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## WHS football falls to Evans in rescheduled game after hurricane

The story of the Wekiva Mustangs' most recent contest that was against the Evans Trojans was familiar. Evans scored early and often en route to a convincing 39-22 victory.

Held on Monday, October 14, the Trojans tallied the first 27 points of the contest during the first 12:28. Total yards gained were 376-219 in favor of Evans. However, during the first 12:38, the Trojans outgained the Mustangs by a count of 190-44 in total yards.

The explosion of points was amassed by means of a two-yard rush from Li'Darious Pryor, eight-yard pass from Nazir McMillan to Devontae Grant, 12-yard rush from Pryor and 25-yard interception return by Derone Rogers, respectively. Evans moved the ball 60 yards, 12 and 35 in the same order to score the three touchdowns.

The scoring barrage was further strengthened by the Mustangs starting the first three possessions at the Mustangs' 15-, 25-, and 24-yard line. The interception returned for a touchdown and ending the third possession was at least partially due to the 21-0 deficit leaving Wekiva one-dimen-

sional. Defending only the pass is easier than the pass and rush.

Then the next subsequent possession began at the Trojans' 47-yard line. However, opportunity to minimize some of the damage caused by poor field position went by the way-side when losing a fumble and committing a second consecutive turnover.

Rushing with purpose, Evans seized the tone and direction the contest took from the first play. Thirteen yards via the ground were gained by Pryor. The possession consisted of six plays and 60 yards. The more specific tone and direction of plays with big impact was established by the Trojans' ability to consistently gain yards via the ground. Pryor totaled 172 yards rushing with 252 for Evans as a team.

Even after scoring the three touchdowns, the Trojans continued to threaten reaching the end zone because of the starting position. Only one of Evans' six possessions during the first half began inside the Evans' 45-yard line.

Six of Edgar Lopez's eight kickoffs resulted in touchbacks (kicking the ball into the end zone). Subsequent possessions started at the Mustangs' (the receiving team) 25-yard line.

The lack of a strong start and impossible to recover from can also be explained through average gain per play. Final margin of average yards gained per play was only 5.6-5.1 in favor of Evans. Average yards gained per play was 6.85-1.0 during the first three possessions or 12:07 though. Including nine inside the red zone, the Trojans also ran 20 plays compared to 10 for the Mustangs.

Wekiva scored on the first possession of the second half as Jackson Keillor completed a five yard pass to Michael Blackmon. Then the next Trojans' possession ended with a punt and returned 71 yards by Jabari Grant. Two plays later, Isaiah McNish bulled into the end zone from the one-yard line. The other Wekiva touchdown covered 63 yards via the air with Keillor passing and Woulard catching.

However, victory was secured by the Trojans during the fourth quarter with a five yard rush from Pryor and 20 yard McMillan to Cawanis Leonard pass.

Overall records are now 5-2 for Evans and 2-5 for Wekiva.

The Mustangs had won the previous five meetings dating back to 2015.

## Can Apopka make the playoffs? Or will this season spell the end of the 24-season streak?

The Apopka Blue Darters are set to play what would've been their eighth game of the regular season against Osceola High School Kowboys tonight Friday, October 18. But thanks to last week's unfortunate weather, the contest against Cocoa High School was canceled and most likely will not be rescheduled. The Blue Darters sat at 3-3 on the season before the game against the Kowboys and were seventh in Class 7A Region 2 just barely in playoff contention. So, will Apopka's legendary playoff run end at 24 years? Or can we will ourselves into the postseason?

After some research and speaking to fellow FHSAA football fans, I've done my best to understand how FHSAA and Max-Preps structure the playoff bracket this year. If you remember, before this year we had a different classification system for all Florida high schools. So, this year the playoffs may look a little different.

**How to get in?**

The playoff brackets are separated by class and then by region. Each class has four regions and each region within its class, such as our region two in Class 7A, gets its own regional championship that consists of the eight best teams in

that region who compete for a spot in the final four. The final four puts the four regional champions against each other for the state semifinal in that class, and the winners of each will face off in the final state championship game.

Now, the bracket will work like so: 32 teams will qualify for the playoffs with eight from each of the four regions. District champions in each region will receive an automatic playoff berth and will receive a one through four seed based on the points accumulated throughout the season. The other four slots per region will be filled by wild card teams decided by the highest accumulation of points after the regular season. The higher-seeded team will always host the playoff game

as well.

