for margin of each individual victory, round advancing to and final place earned. Wrestlers placing no worse than sixth are considered to have placed.

Advancing to the next round of the FHSAA postseason is much simpler and tangible though, placing at least fourth.

Fourteen weight classes are contested in the sport of girls wrestling at the high school level. Double elimination tournaments are the norm for each weight class. Two brackets make up a double elimination tournament, the winners’ or championship and the consolation. Wrestlers can still place once falling into the consolation bracket. However, the best possible out-

come is third place.

“Consistency at the most basic and fundamental level is putting in the work to develop the talent, McMillian reiterated after the region championship meet. “Each Apopka team passes down to the next the first and foremost importance of developing talent is only possible when the behind the scenes work, practicing is done.

“Practice is always pursued with a specific purpose, improvement in a specific area or areas. Then matches during the regular season are looked at as an opportunity for lessons learned and improvement.”

The Blue Darters scored a total of 132 points, 21-4 record and an even better than last season .840 winning percentage at the District 5 championship meet.

With 177 points, the host team, Ocoee Knights claimed the 2024 championship. Second place was taken by the Jones Tigers while scoring 150.5 points. The Colonial Grenadiers (84 points) and Winter Park Wildcats (82) completed the top-five. A total of 14 teams competed.

All seven Apopka wrestlers placed.

Hananeel Gregoire (100 pound weight class), Shelby Sherman (110), Nehemie Gregoire (130) and Jada Jones (190) won all four matches competed in en route to individual weight class championships.

Also placing, earning points and advancing to the Region 2 championship meet were Daliane Thompson (third-145) and Michelle Hernandez (second-155).

Rounding out the results under the Blue Darter banner, Elianna Lavoile placed sixth.

Apopka then scored a total of 97 points, 18-7 record and .720 winning percentage at the Region 2 championship meet.

With 199 points, the Hernando Leopards clinched the 2024 championship. Second place was taken by the Freedom Patriots with 156 points. The Osceola Cowboys (94 points) and East River Falcons (64) completed the top-five. A total of 53 teams competed.

Jada Jones won all four matches en route to the individual weight class championship for the 190

pound weight class.

Also placing, earning points, and advancing to the state championship meet were Hananeel Gregoire (100 pounds), Shelby Sherman (110) and Nehemie Gregoire (130).

Points were also scored by Thompson and Hernandez.

“Positioning ourselves for the postseason is then a continuation of the motivation to not waste any practices, an opportunity to improve one step at a time,” McMillian said. “I think with this group of state qualifiers, a genuine opportunity to do even better than previously as far as consistently placing inside

the top-10 exists. The first of what will hopefully be a streak of placing inside the top-three was achieved last season. Placing in the top-five or even three a second consecutive season is the next step.

“However, chasing the end, overall goal of taking the next step is not easy. We can’t lose sight of what we did at each and every meet during the regular season. Wrestling is like every other sport. If unfocused on the match competing in at the time, the performance will be poor.”

The state championship meet is held at the Osceola Heritage Park/Silver Spurs Arena in Kissimmee.

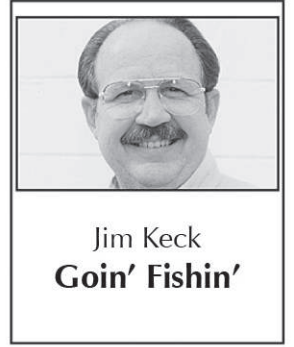
FWC approves new rules to support TrophyBass management

Hello Folks,

What a great weekend we had. Lots of folks are gettin’ on the water and enjoyin’ this chamber of commerce weather we have been havin’.

There were folks fishin’ for specks and bass in most all our waterways in the area. We had a full moon on Saturday and that got the fish bitin’. Specks are bitin’ in just about all the big lakes in Central Florida, Lake Monroe, Lake Jesup, Lake Harney, and the St. John’s River. Most of the specks are still bein’ caught on minners, and a few specks on jigs tipped with a minner. Some specks are bein’ caught in the Harris Chain and the Kissimmee Chain as well.

