The third was quiet for Apopka and Edgewater but Apopka got right back to it in the fourth and scored two runs to further separate from the Eagles on the scoreboard 6-1.

Edgewater was in

Apopka High School spring break sports round-up

With Apopka High School and Wekiva High School on spring break, I felt it was the perfect time to do a spring sports round-

up and check in on our favorite programs here in Apopka.

Baseball and Softball

I'll start with baseball and softball. The Blue Darter baseball team is having a good season and,

as of Wednesday, March 20, is 6-5 and sits first in 7A District 4. Apopka is 3-3 in their last five games beating West Orange, Dr. Phillips, and Edgewater but falling to Boone and Foundation Academy.

Apopka sits at the top of 7A District 4 in runs scored with 70 and is third in runs allowed with 49. The Blue Darters also have some of the top performers in the district. Reef VanKuren is ranked second in our district in batting average and third for RBIs, Brady Roberts is ranked first in home runs and slugging percentage, and Cody McKinley is ranked second in runs scored and third in stolen bases.

Apopka's leaders in batting average are: VanKuren with a .481; Jackson Adams with a .406, and Cody McKinley with a .385. Apopka's

leaders in on-base percentage are: Adams with a .537; McKinley with a .500, and VanKuren with a .483. Roberts leads the team in home runs with two and Wyatt Jagers has Apopka's only other home run. Apopka's run leaders are: McKinley with 11; Roberts with nine; and Adams with eight. Apopka's RBI leaders are: VanKuren with nine; Adams with eight; and McKinley with eight. The team's stolen base leaders are McKinley with nine, Reid Taylor with four, and Roberts with two.

Apopka also has 11 players with perfect fielding percentage this season. Pitching-wise, Apopka's Wyatt Jagers leads the team in ERA but has only pitched eight innings. Alejandro Posluszny and Braylon Renante are right behind Jagers with more innings pitched. Apopka's

strikeout leaders are: Connor McAfee with 19; Tyler Spaid with 18; Reynante with 17; and Posluszny with 16.

The Blue Darter softball team is having a troubled season and is 2-7 and

sits third in 7A District 3 as of Wednesday, March 20. The girls are 1-4 in their last five games beating Ocoee 3-1 and falling to Eustis, Spruce Creek,

Sea turtle nesting season arrives along Florida’s coasts

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is sharing the reminder that sea turtles are starting to nest on our beaches. Residents and visitors can play a big part in helping to protect vulnerable nesting sea turtles this spring and summer while visiting Florida’s coastal habitats.

Because our state’s shorelines provide important nesting habitat for several species of threatened and endangered sea turtles, beachgoers can have a significant impact on their nesting success. To help nesting sea turtles, people can take easy steps to protect them, including giving them space, minimizing disturbances and keeping beaches clean and dark.

Clear the way at the

end of the day: Female sea turtles expend large amounts of energy crawling out of the surf and far enough up the sand in order to dig and lay nests in spots that are less vulnerable to the tides. Obstacles on the beach can entrap and prevent them from nesting as they crawl across the sand to lay their eggs. Trash, holes in the sand and other obstacles can also prevent sea turtle hatchlings from reaching the water once they emerge from their nests. Food scraps attract predators, such as raccoons and crows, that prey on sea turtle hatchlings. Litter on beaches can entangle sea turtles, birds and other wildlife. What can you do to help? Properly stash or recycle all trash, fill in human-made holes in the sand, and

remove all beach toys, gear and furniture from the sand before sunset. Fishing line can be deadly to sea turtles, waterbirds and other wildlife, so be sure to dispose of it properly. To find a monofilament recycling station near you, visit mrrp.myfwc.com.

Lights out: Any lighting can misdirect and disturb nesting sea turtles and their hatchlings, leading them away from the ocean and toward potential danger. To prevent this, beachgoers should use natural starlight to see when on the beach at night and avoid using flashlights or cellphones. Anyone living along or visiting Florida beaches can do their part by putting porch, parking or deck lights out and closing curtains after dark to avoid disorienting

nesting and hatchling sea turtles on the beach. If lighting could still be visible from the beach, be sure it is long, low and shielded.