So in Class 7A, we have four regions and Apopka belongs to Region Two. There are four districts in Class 7A Region Two and 17 teams. The four districts are; District Five, District Six, District Seven, and District Eight. The 17 teams in ranked order as of Wednesday, October 16 are; Venice High School, West Orange High School, New-some High School, Strawberry Crest High School, Plant City High School, Ocoee High School, Apopka High School, Alonso High School, Summer High School, Ridge Community High School, Riverview Sarasota High School, Haines City High School, Sarasota High School, Le-

It has been three weeks since the Apopka Blue Darters donned the blue and white and touched the field under the Friday night lights. It's a strange gap in the season and one that couldn't be controlled. But, the wait is over as the Blue Darters play tonight at home against the Osceola Kowboys.

The Blue Darters are coming into this game with a 3-3 record and the Kowboys are sporting a 5-2 record. The Kowboys are also the 58th-ranked team in the state while we are the 100th. While on paper the Kowboys look marginally better than the Blue Darters, some outside forces could help us win this game other than just our play on the field.

The Kowboys also had their game last week canceled due to the weather. But unlike Apopka, they rescheduled their game and

just so happened to play it earlier this week on Tuesday, October 15. The Kowboys defeated Viera 49-9. But they will be coming into the game not as well rested as Apopka who is coming off a near three-week hiatus from games.

The Kowboys are on a two-game win streak while the Darters are coming off two losses. In their seven games, the Kowboys have scored 230 points and have allowed 94. In Apopka's six games, they have scored 75 points and allowed 66. The obvious distinction between us and Osceola is our offenses.

The Kowboys have a run-heavy offense that has collected nearly 81.4 percent of their offensive yards on the ground. Of their 2,206 total yards collected so far this season only 410 of them are passing yards. Osceola is averaging 256.6 rushing yards a game and 7.3 yards a carry while also collecting 22 rushing touchdowns so far.

But thankfully, Apopka's run defense is ironclad. Apopka has only allowed over 100 rushing yards by just two teams this season: Evans and Edgewater.

Comparing their offense to Apopka's, you see the clear difference. Apopka has collected 1,458 yards this season with 1,187 of them coming from the ground and just 271 through the air. Apopka is averaging 177 rushing yards per game and 6.5 yards a carry while collecting just seven rushing touchdowns.

Another huge part of the Kowboys' game is their defense. In Osceola's first six games, they collected 19 tackles for loss, 24 sacks with a total of 106 yards lost, five interceptions, defended 45 passes, and recovered three fumbles. Other than their 34-28 overtime loss to Jones and their 24-7 loss to the Lake Mary Rams, the Kowboys

high Senior High School, George Jenkins High School, Winter Haven High School, and West Port High School.

### Can Apopka make the playoffs?

To see if Apopka will make the playoffs, we will have to look at the other districts in Region Two to see where we stack up against the other 17 teams. In the list I made above, Apopka, at the time this was written, was ranked seventh in Region Two.

Apopka could make a wild card berth, but it is

unlikely for us to earn a playoff berth through being district champions as the Blue Darters have no more district games this season. Apopka currently sits at second in our district with a 2-1 district record scoring 66 points and allowing 25 against district opponents. West Orange who sits at the top of our district in Region Two has one more district game against Ocoee. West Orange is currently 23-0 in district play scoring 73 points and only allowing 19 against district opponents.

If Ocoee beats West Orange, then Apopka, West

Orange, and Ocoee would all be tied at 2-1 in district play. If that were to happen it would come down to the scores in this season's district games.

With West Orange sitting with 73 points scored and 19 points allowed and Ocoee sitting with 48 points scored and 18 points allowed Apopka will still not be at the top of the district leaderboard. But if Ocoee can win while also putting up a lot of points on West Orange, while West Orange also puts up a lot of points on Ocoee, Apopka could have a shot. Apopka has just a six-

point difference in allowed points this year to West Orange and a seven-point difference to Ocoee. Apopka has only allowed 25 points this season in district play while West Orange and Ocoee have only given up 19 and 18 respectively.

So in theory, if Ocoee can put up a lot of points on West Orange and win the game that may make up for the scoring differential Apopka has compared to West Orange at 66 points scored for Apopka and 73 for West Orange.

So if that's how Apopka makes the playoffs as a district champion – what

happens if we aren't district champions? Well, then we go to hoping for a wild card spot.

So as of press time, the leaders in each district are West Orange for District Five, Ridge Community for District Six, Newsome for District Seven, and Venice for District Eight.

Now after the four district champions, the next four highest-ranked teams earn the four spots. So after taking out Venice, West Orange, Newsome, and Ridge Community, the top four teams ranked in Class 7A Region Two are Straw-

berry Coast, Plant City, Ocoee, and then Apopka in that order.

If nothing were to change, then yes, Apopka would make the playoffs by a very slim margin if my math is correct. The problem is that this will all change by next week and we could have a completely different reality in front of us. But as of press time, Apopka has opportunities to make it to the playoff, but will need to play much better to seize them and continue the Darter playoff legacy.

have kept all of their opponents under 10 points.

