# Another undefeated week for Apopka boys basketball!

Last week the Apopka Blue Darters boys basketball team defeated Ocoee (57-56), Wekiva (58-39), and South Lake (62-58) in a great showing before the Christmas break. With the close win over Ocoee, Apopka still sits atop the Class 7A District 3 leaderboard 2-0 in district play and 10-3 on the season. The boys are currently ranked 54th in the state, 11th in Class 7A, and 17th in Orlando.

## Apopka vs. Ocoee (District Matchup) (57-56) Win

The week started with Apopka's second district

matchup of the season – the Ocoee Knights. This game started rough for Apopka as the Blue Darters fell behind quickly. Just halfway through the first quarter Apopka was down 10-2 and couldn't seem to get anything to work for them. As the quarter went on Apopka began to find their footing on offense and defense, slowly evening out the score before the end of the quarter. Apopka made just four of their 14 shots in the first quarter.

The second quarter started with Apopka and Ocoee tied at 10-10. Apopka did better in the second quarter getting ahead and staying ahead for the entirety of it. While Apopka was still struggling with

shooting, they were making shots when they counted and pulled ahead of Ocoee by three points before the end of the first half. The Blue Darters shot 5-for-14 in the second quarter and went into the locker room up 23-20

The third quarter is where Apopka's shooting problems put them in a hole. Apopka once again shot 5-for-14 but Ocoee shot 7-for-14 and three of those shots were from beyond the three-point line. The Knights pulled ahead in the third quarter outscoring Apopka 19-12 going into the fourth quarter up 39-35.

All season, Apopka has been a second-half team – but now after falling behind in the third, Apopka needed an explosive fourth quarter to come back from the four-point deficit.

The fourth quarter really did belong to Ocoee for almost the entirety of it as they pushed further ahead of the Blue Darters. Apopka was able to inch ahead of Ocoee twice in the fourth quarter but only for a moment. Luckily it was the most important moment for Apopka as they pulled ahead in the final possessions of the game.

The fourth quarter was an offensive onslaught from both teams and Apopka scored more points in the fourth quarter than they did in the first half – Apopka scored 22 points in the fourth quarter and Ocoee scored 17. In the fourth quarter, Apopka's shooting troubles had gotten better with Apopka shooting

9-for-17. Apopka won the game 57-56 spectacularly. The win kept Apopka undefeated in district matchups and cemented their spot in first place in the leaderboard until the rest of the district finishes their matchups.

The biggest problem in this game for Apopka was the shooting percentage. Apopka had a 15.4 shooting percentage from the three-point line making just four of the 26 shots put up from three-point range. Just over 40 percent of Apopka's shots were from beyond the arc but they only made 15.4 percent of those shots. The silver lining was Apopka's shooting percentage inside the arc and in the paint was over 50 percent. This compounded with their want, or even their need, to win was enough to squeak by with a victory.

Apopka was led to victory by seniors Jude Angervil, Jermichael John-

son, and Larson Taylor. Angervil had 18 points shooting 50 percent from the field while also tallying eight rebounds, four deflections, one steal, and one block. Johnson brought in 11 points shooting 57 percent from the field while bringing in three rebounds, two assists, three deflections, and one steal. Taylor brought in 12 points shooting 75 percent from the field while also tallying seven rebounds and two steals.

## Apopka vs. Wekiva (58-39) Win

The Mustangs vs. the Blue Darters – the rivalry that consumes the city of Apopka and brings out the fervor of rivalry. This was and is the only matchup with Wekiva this year for Apopka and they were able to walk away with the win.

This game was dominated by the Blue Darters from the tip-off. Apop-

ka outscored Wekiva 31-15 in the first half and never looked back. The Blue Darters scored the most points of the night in the third quarter outscoring Wekiva 18-8. Wekiva was able to outscore Apopka in the fourth 14-9. The Blue Darters also dominated the paint with 20 points inside shooting 38 percent (10-for-26).

Apopka's shooting in this game was great at 37 percent for the team, but even better than their shooting was their defensive presence and the ability to turn their defense to offense in a flash and live off transition and points from turnovers. The Blue Darters scored 13 points in transition and 16 points from turnovers.