I wanted to let everyone know that the FWC approved new rules to support TrophyBass management. There are two rules that have been approved for two specific waterbodies. Lake Lochloosa and Orange Lake in Alachua County. *There is no killing or pos-*



sessing of any black bass that is 20 inches or more in total length. Also, the other new rule requires a circle hook when fishin’ with natural baits greater than 3 inches in length. These new rules will support the agency’s concerted efforts to grow larger trophy bass across the state. The goal of the FWC’s Florida Trophy Bass Project is to make Florida the undisputed Trophy Bass Capital of the World.

There was an Xtreme Bass Series tournament on the Harris Chain a couple of weeks ago. Congrats to Brent Stagg and Neil Davis for their win on the chain. They had 5 bass that hit

the scales at 27.68 pounds. They also had a nice kicker bass that weighed 7.44 pounds. There were 6 bass that were caught durin’ the tournament that weighed over 6 pounds each. My point in reportin’ about all these tournaments is to say this: With all the tournaments we have durin’ this time of the year on our chains, these chains continue to produce big stringers and big bass each week. It’s just amazin’ to me how these lakes continue to provide the amount of bass that were caught and the weight that it takes to win one of these tournaments. It goes to show you that we are blessed to be able to fish these lakes and chains in our area and show-out what they can produce.

I know that I have whined about all the tournaments bein’ held in Florida durin’ this time of the year, but it’s cold up North and folks do want to fish; and Florida is the destina-

This was a game that came down to the last inning where Apopka had the chance to tie up or take the lead but couldn’t complete the comeback. The loss, as said by head coach MacWithey came from the errors of the Apopka defense.

“We outplayed them. Well, let me rephrase that. We out-hit them, and I think we out-pitched them because we gave up zero earned runs according to my book and we should’ve won that four to nothin’ if we played better defense. And that’s just what it is so we gotta play better defense.”

Windermere opened the game with two runs in the first inning after a scoreless opener from the Darters. And as the coach said before these runs were slowed because of fielding errors that would continue to plague the girls all night.

The second inning was quiet going scoreless from the top to the bottom but in the third Apopka woke up and lit up the scoreboard with three runs.

First, it was Apopka’s Reese Kernz who got a base hit and beat the ball to first base to secure it. Next up Shylah Pino went with a sac bunt to send Kernz to third base. Taylor Smith went and got herself on base when she hit the plate but it was Sydney Bartkin who sent the girls home. Bartkin smashed the ball and got herself a double while sending in Kernz and Smith for two runs cutting Windemere’s lead away in one play.

Now tied 2-2, Avery Ashford was at the plate. Ashford hit the ball when she needed to and sent in Bartkin for the Darters’ third run of the inning. Apopka led Windermere 3-2 now and Windermere ended the top of third shortly after.

With energy and momentum on their side, Apopka was ready to take the field and keep their newfound lead. Windermere had other plans.

Windermere took Apopka’s three runs and matched

them with haste draining the feeling of victory right from Apopka while still on the field. The runs came from one RBI early in the inning followed by a huge play. Windermere had tied the ball game with the one run in the third already and was in a sticky situation near its end.

Windermere had the bases loaded with two outs on a near-full count. It was Windermere’s Erika Bennouna who sent a miraculous hit deep into the field that allowed for two runners to find home plate while sending the runner on first to third and herself to first base.

After this, Sarah Sosa was pulled out as pitcher and MacWithey sent in Mia Aeschilman. With help from Aeschilman Apopka was able to grab the third out and end the third inning without allowing much more damage.

Apopka scored one run in the fourth thanks to Smith who sent a ball on a rope to deep midfield to send in a run and get herself a double. Sadly the Darters weren’t able to do anything else with the inning and went into the bottom of the fourth down 5-4.

The next two innings were scoreless as Apopka’s fielding improved Windermere’s scoring opportunities dwindled and Apopka struggled with an ace pitcher that Windermere saved for the late game.

“They brought in their ace to shut us down (Lexi King) and they kinda did,” said coach MacWithey.

