APK girls lacrosse extends win-streak to seven, beats Edgewater 13-7

The Apopka girls lacrosse team is on another tear this season sporting a now 9-1 record after defeating the Edgewater Eagles at home for their seventh win in a row this season. The girls have been having an unprecedented level of success with the only detriment in their record being a loss to Lake Mary.

Not only have the

girls been winning a lot of games, and in succession, but they are more of-

ten than not running up the score on their opponents. In seven of their nine wins, Apopka has scored four or more goals than their opponent and in three of their nine wins, they scored more than 10 points than their opponent. Offensively Apopka can produce efficiently and in excess and never let off the gas.

Last year the girls only lost three games in the regular season and went into the playoffs with a 12-3 record. Sadly, after beating Winter Springs in the first round of the District Tournament last year, the girls fell 19-4 to the Lake Mary Rams. Due to their amazing regular season success, Apopka still got a seat in the State Tournament. But facing another powerhouse program in Lake Brantley, however, the Darters fell 18-3 in the first round and ended their playoff run much before they wanted to.

"We actually scheduled a little tougher this year on purpose to get us ready for Districts (Tournament). We have a tough district; Lake Mary is our only loss but they put it to us, and they are one of the top teams in the state. Our

goal is to compete for Districts. And that means going through Lake Mary, we'll see them again, we had a tough game against Winter Springs who's in our district and we'll see them again. We also have a matchup with Lake Brantley on Monday, (March 11) and that will be a key

test to see how good we really are, and then a tough Boone team that Wednesday. So we are looking forward to the rest of the schedule. We got three tough games in a row.", head coach Ted Sheyda said after Apopka's win over the Edgewater Eagles. So far this season, the

girls have had multiple players step up and create the winning culture and level of play necessary for the 9-1 record. As of March 1, the team leaders in goals per game are: Emerson Sheyda with 3.1 goals a game and 25 to-

APK's Jada Jones finishes second at the FHSAA State Championship

From the Apopka Blue Darters' perspective, the same old same old con-

tinued. Efficiency was the calling card of the Blue Darters. Only four entries from Apopka qualified, but all won at least one match and scored points.

The state championship meets for both genders and all classifications (boys) were hosted by the Silver Spurs Arena in Osceola between February 29 and March 2.

"Placing eighth at the state championship meet is a successful ending to the season," Blue Darters coach Bruce McMillian said. "In particular, considering a lot of other teams competed with a higher number of qualifiers is successful. Only four wrestlers competed at the state championship meet and less than 10 during the regular season. Success continued on the basis of the entire season though. Jada (Jones)

was the only wrestler from Central Florida to advance to the championship final of a weight class, too.

"Then the final standings didn't reflect what we did performance-wise quite frankly. We should have been higher than eighth place. Three decisions resulting in points were questionable. However, questionable because I am trying to be respectful."

Only other team from Central Florida to place inside the top 20 was the Freedom Patriots. Apopka and Freedom were also the only two members of the Metro Conference placing inside the top-41.

"Potential to place

again during the postseason was present when the season started and grew steadily," McMillian said. "The wrestlers understand consistency in terms of getting

the most out of the numbers or with the level of efficiency established. However, establishing consistency

APK boys lacrosse fights to the end in loss to Lake Highland Prep

The Apopka boys lacrosse team has not had the best season and from my talks with the coaches, this year is all about fundamentals and growing pains. The team is 1-7 and sits third in their district under Lake Minneola (5-1) and Windermere (6-3).

Season Recap

Through the talks that I've had with the coaching staff on the team, this squad is quite young and very inexperienced. The squad only has nine seniors out of 33 players and quite a few kids have only just picked up a lacrosse stick months ago, some just weeks ago.

Apopka is coming off a 6-10 season last year where they fell to Windermere 18-0 in the sec-

ond round of the 2023 FHSAA Boys Lacrosse District Tournament. 12 of the team's 40 players last year were seniors that left the team when graduating leaving last year's juniors and this year's seniors some big shoes to fill.