Now Apopka is still having trouble with turnovers as they are averaging 15.84 turnovers a game

# A look at the boys basketball season as it passes the halfway mark of the season

Last week closed another undefeated string of games for the Apopka Blue Darter boys basketball team as their win streak hit a season-high of six games. Apopka defeated the Ocoee Knights 57-56 on Tuesday, December 17, then Wekiva 58-39 on Thursday, December 19, and finally South Lake 62-58 on Friday, December 20. As of Monday, December 23, the Apopka Blue Darter boys basketball team is 10-3 on the season, 2-0 in district play, and is ranked 54 in the state of Florida.

Over their last six games (Dr. Phillips, Mount Dora, Discovery, Ocoee,

Wekiva, and South Lake), as of Monday, December 23, the Apopka Blue Darters have played great, showing improvement in areas they have struggled with. As a team, Apopka has shot 39.9 percent from the field cashing in on 138 of their 346 shots in those six games. The team has

also collected 72 assists, 220 rebounds, 69 deflections, 64 steals, 15 blocks, and 86 turnovers.

In comparison, Apopka's opponents in their last six games have shot 34.4 percent from the field making 103 of the 299 shots taken against the Blue Darters. Their opponents also collected 49 assists, 180 rebounds, 51 deflections, 43 steals, seven blocks, and 109 turnovers.

One of the most important things in high school basketball is the ability to turn your opponent's mistakes into scoring opportunities. Apopka has done great at this, scoring 108 points off turnovers in six games compared to their opponents who scored just 58.

Another huge part of the high school game is the ability to defend as well as score in the paint. Apopka is doing much better than their opponents in their last six games keeping them to just 41.79 percent shooting inside the paint allowing just 56 of the 134 shots. Apopka on the other hand made 89 of their 156 shots inside the paint or 57.05 percent.

The one flaw I see in Apopka's game right now is the reluctance to take a two-point jump shot. In their last six games, Apopka has taken 346 shots. Of those shots, 156, or 45.08 percent, came from inside the paint, 168, or 48.55 percent, of those

# APK boys wrestling finish 30-26 at Bill Scott Memorial Tournament

The process required for the Apopka Blue Darter wrestlers to reach the expectations, legitimately higher than most, is in full swing. This season's schedule is one tournament and competition after another found on the list of who's who.

Apopka entered the 51st Bill Scott Memorial Tournament at Lyman High School and the season's second competition on the heels of winning the Gauntlet on the Grove.

In comparison to the Gauntlet on the Grove, the overall result was a bag of some success continuing and some not so much.

Out of 28 teams and almost three times more than those competing at the Gauntlet on the Grove, the Blue Darters placed 16th with 80 points. A solid overall record of 30-26 was compiled by Apopka. At least two matches were won along with a .500 record compiled by 11 Blue Darters against a much larger field. Victories were recorded 19 times by pinfall as well.

Consistently winning the first match during the Gauntlet on the Grove was the impetus for Apopka wrestlers consistently reaching the semi-

nals. Only one match during the first round was list, positioning the wrestlers to earn the majority of the Blue Darters' points. Another solid total of seven Apopka wrestlers won the first match at the Bill Scott Memorial Tournament. By the second round though, only three Blue Darters were still competing in the winners bracket. Then pinfalls accounted for 17 of the losses.

Brandon Roberts' (215 pounds) placed fifth.

One more victory separated Enrique Zenteno and Sebastian Olivencia-Gravals from placing.

In order to place, five other Apopka wrestlers needed two more victories.

There are 14 weight classes in the sport of wrestling at the high school level.

Double elimination tournaments are the norm for each weight class, including the Bill Scott Memorial Tournament. Two brackets make up a double elimination tournament, the winners' or championship and the consolation. After the semifinal round ends, four entries remain in the consolation bracket and two in the winners. Entries in the consolation bracket can place anywhere be-

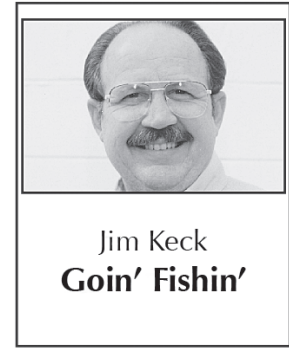

## New moon on Dec. 30th should get specks biting

Hello Folks,

I hope everyone had a very Merry Christmas and maybe you had a chance to try out the new fishin' rod and reel. Maybe you got some new lures to try. Whatever you got, I hope you got what you wanted this Christmas.

