APK Flag Football suffers first loss of the season to Horizon

The Apopka High School Flag Football team was on a roll so far this season going into their game on Monday, March 25, undefeated with six wins. Before the game, the team sat first in 2A District 5, second in Orlando, 15th in Class 2A, 23rd in the state of Florida, and 23rd nationally.

Their game on Mon-

day was against the Horizon Hawks who were coming into the game sporting a 9-1 record with their only loss being to Ocoee (7-0). The Hawks, like Apopka, were ranked very high coming into the game and, in fact, were ranked second in their district, 2A District 10, fourth in Orlando, 16th in Class 2A, 25th in the state, and 25th in the nation.

It was easy to see from the numbers that these

teams were neck and neck except for the quality of their schedule. Horizon schedule has a strength set by FHSAA at 2.93, while Apopka's has a strength of .72.

The game itself was fun to watch. Its seven-on-seven with no blocking or contact. Obviously, a lot of the same rules apply to flag football that you know from what you watch on Saturday and Sunday. But the main things are that in FHSAA's version of flag football, there is no timer on the rushers and, instead of traditional blocking, you can screen block. The only stipulation for the rushers is that they have to avoid contact with players on the offense that are setting a screen block for their designated quarterback.

A screen block as defined by FHSAA is "legally obstructing an opponent without using any part of the body to initiate contact." So the normal set was having two players on the line set to screen block for your quarterback and the rest as receivers or backs.

Unfortunately, the girls lost the game in the final moments. After being down for most of the

game, Apopka made a quick comeback late in the fourth quarter after making a huge stop deep on their side of the field. Apopka went with a pass behind the line of scrimmage to Jhenelle Francis, who took one look at the busted Horizon defense and switched the field to the other side to go 90 yards for a touchdown.

The touchdown put Apopka in a winning situation with under a minute on the clock. Apopka

was down 13-6 before the touchdown and were behind one point. You can go for a one, two, and three-point conversion in flag, but they differ in distance from the endzone. The one-point conversion is at the three-yard line, the two-point conversion is set at the 10-yard line, and the three-point conversion is set at the 20-yard line.

Apopka went for two from the ten-yard line.

Apopka Baseball's tenth straight victory at home!

The Apopka Baseball team picked up their tenth straight win at home on Tuesday, March 26, defeating the Eustis Panthers 11-5. A slew of Apopka players stepped up in the big win that started out as a nightmare for the Blue Darters. The Apopka Blue Darters came back to win despite trailing 5-0 in the second inning.

"We battled, we kept ourselves in the ball game. Our pitchers did a good job of keeping us close until our hitters found their rhythm to get us back in the ballgame. It didn't start out the way we wanted to, but when you keep your team in the ball game and your

pitchers are putting up zeros on the board, you always got a chance," said Apopka's pitching coach

Steve Stowell after the game.

Like I said, Apopka didn't have the best start.

Braylon Reynante started on the mound for Apopka but immediately ran into trouble walking the first

Panther batter and giving a base hit to the second. He struck out the third batter, but it was the cleanup hit-

ter for Eustis that created havoc for the Blue Darters.

Reynante threw ball after ball, just unable to feel out the strike zone. Wild pitches and a mistake from Apopka's catcher, Reef VanKuren, let two runs in. Apopka was down 2-0 with just one out in the first inning and was looking for a way to stop the bleeding fast. Reynante stayed on the mound as Apopka tried to get him to play through the mistakes, but a homerun that sent in an RBI was the result that put Eustis up 4-0.

Reynante faced one more batter and got the out thanks to the Apopka outfield on a hit from a Panthers' batter. That was

WHS Baseball defeats Lake Tohopekaliga, falls to Mount Dora

The school of thought, "most contests are lost," still best describes the Wekiva Mustangs' performance during the 2024 season. However, with a record of 3-7, the 2024 season is now 10 contests old and Wekiva has failed to realize a winning streak three times.

"Until we stop committing errors and mistakes, the losses will continue," Mustangs coach Brian Tatai said. "The most fundamental concepts of baseball: if a team can't score, a team can't win. If a team can't stop the opponent from scoring, the team loses. We are doing both because of errors and mistakes. We don't give up runs because of errors or mistakes committed in the field. Then mistakes or

errors preventing us from scoring are committed. Or the opposite happens."