So far this season the team is sixth in goals scored with 34 in the district and Windermere leads the district with 100 goals. The Darters are fifth in goals allowed with 76 allowed and Lake Minneola leads the district with only 40 goals allowed.

"We are improving.

We are definitely improving but it's always the fundamentals that are killing us. We gotta do some drills on ground balls and passing and catching in practice. That's what's going to push us over the top," head coach Devin Mitchell told me after their loss to Lake Highland Prep.

Although losing seven of their eight games, Apopka has kept these contests close and has proved they are often just a few plays away from victory. After the loss to Lake Highland three of Apopka's seven losses have been within

a point (Ocoee 7-6, Lake Buena Vista 6-5, and Windermere Prep 6-5).

"We got multiple guys. The captains we look towards are Jacob Gilliard, Jayden Sotolongo, Sam Nuebel, and Elijah Nuebel the twins. That's who we look towards, we lean on our captains," Coach Mitchell said when asked if

the team had any leaders.

Apopka vs. Lake Highland Prep: Loss 6-5

The Lake Highland Prep Lakers were 1-4 coming into this game and were a perfect opponent for Apopka to get a much-needed win. Sadly, I think

WHS Baseball looks to cut down mental and physical errors

The school of thought, “most contests are lost,” best describes the Wekiva Mustangs’ start to the 2024 season.

“Errors and mistakes are the story of the record,” Mustangs coach Brian Tatai said. “Prevent helping out, make winning for the opponent easier is not a secret in any sport. In baseball, though, there are certain specific errors and mistakes facilitating opportunities for opponents to score and win. We are committing *all* of those errors and mistakes.”

When the contest against the Evans Trojans is completed, the overall record will still be a disappointing 2-4. Wekiva held a 14-0 lead when inclement weather postponed the contest during the second inning. A contest is not official until four innings are completed.

“However, there is still time to right the ship,” Tatai said. “The ace of the pitching staff, Miguel Acosta has an ERA (earned run average) of 2.44, as well. Hitters advancing runners and pitchers trusting the defense to field the ball is the start though.”

During each contest, the Mustangs have committed at least five physical errors. Perhaps even more importantly as far as the significance, Wekiva is committing an equal number of mental mistakes.

“The most fundamental concepts of base-

ball: if a team can’t score, a team can’t win.” Tatai said. “If a team can’t stop the opponent from scoring, the team loses. We are doing both because of errors and mistakes. We don’t give up runs because of errors or mistakes committed in the field. Then mistakes or errors preventing us from scoring are committed. Or the opposite happens.

“The last contest is as far back as needed to find an example.”

A 2-0 lead was established during the first inning against the Freedom Patriots. However, runs were scored by the Patriots during the fifth and sixth frames to tie the score. Then the winning run was scored on a fielding error in the 10th frame.

“Mistakes and errors always put teams behind the eight ball,” Tatai said. “Not only are teams playing from behind because of mistakes and errors more difficult than ahead in general. One or perhaps two run deficits become at least four quickly. Playing from behind is more difficult than from ahead. Trying to make up a multiple run deficit is that much more difficult though. We aren’t overcoming just the deficit anymore. We are trying to overcome the mental aspect of having to regroup and then tangibly getting back to the original situation of facing the small deficit.”

The other victory came against the Lake Mary Prep Griffins.

Wekiva scored 33 runs

against Evans and Lake Mary Prep. Only six runs have been scored against the rest of the schedule though.

“Error losing the contest against the Patriots was tangible and the kind recorded in the scorebook,” Tatai said. “At least half of the innings though, we had opportunities to score and increase the lead. One more run significantly increases the odds of avoiding extra innings in the first place and eliminates the situation of no room for error with the bases loaded.

“Subtle errors and mistakes with the cumulative effect as the inning progresses have been perhaps even more damaging. The same step towards winning has to be achieved twice, a hard way to win for any team.”