The Apopka defense in their first five games had 22 tackles for loss, 15 sacks, two interceptions, defended 13 passes, and recovered five fumbles. These stats do not account

for our stats in the West Orange game though. So, looking at it, our defense is nearly on par with Osceola with them outshining Apopka in some places and Apopka outshining them in others.

I think the biggest difference in this matchup will be the strength of the schedule. Osceola has just two games this season

where they played a program ranked within the top 100 in Florida. They lost them both. A 24-7 loss to the Lake Mary Rams who are the 24th ranked team in Florida. And a 34-28 overtime loss to the Jones Tigers who are ranked 18th in the state of Florida. The rest of Osceola's opponents this year have been ranked at 167th (Treasure Coast),

112th (South Dade), 310th (St. Cloud), 216th (Melbourne), and 174th (Viera).

This is a major difference from Apopka which has faced three teams in the top 100 with the rest just outside of the top 100, excluding West Port. I think Apopka's experience with elite teams so far this season mixed with our freshness gives us a good

opportunity to secure a victory at home. It won't be easy, especially against this Kowboys defense, but if we can convert red zone opportunities and stop the Osceola run game as we have been all year against other teams, we can win this game and hopefully turn the season around.

# Post hurricane updates from the St. Johns River Water Management District

## Hurricane Milton increases flood risks for St. Johns River Oct. 10

The District is advising residents along the St. Johns River of increased flood risks due to Hurricane Milton. The storm's high, sustained northeasterly winds are causing the river to reverse its flow for several days, increasing the likelihood of flooding along the river from Jacksonville to central Florida.

"The St. Johns River is a very slow-moving river, meaning it can take weeks for storm-related rainfall to flow through the watershed and for river levels to return to normal," said St. Johns River Executive Director Mike Register. "The

combination of reverse flow and significant rainfall increases the potential for long duration flooding along the length of the river and in low-lying areas."

Severe flooding is already occurring in several areas throughout the District, including record level flooding in Deep Creek located in St. Johns and Putnam counties. As water levels fluctuate, residents are urged to stay informed by following updates from their Emergency Operations Center for the latest local emergency updates, including evacuation orders and flood-related rescue efforts.

For real-time updates, including flood warnings, river stages, and emergen-

cy contacts for local governments, residents are encouraged to visit the District's storm information page at [www.sjrwmd.com/storm](http://www.sjrwmd.com/storm).

## District begins property assessments following Hurricane Milton Oct.11

The District has reopened its offices today, with staff actively conducting safety assessments of District-managed lands. Some properties are expected to reopen as early as this afternoon, depending on the results of those evaluations.

Due to significant flooding, the Lake Apopka Wildlife Drive will remain closed until further notice.

The District anticipates reopening its navigational locks on Saturday, Oct. 12, following final safety inspections.

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# Bread-n-Butter Pickle Mayonnaise can be for sandwiches, dips, salads

Marvin Woods has so many wonderful recipes, this week's column is dedicated to them. He shares his recipe for Spicy Pulled Pork Shoulder in his book titled *The New Low-Country Cooking*. He adds in a note, "Ask the butcher to bone the shoulder. Basically, you want to tie the pork several (five to seven) rings around to ensure that it doesn't fall apart during the cooking process. Leave 1 to 2 inches between the rings."

Marvin says in *The New Low-Country Cooking*, "I created this all-purpose flavoring mixture using three different types of chiles. The ancho is a smoked chile that registers around 6 or 7 on a heat scale of 1 to 10. Jalapenos rank about 5 or 6, and habaneros (or Scotch bonnets) are at 10. This paste has two purposes. One, of course, is to provide heat. The other is to add complexity to whatever you use it in because of the smoky flavor of the ancho chiles. I strongly suggest that you use this paste a little at a time and then taste the dish. Remember, you can always add more, but can't take it away!"

Pan-Fried Catfish also from his book, *The New Low-Country Cooking*, calls for nice big catfish fillets and buttermilk, sherry and two kinds of vinegar, along with sundry other ingredients. Marvin Woods says, "Catfish are bottom-dwellers, so they pick up a distinctive earthy flavor. Today, most catfish are farm-raised, which means they are bred in pretty clear water and are fed wheat and corn pellets. This makes the fish a lot sweeter and more subtle in flavor. This fish can be eaten with just a squeeze of lemon or served with Bread-n-Butter Pickle Mayonnaise.

Here is another of Marv's recipes. This one is for Sweet Potato Fries, and it looks scrump-dilly-icious! He says, "Simple to make, these are a nice change of pace from ordinary French fries. I serve these fries with steak or pork chops, but they work well with most anything that you would ordinarily serve with French fries. Try sprinkling them with Marv Spice or dunking them in Marv's Hot Sauce or another favorite hot sauce.