The most recent opportunity to win two contests in a row was ended on March 26 by the Mount Dora Hurricanes. By a 7-5 score, the then 6-1 Tohopekaliga Tigers were defeated on March 12. (Wekiva did not play between the contests due to spring break.)

"Only one error was committed when playing Tohopekaliga, and we won," Tatai said. "In fact, the performance demonstrated we can play with, and even defeat, teams with better records. The lead was taken in the first inning when we were focused and playing at the level capable of. Level of play was significantly lower against the Hurricanes. Intensity of focus and concentration were much higher when playing Tohopekaliga and the

record (at the time) than against Mount Dora.

Against the Tigers, five runs were pushed across home plate by the Mustangs during the first inning. Two more tallies were added during the sixth inning to secure the victory. Hits totaled seven, but Wekiva drew four walks and three hit batsmen. During the first inning, nine Mustang batters reached base.

Miguel Acosta (4-2/3 innings), Luis Perez (2/3) and Onrique Archie (1-2/3) took to the mound for Wekiva. Stat line was five hits and four walks given up while striking out 10 for the trio.

"Errors and mistakes provide opportunity to win for any opponent," Tatai said. "We also demonstrated the record doesn't mat-

Bluegills will spawn all summer


Hello Folks,

It's been a couple of weeks since I put my article together for our readers. I had to have another back surgery and I was out for another 10 days. I'm recovering at home now and will hopefully be on the water real soon.

The fishin' hasn't been too bad and folks have been finishin' up speck season. If any specks still need to spawn, they probably did it this week with the full moon on Monday of this week. There may be a few specks left for next month, but most likely, they are finished and gettin' ready for their summer pattern. Some folks fish for specks all year long, but when the specks move to deeper water in the summer, you just have to have a lot of patience to find 'em. Once you locate a school of 'em in deep water, you may be able to get your limit.

Startin' next month in April, the bluegills will be spawnin'. Bluegills start spawnin' in April. They will spawn all summer long with the peak months in May and June. When the water temperature rises to about 75 to 80 degrees is when they do their thing.

The bluegills will spawn all summer on each month's full moon. You will see large slicks on top of the water and you will also see places where the bluegills fan out depressions in the sand. Once you locate the beds, you should be able to catch a limit of bluegills in a real short

time. The best baits to use for bluegills are red worms, crickets, and grass-shrimp. You can also catch 'em on Beetle Spins, Road Runners, curly tail jigs, or any other small jig-type bait. These panfish are a lot of fun to catch. When you get on 'em, you will have a blast catchin' them.

Bluegill time is family time. You need to go fishin' with your family, especially if you have children. They will have fun catchin' one right after another when they start bitin'. You will stay very busy takin' the fish off the hook. The children will be sayin' "Hurry up Daddy (or Mom). They are bitin'—put another worm on my line so I can catch another one."

The bass fishin' has been pretty good as of late. Folks are catchin' some bass in the Butler Chain, the Winter Park Chain, the Harris Chain, and West Lake Toho. Rick and his brothers-in-law finished up their fishin' trip before my surgery. They decided on the last day they would fish the Butler Chain. They caught over 40 bass that day. My buddy Rich Niles fished Lake Yale over the

weekend and it was a little slow. He only caught 3 bass up to 3 pounds. It was a little windy and he decided to fish the Winter Park Chain. He caught and released around 10 bass up to 4 pounds.

I'm sad to report that our friend Brian Slover has passed. He fished his bass club's classic on Lake Okeechobee and won the classic. The next week Brian went back down on Thursday to practice for another club's tournament on Lake Okeechobee. That Thursday mornin' he had breakfast with Bill Trevino and his fishin' partner. Brian went to the ramp to launch his boat. As Trevino and his partner were headed out to fish, Brian had a massive heart attack, and passed. There will be a benefit bass tournament in his honor, for his family, this weekend on the Harris Chain. The tournament will be held on Saturday, March 30th, at Hickory Point on Lake Harris. The entry fee is \$60 dollars per team and the big bass pot will be \$10 dollars entry for the biggest bass. After the tournament, they will hold a celebration of life at 3 p.m. at Hickory Point. Sadly, the ball didn't make it to the receiver's hands and Apopka sat behind 13-12 with under a minute to go and only one timeout.