Throwing to the wrong location, failing to put the ball in play with runners in scoring position and swinging at pitches outside of the strike zone were cited as examples. However, walk to strikeout ratio is a tangible and obvious example. At 38-38, the impact of Acosta’s 2.44 ERA is significantly decreased.

“Still and again, we have time to right the ship,” Tatai said. “Positive is we have control over the errors and mistakes committed. Opponents have nothing to do with the errors and mistakes cited. Errors and mistakes are a self-managed and corrected problem.”

The Davenport Broncos, Umatilla Bulldogs and Discovery Spartans have also taken victories this season.

Remaining contests before spring break are against the Dr. Phillips Panthers (away-March 8), St. Cloud Bulldogs (away-March 11) and Tohopekaliga Tigers (home-March 12).

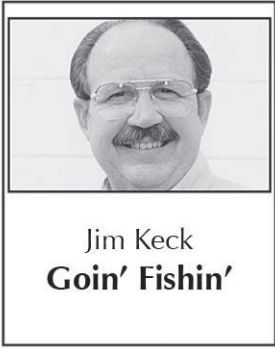
40 bass are caught on Butler Chain, biggest was four pounds

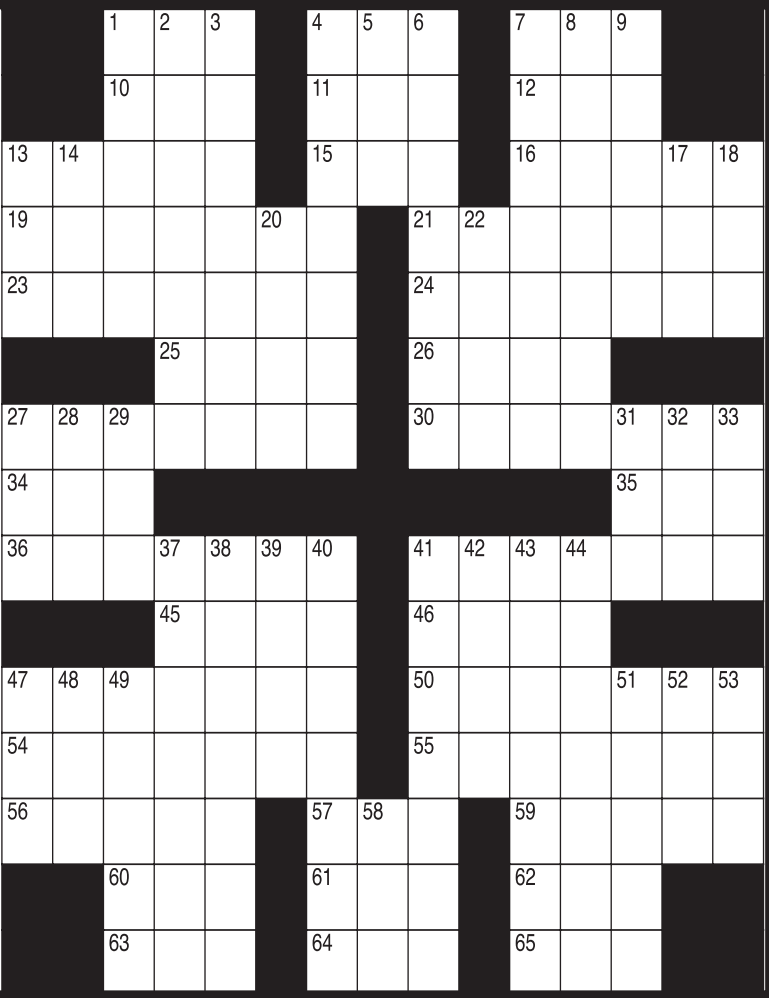

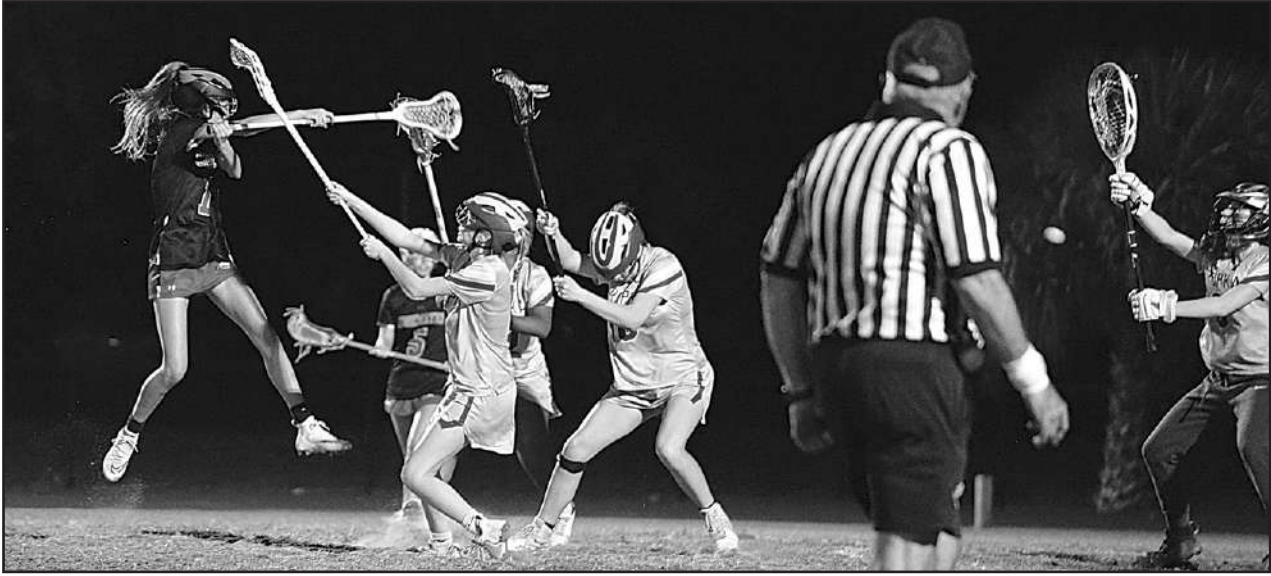

tal; Alexis Powell with 2.8 goals a game and 22 goals total; and Madeline Bondhus with 1.1 goals a game and eight total. Sheyda and Powell are also playmakers who create shot opportunities for their teammates regularly. Sheyda has an average of 1.8 assists per game and 14 total, Powell averages 1.6 a game and has 13 total.

When it comes down to an effort stat, Sheyda soars above the rest with almost twice as many ground balls as the next girl on the team with 41. Ground balls are the catalyst for offense in lacrosse, and if you can consistently control ground balls, you can control possession.