Apopka did struggle to get even a piece of the ball in the later innings and most of it can be attributed to Windermere’s Lexi King who threw 46 pitches, faced 11 batters, had four strikeouts, allowed two hits, and allowed Apopka batters just a .182 batting average and OBP.

While the rest of the game did go scoreless Apopka played much better in the latter half of the game in the field. The biggest downfalls for Apopka as said by the coach were pitching and fielding mistakes that cost them bases, runs, and in turn the game.

“On a scale of 1-10, I think our pitching was a solid seven, and to me seven is good but I work with the pitching myself and kind of take that personally and call all

of the pitches so...In terms of earned runs and you give up zero, you should be happy with your pitching. What you’re not happy with is two hit batters, three walks, and those walks being to batter in the seven, eight, and nine slots. You don’t walk batter in the seven, eight, and nine slots to get to the top of the order. So that’s the thing we talked to the pitchers about and getting better at knowing when and where you can nibble and where you can’t nibble. Okay, you don’t nibble bottom-tier batters, you throw it down their throat and say ‘Listen, hit the ball if you can,’ whereas with top-tier batters you’re gonna nibble and say ‘Well, I’m not gonna give them something fat because they might hit the heck out of it.’ So instead, you nibble at those guys and if we walk them...sooner or later we’ll get to the bottom half again and we’ll be ok. But we put some of those bottom half on for free and you know that’s a recipe for disaster especially when paired with at least four routine ground ball errors. So you take four routine infield ground balls and make those plays, and again we win that game.”

In MacWithey’s eyes, the girls won the game on paper but lost it on the field. The game ended after the top of the seventh when Apopka finished with no runs giving Windermere the win. The team as a whole played a great game against a really talented and experienced team that has seven or eight seniors.

“I mentioned out there (to the girls) that their field is very similar to ours when it comes to the grass and the hardness so it shouldn’t have been something that was field-related or not being used to it because that’s basically the mirror of our field. So we just gotta hit a few more balls and maybe make some changes, we don’t know maybe there are some different combinations and sooner or later we will find the right combination.”

do with the unsettled play during both contests. How to win doesn’t change, and even if sounds like a broken record, nor does experience teaching players and coaches how to win.

“The only way to learn how to manage and incorporate the much more intensely distinct character and atmosphere of the post-season is experience.

High scorer for Wekiva was Senaia Asanya with 16 points while grabbing 16 rebounds and four steals. All nine offensive rebounds were followed with points tallied as well. Next in the scoring column was 12 points from Jasmine Pooler and Tierra Coleman.

“Of course, turn-

arounds as a team means everyone,” Middleton said. “However, in contrast to the other players is the only way to understand Senaia’s improvement and full impact. Improvement of the other players’ statistics most important to the position played increased by at least 25 percent. However, double-doubles have been recorded by Senaia since the loss to the Hawks.”

Wekiva’s 2023-24 team also achieved a first, defeating three higher-seeded teams and on the road during the playoffs. Higher seeded team always hosts. The road to the state final-four traveled through the fourth-seeded Kathleen Red Devils, number one St. Cloud Bulldogs and num-

ber three Horizon Hawks. The Mustangs are the only team of 28 to successfully navigate the regional bracket while lower than a third seed.

Then by at least 15 points, Wekiva held the three opponents during the playoffs have been held below the per contest average.

“This team is very adept at learning from mistakes and why when setbacks are suffered,” Middleton said. “We stopped playing not to lose. We are now playing to win. However, efficiency growing from pursuing a style of playing not to lose steadily progressed during the playoffs. The difference between playing tight and moving with heaviness or loose and flowing starts with the mental part of the game.”

A disappointing performance during the District 6A-6 championship tournament provided the Mustangs with the lessons learned experience needed to navigate the state playoffs. Wekiva won the semifinal round but had to rally from a double-digit deficit during the fourth quarter. A 6-0 run midway through the third quarter pushed the Hawks into the lead for good and the district championship.