Horizon ran the clock out when they got the ball and Apopka suffered their first loss of the season, a loss that head coach Tanisha Wilson said will be a good lesson.

"Coming into the game, I knew they were going to be a great opponent based off their record and the amount of points they have put up so far this season, and I knew it was going to be a fair and even game."

Wilson said she attributes the loss to a few things but mostly to dropped passes that could've saved the day. On multiple occasions, the Darters dropped balls that would've resulted in first downs, but most importantly, game winning extra points.

"We dropped some passes along the way that we should've caught, two passes in the endzone on extra-point conversions where the ball was right in our hands, and we just couldn't hold on to it. So those two opportunities were the difference maker in the game and we're just going to

go back to the lab tomorrow and correct those mistakes."

Apopka dropped both of their extra-point conversions but also threw four interceptions. Horizon threw two interceptions but two of Apopka's interceptions were thrown right after the defense just got them the ball back.

Defensively, Apopka was sound, especially in the second half completely shutting down the Horizon offense that was in their element in the first half. Coach Wilson talked to me about Apopka's defensive adjustments coming out of the half and why the defense was not as tight in the first half.

"So, we took one of our rushers and pulled her back because she is a little more aggressive on defense, so we locked her in at linebacker. We are actually missing one of our stronger linebackers tonight, so we had to make those adjustments."

The girls sport a 6-1 record but still sit at first in the 2A District 5 standings. The team faced Wekiva High School on Wednesday, March 27, and defeated the Mustangs 21-0

Vergos has indeed excelled at every level. Starting in high school with a collection of state championships then on Team USA he swept every event and got five gold medals. When he went to college



Baseball: Garland and Spaid pave way for comeback on the mound

the last batter Reynante faced as Kyle Garland was brought out to finish out the first. Reynante allowed two hits and four runs over two-thirds of an inning, striking out one batter and walking two.

Garland made quick work to end the inning for Apopka so they could move to the plate for a chance to immediately cut into the lead. Apopka was unable to score and was kept quiet in the first inning having to go back out on the field still down 4-0.

With danger afoot, Garland took the mound to start the second, hoping to be the savior the Darters needed. Eustis was able to get two runners on base and drive in a run, but a double play made by Reid Taylor sealed away the chance of another explosive Eustis inning.

Apopka was able to get on base in the bottom of the second, but three strikeouts would mean the end to another scoreless inning for Apopka, now down 5-0 going into the third inning.

And then the winds of change blew in and Apopka decided to raise the main sail and ride it to victory. Apopka made quick work of the Eustis batters

in the third inning with three batters up and three outs.

"Just try to stay positive and limit the bleeding," coach Stowell said was the focus going into the third inning.

Nico Posluszny was up to bat first for Apopka but couldn't beat the ball to the bag at first after a bunt. Cody McKinley was up next, and he sent a heater right down the center of second base splitting the zone perfectly for a base hit.

Jordan Little was up next to bat for Apopka. McKinley stole second base during Little's at-bat and Little was eventually walked as the bases began to get more traffic for the Blue Darters. VanKuren was up to the plate and ready to bring some life back into the Apopka dugout. He secured an RBI single sending in McKinley for the Blue Darters' first run of the night.

At this point, the Eustis pitcher was starting to feel the pressure, and fatigue set in from Apopka's batters who were making him throw a lot of pitches early on. A wild pitch from Eustis' pitcher sent Little home from second and advanced VanKuren to third base.

Brady Roberts was

next up, but an uncharacteristic strikeout sent him back to the dugout early. Now facing two outs, Taylor was up next for Apopka. Taylor was walked after battling at the plate through more than a handful of pitches.

Apopka still has two outs with runners on first and third as Jackson Adams made his way to the plate. The Eustis pitcher was continuing to struggle to keep the ball in the strike zone, and a lot of the time just in his catcher's grasp. A wild pitch sent VanKuren home from third during Adam's at bat. Facing a near full count, Adams got the exact ball he wanted and went yard sending it over the left fielder's head and over the fence for a homerun sending in Little for an RBI.