The defensive heart of this unit though is their keeper, Jordan Rose. Rose is the sole keeper for the girls’ team and is amazing. She is active in the crease and outside of it and is not afraid to use her feet to play with opposing attack men while looking for a clear. As of March 1, Rose has 56 saves this season and has only allowed 59 goals on 103 shots on goal for a 54.3 save percentage.

Sheyda, Rose, and Cayla Devin lead the team in caused turnovers combining for 38 turnovers. Sheyda leads the team with 25, Rose follows with eight, and Devlin is right behind Rose with five.

As of Wednesday, March 6, Apopka sits third in the Class 2A District 4 standings with a 3-1 district record sitting under Lake Mary (2-0) and Lake Brantley (1-0). Apopka is third in the district in goals scored with 102 under Lake Mary with 109 and Oviedo with 108. Apopka is second in the district on goals allowed with 59 under Lake Mary who has only allowed 14.

Apopka vs. Edgewater: Win 13-7

“It was a solid win; the girls came out and played hard from the get-go. Asia Jones had a great game she’s just getting back into form from basketball season so it’s nice to have her back at full strength. Emerson Sheyda

and Alexis Powell both had really good games on offense. Our defense is our key though. Our defense played great and held them to just seven goals,” coach Sheyda said after the win over Edgewater.