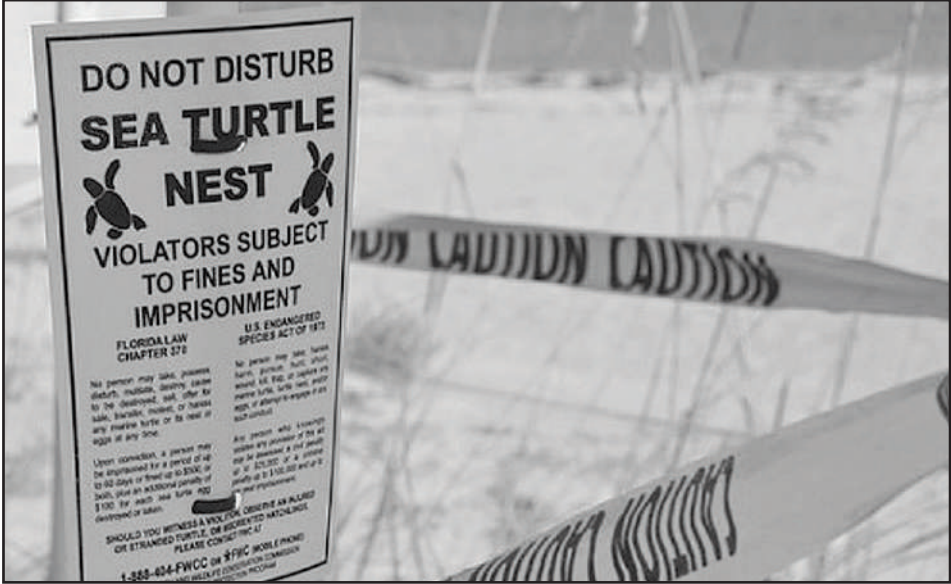
Admire from afar: While it can be exciting to witness sea turtles on the beach, getting too close (50 feet or less) to nesting sea turtles can cause them to leave the beach before they complete the nesting process. If an

animal changes their behavior, you’re likely too close. Remember – it is illegal to harm or disturb nesting sea turtles, their nests and eggs, or to pick up hatchlings.

Sea turtles typically return to nest in March along Florida’s southeast Atlantic coast from Brevard County south to Broward County, while nesting begins on Gulf Coast or north Florida beaches in

April or May.

forced and then turned into high percentage looks at the basket. Scoring is easier when in a fast break or transition.

“When a lot of turnovers are committed, number of possessions increases for the team receiving. Number of possessions decreases for the team committing the turnovers. Again, not a secret or a new way of winning.”

A’Niyah Liptrot (13) and Amari Dillon (7) pro-

vided a solid supplemental punch during the championship final by scoring a combined 19 points.

The trio also had strong performances in the other first-noticed statistical categories:

Assist: Liptrot-8
Rebounds: Dillon-8
Steals: Eldell-6

The top three teams in each cluster among Orange County earn berths into the playoffs. Piedmont Lakes was not only a cluster champion, but the playoffs’ number one seed after posting a 6-0 regular sea-

son record.

Victories were then procured over College Park, Maitland and Avalon en route to reaching the championship final.

“Perhaps not noticed much outside, but the coaches considered how the team handled the pressure an important factor from the beginning of the season,” West said. “The team handled the not so easy and often unnoticed task of playing with the getting back to the final pressure, let alone winning, very well.”

Piedmont Lakes also improved the overall record from 9-1 to the perfect 10-0 record this season. The Orlando Magic also honored Piedmont Lakes’ run to the championship at halftime of a recent contest.