Apopka had tied the game in one inning and still wasn't back in the field. The explosive inning didn't live on for long after that when Brandon Sowers was struck out for the third out of the inning.

Garland made more quick work with Eustis batters in the fourth collecting two strikeouts and the outfield picking up a pop-out in foul territory.

"When we came back and had five runs it was very important that Kyle

(Garland) go out there and put zeros on the board. And he came out and had three strikeouts, and that helped the momentum to get us back in and put up another five," Stowell said.

Apopka wasn't finished. Even though the third inning was insane, the game was still tied. They needed another identical inning to create a comfortable lead and just lean on Eustis for the rest of the game.

Apopka went on to do just that, putting up another five-run inning coming from Apopka's unwillingness to settle at the plate. Walks, stolen bases, wild pitches, and clutch hitting were the name of the game. That's how Apopka turned the game around, by being as patient as you can at the plate and letting Eustis be their own worst enemy.

The game was relatively quiet after that as Eustis didn't score another run after the second inning, and Apopka went on to score one more in the sixth inning putting them up 11-5 going into the final inning.

In the sixth inning, Apopka's Tyler Spaid came onto the mound to close out the game for Apopka. Spaid, like Garland, was just phenom-

enal earning the save and collecting eight strikeouts against 10 batters while throwing 46 pitches with an ERA of zero. Garland was just as good and collected the win for Apopka tallying two strikeouts against 12 batters while throwing 33 pitches with an ERA of 2.1.

Stowell talked about Spaid's performance after the game. "He did exactly what I expected him to do. I wasn't going to use him if the game wasn't close. But the game changed in that one inning, and I got him loose and I knew what he was going to do to keep us right there in the ball game."

The Blue Darters tallied 11 hits in the game; McKinley, Wyatt Jagers, and Sowers collected multiple hits. Patience was key for Apopka as they had seven batters walked. The Darters also ran amuck on the bases, collecting five stolen bases. As a team, the Blue Darters had a .407 batting average, a .568 on-base percentage, 11 hits, two doubles, one home run, and nine RBIs. The Blue Darter's fielding was perfect with a team fielding percentage of 100 percent. VanKuren led the team in putouts with 11 while the team had one double play.

Stowell said he hopes

the boys look back on this win as an example of how to play and how they can play in tough situations. "Hopefully the players will see that. As coaches, we know that they can do it; it's just about convincing them that they have it within themselves and to be confident with themselves."

The head coach of the Apopka Blue Darters, Bobby Brewer, was not present at the game but did get in touch with me to talk about how proud he was of the win and the boy's performance, especially his pitchers.

"We got off to a rough start but the boys battled back. Kyle Garland did a great job coming in to pitch in the first inning and slowing down the Panthers. Tyler Spaid did what he usually does - and that is finishing the job when called on. He is having a great season so far."


"We had a lot of good at-bats tonight from Cody McKinley, Reid Taylor, Wyatt Jagger, Brandon Sowers, and of course Jackson Adams, who had a monster game. We have swung the bats good the last couple of games, but Adams had a big night and we needed that from him," Brewer said about the explosiveness at the plate.

ter as far as opponents winning when errors and mistakes are committed."

The best performance of the season in the form of pitching a complete contest was produced by Acosta against the Hurricanes. However, Cooper Chapman was even better, pitching a complete contest and shutout while winning by a score of 2-0.

A single hit by Walker Bland began the top of the third frame. Noah Ma-

cinness then tapped an Acosta pitch just six inches into fair territory and left of home plate. Two throwing errors followed, allowing Macinness to round all three bases and score the first run. During the seventh inning, Mount Dora collected a walk, hit batsman and single to up the lead to what would be the final score of 2-0.

The Mustangs actually reached base more on a hit, five times compared to four for the Hurricanes. Walks and hit batsmen were 4-2

in favor of Mount Dora though.

Difference was that Chapman did not allow a Mustang runner to reach third base. All four times a Wekiva runner reached second base, Chapman induced the next batter into recording an out. The Mustangs' best opportunity to score was during the first inning as the first two batters reached base. A ground ball turned to a shortstop, to second base, to first base, double play. That ended the threat and inning though.