The team got to work quickly and within minutes had their first goal from the hands of Sheyda who took it all the way to the crease for an easy dunk into the net. The Darters weren’t done setting the tone yet though as Powell grabbed another goal on the next possession for Apopka putting them up 2-0 in the opening minutes of the first quarter.

The Edgewater defense was struggling to deal with Apopka’s scorers and playmakers especially close to the crease inside

the arc.

Apopka’s offense stayed hot and Powell scored the third goal with haste on an underhand golf swing shot. Powell kept possession, directed the Apopka offense, and looked for holes in the Edgewater defense for an open Darter or a lane to the goal for herself. Powell seemingly couldn’t miss as her third goal of the night came from a pass that was missed by the intended cutting Apopka player and sent right into the goal.

Edgewater wasn’t going to let the quarter end without putting a dent into the deficit though as they willed themselves a goal on a bull rush to the crease through the Apopka defense.

The first quarter end-

ed with Apopka up 4-1 dominating possession and keeping the ball off their side of the field for the most part.

Apopka opened up the second quarter the same way they did the first with a goal from Asia Jones in the first minute of the second. Jones scored off a penalty shot awarded to her. Edgewater bounced back and got a goal from a penalty shot of their own putting them behind Apopka 5-2 at 8:36 in the second.

The sixth goal came from Jones again as she used her speed and feints to get past another defender for a one-on-one look with the Edgewater keeper. Edgewater was awarded another penalty shot shortly after but Apopka’s keep-

er, Rose, made a great save to keep the lead intact.

The Apopka offense began to slow down halfway through the second quarter not getting the easy looks they were thriving on earlier. But as the end of the quarter drew closer, the offense found their rhythm again.

Apopka scored two goals in the final two minutes of the first half. The first came from Jones again on another penalty shot and the second from Powell who snagged a high pass out of the air above her, pump faked the Edgewater keeper, and found the back of the net to push the lead to 8-2 going into the locker room at halftime.

“The talk at the half was ‘All gas. No brakes. Keep it goin’,’ We were up 8-2 at half. Our goal was to get to a ten-goal lead in the third quarter, but that didn’t quite happen. Edgewater came out strong and hats off to Edgewater,” said coach Sheyda.

Like coach said, Edgewater came out of the half with something to prove. Down 8-2 and needing a swing in momentum Edgewater went on to score two goals quickly on Apopka. Edgewater was now behind 8-4 with 8:38 left in the third quarter.

“We had some bad turnovers and they caught

with the end result and getting the most starts during practices. Consistency among how and what we practice followed by preparation for meets must be first is understood by the wrestlers.”

The Blue Darters earned 43 points to place eighth out of 129 teams. Eleven out of the last 12 state championship meets have included Apopka among the top-10 in the final team standings. Since 2008, 44 wrestlers competing under the Blue Darters banner have placed at the state championship meet.

“Even more important, the wrestlers understand achieving success requires developing the talent and are willing to put the work in,” McMillian said. “Practice was always pursued with a detailed purpose, improvement in a specific area or areas, nor limited to actually wrestling. Making the right decisions based on the tangible particulars of winning, understanding the situation, scoring system and positioning in the standings were focused on, too.

“Then matches during the regular season were looked at as an opportunity for lessons learned and improvement.”

Jada Jones earned second place in the individual 190-pound weight class. The competition among the 130-pound weight class ended with Nehemie Gregoire in sixth place. Hananeel Gregoire (100 pounds) and Shelby Sherman (110) also earned points for Apopka.

Half of the 16 entry field places and earns points now. Winning the first two matches now secures placing instead of three.

Women’s high school wrestling consists of one classification but 14 weight classes.

