

APK Volleyball's Aidan Lowry ranked No.1 in the nation

The Apopka High School Boys' Volleyball team is still on an impressive roll this year and has extended their win streak to 11 after defeating the Ocoee Knights. I went to the game to personally see one of the top teams in Florida and was blown away by their level of play and how much fun they seemed to be having while

still dominating their opponent.

As of Wednesday, April 3, Apopka is ranked 16th in the state and 16th in Class 1A. Apopka also has some of the best players in the state and one of the best players in the country. As of Wednesday, April 3, The Blue Darters' very own Aidan Lowry is ranked number one in the nation in hitting percentage and number 16 in serving aces according to Max-Preps

To qualify for national ranking in hitting, a player must have played at least ten games and have 200 attack attempts. Lowry is at exactly 200 attempts and has a 60 hit percentage on 44 sets played. The next highest under him is Reagan Sager from Yucaipa, California, who has a 55.1 hit percentage on 227 attack attempts in 61

centage.

sets played. Lowry is also ranked third in both hitting percentage and kills in the state of Florida. In serving

aces, a player must have played at least ten games to qualify for national ranking. Lowry has 46 serving aces on 180 serving attempts for a 25.56 ace per-

To say the very least, Lowry is elite. I got to see him in action, and I'll say I would hate to be on the other side of the net when he's preparing to send some heat.

Lowry is not alone though. Apopka has a roster full of elite players like Devon Bolling. Bolling strangely enough is ranked higher than Lowry in hitting percentage in Florida, but not nationally. This is because the qualifications differ for state leaders than for national leaders.

The qualifications for state leaderboards are that players must have played at least five games and have 104 attempts. Bolling has a 63.8 hitting percentage but only has 152 attempts, so he cannot qualify for national ranking vet. In the state, Lowry is ranked third.

Logan Rogers is another huge piece of Apop-

and you don't need a freshwater license to go fishin'. So if you have been waitin' for a chance to do some fishin', this weekend is your chance to go. You do need to make sure that you follow the rules such as seasons, bag and size limit that apply to the fish you are goin' to catch. You can visit MyFWC.com to find areas to fish, boat ramps, or a pier where you can go fishin'. I hope you get a chance to go this weekend, and good luck.

Kyle at Bitter's Bait & Tackle reports that a few folks are fishin' off the seawall in Lake Monroe for some specks. They are fishin' with minners tryin' to catch a few before the bluegills start bitin'. We have



ka's puzzle of success. Rogers is ranked second in assists in the state with 358 averaging 8.1 assists per set.

Now, getting to the actual game itself, it was interesting because I haven't been to a volleyball game since my time at Apopka High School when my buddies played on the team. However, it did seem familiar to me. Volleyball players have a certain disposition that most athletes don't have on the court or the field. They are always smiling and having a good time, especially Apopka. In other sports, you may have to get into the zone and really focus on nothing else but the game, but it seemed Apopka was so good, they could kind of get away with joking around during the game and turn it on whenever they needed to.

The first set started with Apopka ahead and staying in the lead comfortably by three or four points until the halfway mark. Ocoee had quickly tied up the game in the first set, 14-14. Apopka's athleticism and strength were keeping them in the game, but it seemed it was Apopka's mistakes that were fueling Ocoee's points more than it was Ocoee making stellar plays.

Ocoee ended up taking the lead near the end of the set and was up 20-18 on Apopka. And, as I said before, as soon as the danger of a loss crept in Apopka turned it up, but still was joking and having a blast while doing it. Apopka won the first set 25-23.

The second set was Apopka getting a bit too comfortable. Apopka made the most of their mistakes in the second set, most likely fueled by the confidence from winning the first set without taking it

as seriously as they should have. Apopka lagged behind to start trailing 12-10. Ocoee made the most of their lead and kept Apopka on their toes. Ocoee went on a great run in the second set finishing it 25-18.

Most of Apopka's mistakes were coming at the net from blocks that didn't work, blocks that ricocheted the ball to an unreachable position, or putting too much power into their kill attempts that resulted in outs. But Apopka took that game as a wakeup call and got right back into gear for set three.

The Blue Darters came out with purpose in set three and made sure to show why they were ranked so high. The Darters got ahead early leading 8-5 but soon started snowballing the lead and patching up tiny mistakes. Ocoee was forced to call a timeout after trailing 16-9 but needed Apopka to start making mistakes again if they were going to come back

But Apopka didn't let up. They ended the third set leading 25-12 ready to roll into what would end up being the final set. The fourth set went even better than the third for Apopka as they had found their groove.

It was quick and it was ruthless. Apopka shot out ahead 5-1, and in minutes they were ahead 9-3. Lowry was making amazing serves with outstanding power that Ocoee couldn't hope to control. The Darters seemingly couldn't make a mistake as they

were leading 16-4 and finally ended the game without letting up a bit, leading 25-9.

Apopka's key players were: Lowry, Caden Mc-Gatha, Jahn-Carlos Gonzalez, Julian Gonzalez, Logan Rogers, Luis Rivera, and Jermain Benyoun. The team as a whole had a kill percentage of 50, averaged 9.5 kills a set, 21 aces, and 33 assists. Leading the team in kills was Lowry with 11, then McGatha with eight, and Julian Gonzalez with six. Leading the team in aces was Lowry again, with seven, then Rogers with five, and Mc-Gatha with four. Leading the team in assists with 30 of the team's 33 assists was Logan Rogers.

Jahn-Carlos Gonzalez is the team's libero and put in some mighty fine work. Gonzalez had 27 of the team's 35 digs and only three dig errors. He also received 29 of the 36 serves and made just one error.

The team is really good and really fun to watch. They have maybe their hardest matchup of the regular season coming up in a game against Winter Park on Tuesday, April 16. Winter Park, is as of Wednesday, April 3, ranked sixth in the state according to FHSAA. Winter Park is 7-0 and has beaten one of the only two teams Apopka has fallen to, the Tampa Bay Heat. The Tampa Bay Heat are currently ranked 11th in the state and defeated the Blue Darters 2-0 on Friday, March 15, at the

beginning of their season. This could be Apopka's chance to show out and compete with a topranked team before playoffs to prepare for the long journey ahead.