"This start was the first Miguel pitched into the sixth inning," Tatai said. "Strike to walk ratio of 60-37 was why, which means Acosta was consistently ahead in the count.

"Timely hitting didn't continue though. The throwing errors were obviously the catalyst of the first run. However, subtle mistakes facilitated the lack of timely hitting. Mount Dora deserves credit for turning the mistakes into tangible results. Opportunity was nevertheless provided by us

in the first place. Both double plays began with failing to execute the hit and run, for example. Then mistakes having a cumulative effect over the course of the contest has become an all too familiar story."

Wekiva's remaining contests are against the Trinity Prep Saints (Mar. 27), Four Corners Coyotes (Mar. 29), Mt. Dora Bulldogs (Apr. 1), Dr. Phillips Panthers (Apr. 4), Discovery Spartans (Apr. 5), Oak Ridge Pioneers (Apr. 8), Edgewater Eagles (Apr.

"Bouncing back from the mistakes is more difficult with each committed," captain Damir Simon said. We are beating ourselves right now. There is still time to turn the season around though."

From Emily Meggett, we have Stuffed Yellow Squash and Zucchini. She says, "Back in my day, we really liked to fill vegetables with all sorts of new foods and flavors. I loved making stuffed zucchini and squash because you could use all of the vegetable parts and create a tasty side that everyone would enjoy, even the children." The picture that accompanies the recipe shows a lovely white platter laden with the golden stuffed squash and zucchini shells. This dish, which serves seven, will be a perfect addition to your celebratory feast.

Jane Bradley in *Southern Style*, shares Granny's Potato Salad. Jane says, "Everyone in the family tries to

duplicate Granny's potato salad, and we all come close, but no one has her touch. One thing I learned many years ago is that I must mix my dressing and taste it prior to pouring it over the cooked potatoes. Granny just puts everything right on top of the potatoes and mixes the salad with her hands. I suggest you try my method until you've made it, as she has, for over 75 years!

"Actually there are a few things to remember when making any potato salad. Use the right kind of potato, a red skinned or all-purpose boiling potato. They are lower in starch and the best boilers, retaining their cubed shape when cooked. Pour dressing on potatoes while still hot so that the dressing is absorbed by the potato; and season the dressing well."

From *The Jones-Morris Family Treasury*, here is Carrot, Nut & Raisin Cake from Betty Ann Vakauza. It calls for a cream cheese frosting, a recipe (from *Southern Living*) which follows Betty Ann's cake recipe.

PAN-FRIED CHICKEN (Fried Chicken and Floured Fried Chicken)

From: Mark F. Sohn's *Hearty Country Cooking*

Ingredients:
2 to 3 pounds cut-up fryer parts
1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons paprika
2 teaspoons salt
1 to 2 cups safflower oil, or as needed

Steps:
 1) Wash the chicken and soak it for several hours in enough salted water to cover. 2) As the chicken soaks, mix the flour, paprika, and salt in the bottom of a soup plate. 3) In a skillet, heat 1/4-inch of oil until it starts to smoke. Dredge the chicken in the flour mixture, and place it in the skillet. If you want more crust on your chicken, pack the flour on the chicken. 4) Fry over a high heat until the chicken has browned on all sides. Reduce the heat and cover the pan, simmering for an additional 20 minutes or until the chicken reads 160 degrees Fahrenheit on a quick-response thermometer. Uncover, and fry for 5 to 10 more minutes, or until the chicken is crisp and the internal temperature reads 170-175 degrees Fahrenheit. 5) Drain on paper towels, and serve.

EMILY MEGGETT'S STUFFED YELLOW SQUASH AND ZUCCHINI

Recipe from *Gullah Geechee Home*

Cooking by Emily Meggett
5 yellow squash
2 zucchini
4 slices bacon, fried until crisp, chopped
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, at room temperature
1/2 cup breadcrumbs, plus more for topping
1/2 scallion, thinly sliced
Seasoning salt