There are three levels/meets of postseason competition for the sport of wrestling, district, region and state. Each of the four regions across the state are made up of four districts. Wrestlers earning first through fourth are considered to have placed. Most importantly, points are

scored and wrestlers placing no lower than fourth advance to the regional from the district, then from the regional to state championship meets. The regional and state championship meet fields are made up of 16 entries.

Each weight class is a double elimination tournament as far as continuing to compete. However, a 4-0 record is required to win the championship. Reaching the overall or championship final requires three consecutive victories in as many opportunities. Second is the only position with a 3-1 record.

Points are earned by each wrestler, added to the team total for margin of victories, with each round advancing to and the eventual place.

Jones defeated Orlisa Sands of the Deerfield Beach Bucks, Daphney Pierre of the Fort Myers Green Wave and Chloe Stinnett of the Hernando Leopards. All the victories were by pinfall.

An escape with only 0:32 remaining was executed by Jones. Referees’ decision referred to by McMillian most directly affecting the Blue Darters’ place among the final standings though, Jones was called for stalling with 0:10 remaining. Cheyenne Cruce of the Middelburg Broncos wrapped her arms around Jones’ waist. Attempting to score a takedown by means of Jones falling backwards, Cruce then moved the grip in a forward direction. Jones maintained her balance by stepping backwards. Momentum of the struggle for positioning and location carried the wrestlers out of bounds.

At 1-1, the championship final went into overtime. Cruce grabbed an off-balanced Jones by the ankles with 0:03 remaining and scored a takedown.

Three matches were won by Nehemie Gregoire as well.

Hananeel Gregoire and Nehemie Gregoire also lost matches in overtime. Both matches went into overtime after the two other questionable referees’ decisions referred to by McMillian were made.

Final records are 27-3 for Jones, 28-8 for Nehemie Gregoire, 19-7 for Sherman and 30-6 for Hananeel Gregoire.

Apopka competed in four individual bracketed tournaments this season, earning a low of fourth place during two. During both tournaments, Sherman was unable to compete due to a concussion.

A 4-1 record was also compiled in dual meets. However, the lone loss was because the Ocoee Knights could compete in more weight classes. (If a team cannot fill a weight class, the match is forfeited.)

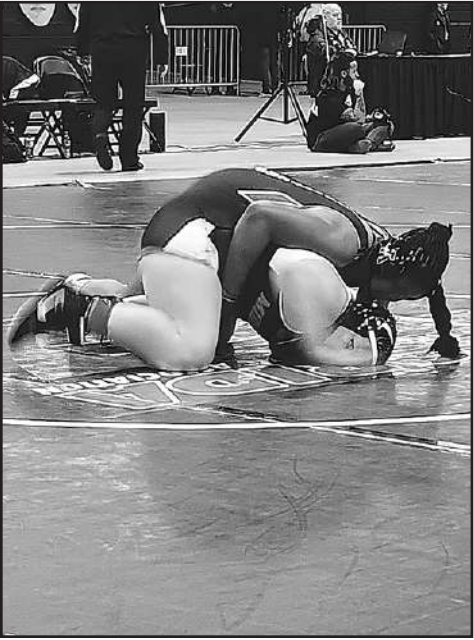

Weight class championships were claimed by all four state championship meet qualifiers at the District 5 championship meet.

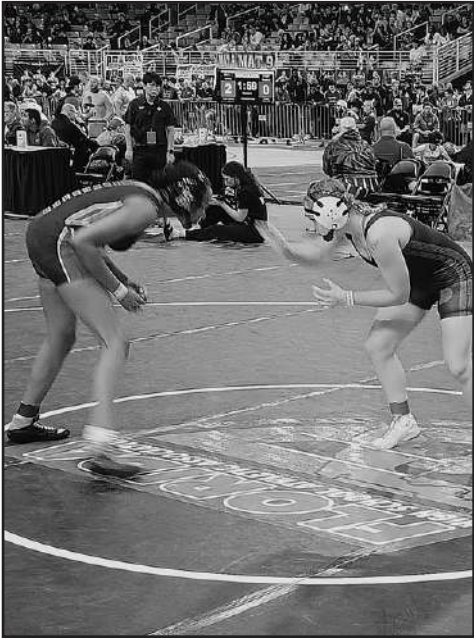

the Lakers thought the same thing about Apopka and played a great game and came away with the win.