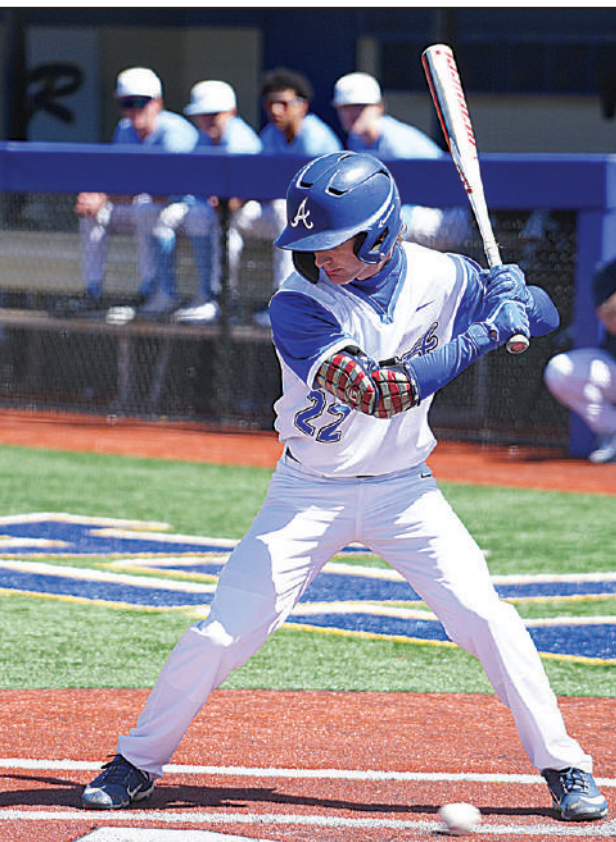

OBA of .214, an ERA of 1.75, and faced 19 batters while throwing 70 pitches. Jackson Adams and Reef VanKuren each collected two hits and Cody McKinley went 1-for-2 at the plate and led the team with two RBIs.

As a team, the Blue Darters had a .296 batting average, an OBP of .333, five RBIs, and stole four bases. Apopka also only left three runners on base while Reid Taylor and Nicolas Posluszny each collected a sacrifice bunt and McKinley collected a sacrifice fly.

On Edgewater's side the lefty, Bobby Viera, took the loss for Edgewater on the mound. Viera went six innings and allowed eight runs with five of them being earned. Apopka batters collected eight hits, were struck out twice, and walked once by Viera.

At the plate, four Edgewater batters each collected one hit and the Eagles' Nick Colins led the team with one run batted in. Putting the score to the side Edgewater's batters were very patient at the plate tallying six walks for

the game.

Apopka vs. Foundation Academy

"We just didn't play good today, we didn't play bad, we battled. They just swung the bats really well and we just couldn't find the zone a lot of the time, and the umpire was a bit tight (with the strike zone). But that's really no excuse we should be able to do a better job. Hitting the ball wise we scored runs; we just gave up too many today."

The Apopka Blue Darters lost 11-9 in a real barn burner against Foundation Academy in their second game of the tournament on Tuesday, March 19. Foundation Academy was 10-1 coming into the game with their only loss being to West Orange 3-1, who Apopka beat 3-2 on March 8.

Just like against the Eagles, the Blue Darters started hot at the plate scoring three runs easily. The first run came from a single from Jordan Little who sent in a runner. Roberts once again was the catalyst at the plate sending in Wyatt Jagers and Dylon Sanders for two runs. Apopka ended the

top of the first up 3-0 with great energy heading onto the field.

Braylon Reynante started on the mound for the Blue Darters but didn't stay very long. He couldn't seem to find the strike zone. Reynante threw 24 pitches to seven batters before giving up six runs in the first inning. He gave up four hits, six earned runs, walked three batters, and had an ERA of 126.00.

"We had Braylon out there and he's been our guy all year long, but he just didn't have his usual good play and I thought he would find it. He was also having a hard time adjusting to the umpire's strike zone so we had to make our changes."

Apopka no longer felt the momentum they did going into the bottom of the first and was down 6-3 heading into the top of the second. Miraculously Apopka improved on their first-inning play collecting five runs with ease.

But the runs didn't stop after that with Foundation finishing the second scoring two more runs to tie the game up at 8-8 going into the top of the third. Kyle Garland went

to the mound for Apopka in the second inning.

Both the third and fourth innings were quiet ones for both Foundation and Apopka. Wyatt Jagers had been pitching for Apopka since the top of the third and had allowed no runs. While Jagers was struggling with the umpire's strike zone walking five batters he still held it down for the Blue Darters for two innings scoreless.

But in the bottom of the fifth Jagers was starting to show fatigue and Foundation was beginning to decipher Apopka's signals, and one hit scored three runs for Foundation putting them up 11-8. Jagers was replaced with Alejandro Posluszny who finished out the fifth for Apopka before they hit the plate in the sixth.

Apopka was able to secure one run in the sixth and keep Foundation scoreless in the bottom of the sixth but was unable to score the two runs needed for extra innings.

The Blue Darters fell to Foundation 11-9 but will walk away from this loss knowing they could've won with just a bit more control and patience.

"Overall, they are a good team, they got one loss all year long. They are a good ball club that hit the heck out of the ball against us today and you gotta give them all the credit," said coach Brewer.

The Foundation Academy Lions as a team had a batting average of .480, an OBP of .600, collected 12 hits, 11 RBIs, and had two doubles while leaving eight runners on base. The Blue Darters had a team batting average of .310, an OBP of .382, collected nine hits, six RBIs, and had one double while leaving five runners on base.