1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 2) In a 12-quart pot, bring 8 quarts water to a boil over high heat. (No salt added.) Add the whole yellow squash and zucchini to the pot and boil for 4 minutes. 3) After the vegetables are cooked, drain the hot water and replace it with cold water to cool the squash. When the squash and zucchini are cool enough to handle, cut each one in half lengthwise, and cut off the narrow necks of the yellow squash. Chop the squash necks into pieces. Place the necks in a bowl and set aside. 4) Remove the insides of each squash and zucchini half and add them to the necks. 5) Place the halves in a 9 x 13-inch baking dish. 6) To the squash mixture, add the bacon, butter, breadcrumbs, scallion, and seasoning salt to taste. Mix the ingredients together thoroughly. Use this mixture to fill each yellow squash and zucchini cavity. 7) Sprinkle the top of each stuffed squash and zucchini with breadcrumbs. Pour 1/4 cup tepid water into the bottom of the baking dish to prevent the squash from burning. 8) Bake the stuffed squash for 20 to 25 minutes until the squash is cooked and slightly golden.

GRANNY'S POTATO SALAD

Recipe from *Southern Style*, by Jane Bradley

3-1/2 pounds (about 8 large) red skinned potatoes
2 teaspoons salt
6 hard boiled eggs, chopped finely
1 jar (6 ounces) pimento, chopped finely, liquid reserved
1 large onion (about 8 ounces), chopped finely
1 teaspoon sugar
1-1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
3 tablespoons (apple) cider vinegar
1 cup mayonnaise
Hard boiled egg, celery leaves, bell pepper, or paprika for garnish

1) Peel potatoes and cut into bite-sized cubes. 2) Place in a pan of cold water, add salt and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer potatoes for 12 to 15 minutes until tender. 3) In the

meantime, using a medium mixing bowl, combine hard boiled eggs, pimento, and its liquid, onion, sugar, salt, pepper, vinegar and mayonnaise. Stir well to blend and set aside. 4) When potatoes are tender, pour into a colander and let drain for a minute or two. Place potatoes into a large bowl and cover with dressing. 5) Using a rubber spatula so that you won't mash the potatoes, begin to combine, folding until the potatoes are completely covered with the dressing. 6) Cover and cool to room temperature. 7) Stir salad and taste a bit, adjusting the seasonings if necessary. 8) Spoon into a serving bowl and garnish as you like with paprika, celery leaves, sliced bell pepper, or sliced boil egg. Yield: About 2 quarts, or 5-1/4 pounds, or 10 to 12 servings.

BETTY ANN VAKAUZA'S CARROT, NUT & RAISIN CAKE

Recipe from *The Jones-Morris Family Treasury*

1-1/3 cups butter, softened
2 cups sugar
 Cream together the butter and sugar
4 eggs
 And add next group of ingredients:
2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking soda
2 teaspoons baking powder
2 teaspoons cinnamon
 Mix well until smooth, then add:
3 cups grated carrots
2/3 cups nuts
2/3 cups raisins
 Mix well. Bake at 350 degrees in 13-inch greased and floured pan for 45-50 minutes or until well browned and center springs back to touch. Frost with cream cheese frosting.

Vergos' father explained to me that his son isn't very braggadocious or arrogantly confident. He said Vergos is his own worst critic. He went on to explain that Vergos has all the physical tools and the ability to be the best, that much has been obvious for quite a while, but it comes down to the mental as it does in every sport.

"Sometimes it's you that's the only person standing in front of your abilities," Vergos' father said.

Vergos has a great support system in his hall-of-fame

bowling coach, Randy Peterson, his sponsors, and his family. Vergos' father explains that his son is obviously in a great spot but still needs to figure out if he will be doing this as his career.

"This was a two-year plan, and this is year two. So he's in that place where he's deciding between 'Do I make a living at this? Or do I use my business degree that I earned in college to just go out and get a job?'"

Vergos told his son that if he was going to try to make a run at this, then now is the time.

"You're not married, you're young, and you're gonna have kids and a wife one day with a mortgage to pay.

Now is the time to do it because you don't have all that. You won't have any regrets and at least you know you tried."

After Vegas, Vergos will be heading to Michigan for the World Series of Bowling. Vergos' father explained that it's a very grueling experience. Three weeks and around five tournaments are making up the World Series. After that, the season will be over, and by then, hopefully, Vergos will have a few more accolades under his belt and can make a decision about whether or not he will continue bowling at the professional level as his career.