Bread-n-Butter Pickle Mayon-

naise from Marv's book is used as a spread for sandwiches, a dip for chips, and even as a dressing for a salad. It's quick and easy to make and adds a lot of character to whatever dish you serve it with. It is also used as an ingredient in some of his recipes. See the recipe, below.

## SPICY PULLED PORK SHOULDER

*The New Low-Country Cooking*  
by Marvin Woods

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary leaves, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh sage leaves, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh thyme leaves, or 1 tablespoon dried
- 1 tablespoon Chili Paste (see recipe below), or 1 tablespoon Tabasco sauce plus 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon freshly ground black pepper
- One 6- to 8-pound boneless pork shoulder
- 1/2 celery rib, coarsely chopped
- 2 onions, coarsely chopped
- 3 carrots, coarsely chopped
- 2 cups water

1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 2) In a small bowl, stir together the garlic, herbs, Chili Paste, salt, and both (cayenne and black) peppers. Rub the pork all over with the mixture. Tie the pork before cooking (see note). 3) Place the vegetables in the bottom of a roasting pan, and cover with the water. Place the pork on top of the vegetables and cook for 40 minutes. Turn the pork. Continue cooking for about 40 minutes per pound, or until the pork is tender enough to be shredded with a fork. 4) When the pork is done, remove it from the pan. Let the meat cool down to the point where you can work with it without burning yourself. Using a fork, pull pieces off until you have shredded all the meat. (There may be some big pieces that you have to cut with a knife.) 5) Transfer the vegetables and juices in the bottom of the pan to a blender or a food processor fitted with the metal chopping blade. Process until almost smooth. Strain through a medium sieve. Serve this as

a sauce, a spread, or add chicken or vegetable stock and use to reheat the pork in.

## MARV's CHILI PASTE

*The New Low-Country Cooking*  
by Marvin Woods

- 1 cup dried ancho chiles
- 1/2 cup warm water
- 4 to 5 fresh jalapeno peppers, stemmed
- 1-1/2 to 2 cups fresh habanero or Scotch bonnet peppers, stemmed
- 1/4 to 1/2 cup vegetable oil

First and most important, use gloves when you are working with the chiles.

Place the ancho chiles in the warm water and let stand for 15 minutes. Remove the chiles and drain off the excess water. Place the ancho chiles, jalapenos, and habaneros in the container of a blender. While adding the oil in a slow steady stream, process the peppers until a puree is formed. Store in a covered glass container in the refrigerator for up to one week.

## PAN-FRIED CATFISH

*The New Low-Country Cooking*  
by Marvin Woods

- Six 8- to 10-ounce catfish fillets (preferably farm-raised)
- SHERRIED BUTTERMILK MARINADE:
- 3 cups buttermilk
- 1/2 cup sherry
- 1 tablespoon sherry vinegar plus 1 tablespoon white wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons celery seeds
- 1-1/2 tablespoons garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt
- BREADING:
- 1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup fine yellow cornmeal
- 2 tablespoons garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1-1/2 cups vegetable oil

1) In a large bowl, whisk together all the marinade ingredients. Place the catfish in a large shallow dish. Pour the marinade over the fish, cover the dish with plastic wrap, and refrigerate for 24 hours. 2) In a shallow bowl or pie plate,

combine all the breading ingredients. Remove the catfish from the marinade, letting excess run back into the dish. Dredge the fillets in the breading mixture to lightly coat both sides; shake off any excess. 3) In a large skillet (preferably cast iron), heat the oil over medium heat. When the oil is hot, about 350 degrees Fahrenheit, carefully lower the fillets into the pan. Cook until the fillets are lightly browned and the flesh is opaque throughout when flaked with a fork, 3 to 5 minutes on each side. Use a slotted spatula to remove the fish to a warmed serving plate.

## BREAD-N-BUTTER PICKLE MAYONNAISE

*The New Low-Country Cooking*  
by Marvin Woods

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup finely chopped bread-and-butter pickles
- 1-1/2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

In a medium bowl, mix together all of the ingredients. Taste and check the seasoning, adding more salt and pepper if needed. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks.

## SWEET POTATO FRIES

*The New Low-Country Cooking*  
by Marvin Woods

- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon celery salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin
- Vegetable oil for deep frying
- 6 sweet potatoes, cut into julienne strips

In a small bowl, stir together the nutmeg, chili powder, cayenne, celery salt, coriander, and cumin. In a deep fryer or a large deep skillet, heat the oil over medium-high heat until it registers 375 degrees Fahrenheit on a deep-fat thermometer. Add the sweet potato strips and cook until crispy and golden, 5 to 7 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, transfer the cooked sweet potatoes to several layers of paper towels to drain. Sprinkle with the spice mixture.