The Lakers came out and quickly grabbed the lead in the first two minutes and challenged Apopka's very green goalie, Nya Makonnen. Makonnen is a freshman and started for the Darters in the game against the Lakers. But he has only been playing for what assistant coach Kelvin Joyner told me is just a few weeks.

The Lakers, thinking they found a way to score, stayed to the perimeter and started to shoot. It didn't take long for them to score their second goal, and just three minutes into the first quarter, Apopka was down 2-0 and was changing their keeper. Coming in for Ma-

konnen was Parker Aho.

The Lakers' unanswered goals were short-lived as Apopka scored at 7:36 in the first quarter to cut into the early deficit. The first quarter ended with Apopka trailing 2-1 but as the first quarter went by, Apopka held more and more possession of the ball not allowing the Lakers to create offense.

Apopka's face-off specialist Colt Hoyt was also perfect on face-offs coming into the second quarter and would continue to be so for most of the game. 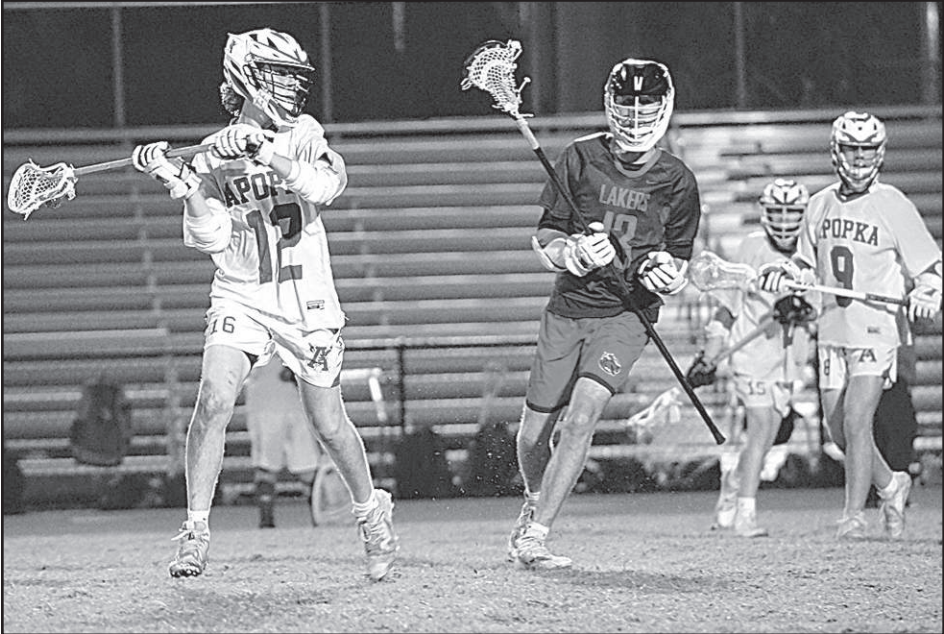
Apopka now just one score away from tying it all up again, needed to stay calm and focus on keeping the ball.

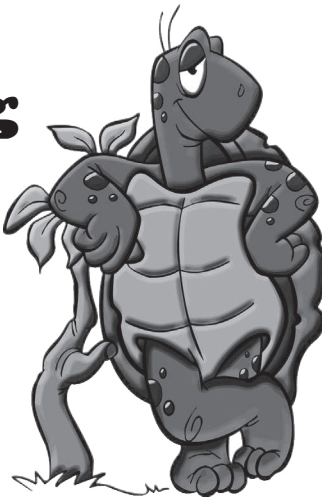