“The question when the state playoffs began was not if we are good enough to win?” Middleton said. “We had proven yes, but not consistently. Play has alternated between unsettled and settled though. Even with the alternating play though, opponents

were held to our average of 44 and then 43 points. Did we get enough playoff experience to have moved past the unsettled play was the question.

Wekiva’s play did develop to the level of settled throughout the regional final against Horizon. In particular, turnovers were overwhelmingly reduced from a total of 25 to 13 during the two contests against the Hawks.

“As said many times, even when not playing well, we are giving up an average of only 44 points per contest,” Middleton said. “A high powered, highlight reel offensive performance isn’t necessary to win most contests. So, controlling the pace is the difference for us and in particular, on offense.”

“Number of rebounds during the last three contests have been highest of the season. The more rebounds, the more opportunity as far as time we are on offense and can control the pace. However, opponents also can’t score when playing defense.”

Tone of Wekiva playing from ahead and giving up the lead only through committing mistakes was established during the first 10 minutes. The Mustangs were propelled into a 17-2 run by six Hawks’ turnovers. The lead taken by Wekiva was opened up to 19-9 three minutes into the second quarter.

Only five points were given up by the Hawks on the possessions following the turnovers. Thus, num-

ber of Horizon possessions in general and field goal attempts were reduced. With only one of seven converted, the Hawks couldn’t afford to fail to realize potential field goal attempts. However, every attempt was contested by Wekiva, a hand in the face and body in front of the shooter as has been the case all season. Field goals were converted at a rate of 60 percent or six out of 10 in the meantime by the Mustangs. The number significantly increased as Wekiva converted the last four attempts during the run.

Offensive rebounding came into significance with the Mustangs grabbing four after missing the previous six field goal attempts. Points were scored off all four offensive rebounds.

Wekiva took the lead and for good at 11-9. Wide open on the left wing, Brakayla Anderson received a pass from Jasmine Pooler and drained a three-point field goal attempt.

Score was 26-14 at halftime.

From the 2:09 mark of the third quarter, the tally was 23-5. Perhaps the most impressive statistic of the contest was holding the Hawks to five points over the last 10 minutes. Then again, Wekiva emphatically prevented any thought of a rally by closing the contest with a 15-0 run. The Hawks’ inability to score from the 6:29 mark is hard to forget as well.

Final-four teams are reseeded according to the formula used for the FH-

SAA power rankings. Scheduled for next Thursday, March 7, with tip-off at 1 p.m., the top-seeded St. Thomas Aquinas Raiders (21-9) will provide the opposition for the state semifinal. St. Thomas Aquinas vs. Wekiva (19-10) is also a rematch of the 2021 and 2022 state championship finals. At 5 p.m., the third-seeded Ponte Verde Sharks (22-8) and second-seeded Bloomingdale Bulls (29-0) meet. The Class 6A state championship final begins at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 9.

“The Raiders are very good and worthy of the number one ranking,” Middleton said. “There is no such team as unable to defeat. Taking the mindset of St. Thomas Aquinas is untouchable translates to we can’t win. Mindset of we can play as well as the Raiders and win is accordingly the starting point for preparation. We have knocked off a one, three and four seed. Again, the experience of playing in the playoffs has been gained. However, the experience was deeper, winning against seeds higher than us during the playoffs and at the top of the list is a number one seed.

“Winning is about preventing mistakes and giving extra opportunities to opponents. We are preventing mistakes and additional opportunities like every other team advancing to the state final-four.”

ing into the sixth inning needed to get the bats going again.

The Darters thought they had done it too. In the sixth, Apopka willed three runs in and put themselves back up 6-5 as the Lions took the plate at the bottom of the sixth. But Oviedo wasn't finished.

Oviedo matched Apopka's play and put up three runs of their own putting themselves back on top 8-6 for the last runs of the game.

The game ended after a scoreless seventh inning with Apopka still trailing 8-6 in a game that had both teams on the edge of their seats.