Brewer said the kids were ready to play regardless of it being spring break.

"I think we were definitely ready to play, I don't think that (spring break) had anything to do with this. We were ready to play it's just they (Foundation) kept finding holes. It's not like they were hitting the ball super hard, they just kept finding holes. And when you are having a day like that you just gotta tip your hat and say, 'Hey man, try to score as many as you can,' and we just didn't have enough."

Pitching-wise Apopka had a tough one dealing with the umpire's strike zone and the Lions figuring out the signals between the Darters' catcher and pitcher. Apopka's pitchers had a collective ERA of 12.83, a collective OBA of .464, walked nine batters, had three strikeouts, and allowed 13 hits.

"Just a tough day. Those guys that threw today, usually do not perform like that. And, again I think the umpire's strike zone was tight, but he was tight the other way too (Foundation). Not to make any excuses but we just didn't have it today, it wasn't our day," coach Brewer said about the pitching. "We just came up short today. We got off to a great start then had a hard time getting outs... The game went back and forth and our guys never quit, we just ran out of innings."

The Blue Darters faced the Oviedo Lions on Wednesday and lost 3-1. They face the Dr. Phillips Panthers after press time today Friday, March 22 at 11 a.m.

Because a beautiful, crispy crust and tender, creamy interior is hard to achieve when roasting raw potatoes, taking the time to boil them first ensures they will not only have the perfect texture, they will also absorb more of the flavor from the oil and the ranch packet. One bite of crunchy, creamy potatoes, and you'll never want to roast potatoes the same way again. We also have the recipe for homemade ranch seasoning used on this and numerous other recipes you probably often prepare, below.

The recipe from thepioneerwoman.com for homemade ranch seasoning may take you five minutes to mix a few ingredients together, and you're all set. The key ingredient is dry buttermilk powder. You can find it in the baking aisle or near the powdered milk in your grocery store. 1 small to medium head of cabbage
2 eggs, hard-cooked
2 cups milk
2 tablespoons flour
1/2 cup margarine
4 ounces Cheddar cheese
Worcestershire sauce, to taste
Seasoned salt, to taste
Salt and pepper, to taste
Pour milk in small saucepan; bring to a boil. Make flour paste by adding a little milk to the flour. Add boiling milk until it becomes a thick white sauce. 1/4 cup buttermilk or whole milk
Chopped chives or dill, to serve
1) Preheat oven to 450 degrees Fahrenheit. Line a baking sheet with

foil. Pour 4 tablespoons of the oil onto the prepared baking sheet. Place the baking sheet into the oven. 2) In a large pot, add potatoes, salt, and water to cover by 1 inch. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Cook potatoes until they are almost tender, 8 to 10 minutes. Drain potatoes and return them to the pot. 1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 2) Put the peaches in a mixing bowl with the sugar, butter, flour, and lemon juice. Stir until the peaches are covered. 3) Transfer to the unbaked pie crust. Cover the top with pie crust and pinch the pie crusts together around the rim to seal. With a fork or toothpick, punch a few holes in the top pie crust. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes, until golden brown and bubbling.

EMILY MEGGETT'S PIE CRUST
Recipe from *Gullah Geechee Home Cooking* by Emily Meggett
1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour, plus about 1/2 cup for the countertop
1-1/2 teaspoons salt
3 heaping tablespoons Crisco shortening
7 tablespoons ice-cold water, plus more if needed
1) In a mixing bowl, combine the 1-1/2 cups flour and the salt. With a knife, cut the Crisco into the flour until it is a little lumpy. 2) Add the cold water by the tablespoon, and mix together until the dough holds together. If needed, add more water by the teaspoon. Careful... the dough should not be too wet or get stuck to your hands. Do not overwork the dough or it will become stiff. 3) Sprinkle 1/2 cup flour on the countertop. Take the dough and work it on the floured area. Separate the dough into two balls. 4) Roll out the dough with a rolling pin as thin as possible, making two pie crusts. Place one in the bottom of a pie dish. You may use a small knife to remove or trim any extra crust. Use other for the top crust. 5) To prebake a single crust: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Bake the crust in the pie dish until golden, about 15 minutes, checking after 10 minutes: If the crust bubbles up during baking, pierce the bubbles with a fork and return to the oven to finish baking. Let cool completely on a wire rack. If you're making my chocolate cream pie, lemon meringue pie, or sweet potato pie, you may use a fork to press into the rim edges of the pie dish, securing the pie crust to the dish.