Most of Apopka's problems against the Lions came from the inability to finish when at bat. Apopka left 15 Darters on base compared to Oviedo's nine. Other pieces of the puzzle were errors and mistakes, both in the field and on the mound. Apopka had three fielding errors compared to Oviedo's zero and on the mound, Apopka's pitchers had a collective average of .208 but also hit four batters with

pitches and gave seven bases due to walks.

Apopka vs. Ocoee: Win 16-1

Talk about a game! The score says it all really. It was an old-fashioned slugfest from Apopka at times - it seemed impossible for them not to hit the ball. It wasn't over time or a slow grind to 16 runs either, this happened with haste. In a game that was over from the first inning, even Ocoee's dugout was waiting for the 15-run rule to kick in.

It's funny, too, because when I talked to Brewer after the game, he talked about Ocoee being somewhat of a "trap game."

"We've played them in the past...and I won't say they are not successful, but even when they are unsuccessful against teams that we beat, it seems like when Ocoee plays us, they usually play it like it's the seventh game of the world series. But tonight is the first night we have had this kind of game with Ocoee. Usually, it's a nail bitter all the way down to the end so that's why I say it's a game that I really wasn't looking forward to because they

just always play us tight."

Apopka had put up 12 unanswered runs on Ocoee in the first two innings and didn't show any signs of slowing down. The Darters had a collective batting average of .556 and an OBP of .625. Apopka's biggest players of the night were Cody McKinley, Zachery Barrieau, and Jackson Adams: McKinley had a 1.000 batting average, two runs, and an RBI; Barrieau had a .667 batting average, a .750 OBP, three runs, and two RBIs; Adams had a .667 batting average, one run, and four RBIs.

"The work during the week. We changed a lot of approaches, we changed a lot of swings, we moved the batting order around a little bit, and we got some people in some spots that we needed to get them into because they have been struggling a little bit. Their mentality (the team's) has changed as this week went along so you saw it here tonight. They were very aggressive and right on point with everything they were trying to do," Bobby Brewer said regarding the success against Ocoee.

Again, this was one of those games that was over

before it started, and that is no more evident than when looking at the stats. Ocoee had six fielding errors, and many led to multiple bases for Apopka. The Darters had just one fielding error and kept the sheets clean other than that.

"As far as the defense goes... we have actually been playing fairly good defense as it is, so we are really happy with that. So, we've been taking a lot more ground balls and doing some different techniques and drills, really just workin', man, and trying to figure something out, and tonight it all came together," said Brewer.

Pitching and fielding-wise, Brewer was very happy with the Darters' performance.

"The pitching was great! Connor McAfee did a great job, and Kyle (Garland) did a good job coming in, and that is what we use Kyle for, an inning at a time. We weren't gonna use Alejandro (Posluszny), but we brought him in, and he'll be somebody we use Friday night (against South Lake), too, so we just wanted to get in a rep for him, and it worked out good for him."

The Darters had three pitchers in the game starting with Connor McAfee, followed by Kyle Garland, and finally Alejandro Posluszny who finished the game. McAfee was the main guy and threw 44 pitches while keeping Ocoee batters to a .250 average. McAfee had seven strikeouts, allowed three hits, and just one run. Garland was only in for a short spout but handled his business at that time. Garland threw 12 pitches, had two strikeouts, and faced four batters. To end the night, Posluszny took the mound and made a near-perfect inning. Posluszny threw 12 pitches and had three strikeouts on his three batters faced to end the game.

"That we can hit the ball when it's game time! That we can hit the ball when we are under pressure! That we can hit the ball when we have the opportunity to and when the moment shows up, and we gotta show up. And they (the team) showed that they can do that tonight, so hopefully we can carry this play right on into Friday night."

Brewer felt great about the team's mental

space and camaraderie during the win and hopes to keep that emotional energy and togetherness going into the next game, but knows it's not easy when you don't start the game ahead by five runs.

"Tonight, obviously, we had a lot of guys pumped up and they were talking to each other a lot, and guys couldn't wait to get up to the plate to hit. Guys were talking about what they were doing on the field and how to improve and they were helping each other out more. And again, that's something that, when you're playing well or you're on a roll, it's easy! But when you're not playing well and not scoring runs and you know that you left three people on base out there... sometimes we just think too much, instead of saying, 'Hey think about it. Let it go. And now let's move forward.' And we gotta get better at that, but tonight, we stayed positive all night."

Thinly sliced baking potatoes, cheese, egg, milk in pie crust ... mmm good

From *Charleston Receipts*, James Island Shrimp Pie is a shrimp and rice casserole contributed by Mrs. John Jenkins. You need two



pounds of shrimp and a cup of raw rice, both of which you cook before making the pie. It is then baked in a moderate oven (350 to 375 degrees) for about 30 minutes or until brown on top.

We thank Joan Tice for her Meat Balls in Sauce we found in *Sharing Our Finest Cookbook* from the Apopka Citizen Police Alumni Association. This recipe calls for ground meat, so she intends that you can decide to use whatever you want.

Savannah Style cookbook's Marinated Chicken on the Grill is meant to be prepared the night before you plan to put it on the grill. This recipe yields 12 pieces of chicken.

Apple and Pecan Acorn Squash from *Southern Living* will be delicious. The biggest challenge is in cutting the squash in half. Be very careful.

How about Potato Pie that looks absolutely decadent? Allison Chase contributed her recipe to *Feeding the Flock*, and we have it for you right here.

Chickpea Salad from thepioneerwoman.com website appears to be beautiful, delicious, AND nutritious! Chickpeas and garbanzo beans are the same vegetable. The names are interchangeable in English and Spanish. They have been around for thousands of years, however, you can find them in the canned foods section next to all the other beans in your grocery store! This recipe makes six servings.

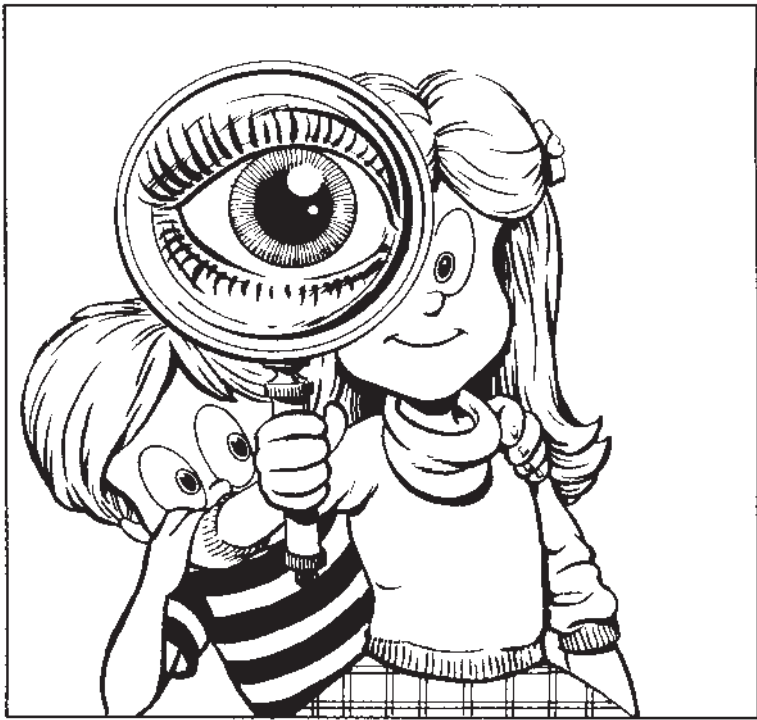

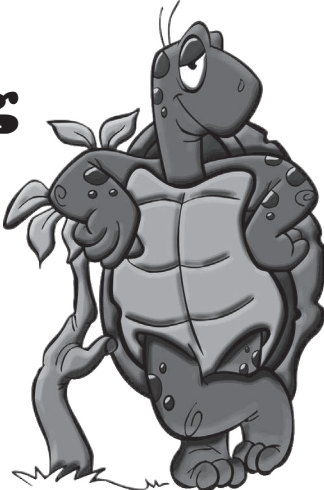