The specks are bitin' and folks are gettin' on the water and catchin'em. Kyle at Bitter's Bait & Tackle reports that the folks that are comin' into the shop and gettin' a bucket of minners are doin' real good in Lake Monroe and Lake Jesup. Most of the specks are bein' caught in Lake Monroe drif-

tin' open water with minners. A few specks are bein' caught on jigs tipped with a minner.

Please make sure you use a bright colored jig that's gonna get those ole specks' attention. I also got a report that a few specks are bein' caught in Lake

Kissimmee, too. A few specks are movin' into shallow water to spawn. We have a new moon on Monday, the 30th, so that will help get those specks to bitin', too.

The bass fishin' has been real good down at The Headwaters. Folks are catchin' 30-plus bass on shiners and a few big'uns are bein' caught as well. If you haven't fished "The Headwaters", you need to put it on your list of places to go bass fishin'. It will be an opportunity you won't soon forget.

The bass fishin' has been pretty good on the

Harris Chain and the Kissimmee Chain. Most folks are fishin' with shiners, tryin' to catch their personal best. This is the time of year when you have a chance to catch and release a big bass.

Make sure you are registered with TrophyCatch.com to record your bass, if it's over 8 pounds. You can get all the information at their website, on how to weigh, measure, and get a picture of your bass. Once you submit your bass, and it's accepted, you will get a letter of recognition and some gift cards for your entry. If you live in Flor-

ida this is a great program and you can win some great prizes, too.

The Maitland Chain bass fishin' is doin' good. Lots of bass are bein' caught throughout the chain. Most of the bass are bein' caught on shiners free-lined out the back of the boat. You need to free-line your shiners over the submerged hydrilla and eel-grass throughout the chain.

The bass fishin' on the Butler Chain is doin' real good as well. You can catch quite a few of small bass around 1 to 1.5 pounds on a variety of baits. You should try fishin' the shoreline

grass at first light and move to deeper water as the sun gets up. Try and find some submerged hydrilla beds or pepper grass beds. They usually hold plenty of bait-fish and the bass will hang around those types of areas feedin' on the bait-fish.

Well, that's it for this week. Again, I hope you and your family had a wonderful Christmas and you are lookin' forward to 2025 with great enthusiasm, and excitement.

right now. In the game against Wekiva, Apopka stayed true to their average and gave away 16 turnovers. The good thing is Apopka only allowed Wekiva to score 7 points from those 16 turnovers. But this doesn't change the fact that Apopka has 206 turnovers this season. Come playoff time, 16 turnovers a game is not going to cut it. That's giving away free points that Apopka can't afford.

The Blue Darters who led their team to victory were Angervil, Bowden, and Johnson. Angervil brought in 15 points shooting 41 percent from the field while also tallying six rebounds, one assist, three deflections, three steals, and one block. Bowden brought in 13 points shooting 40 percent from the field while also tallying nine rebounds, one assist, two deflections, one steal, and one block. Johnson brought in 11 points shoot-

ing 45 percent from the field while also tallying one rebound, one assist, three deflections, and one block.

### Apopka vs South Lake (62-58) Win

"Hard fought, not easy. They pose a lot of challenges - their personnel, the stuff they run is very unique, creative, and obviously, they have the two brothers who are both sensational players," said head coach of boys basketball team Scott Williams after the game against South Lake on Friday, December 20.

This game was electric. South Lake is a very well-rounded program with two extremely gifted and

athletic big men who happen to be brothers. Despite that, Apopka was able to quell their offensive output.

The first quarter was a battle with both teams taking the lead more than once but it was Apopka who was able to finish ahead, outscoring South Lake 16-10. Twelve of Apopka's 16 points in the first quarter came from beyond the three-point line as Apopka looked to manipulate South Lake's zone defense to create open shots in the zone gaps.

The second quarter belonged to South Lake as they slowly chipped away at the Blue Darters' lead. Even though they outscored Apopka 16-13, South Lake

still trailed Apopka going into halftime 29-26.

Coming out of halftime, Apopka dominated the start of the third quarter and bounced between shooting from range and attacking the inside. The Blue Darters penetrated South Lake's defense looking to go to the rim, score and get fouled if they didn't.

The plan worked. Apopka scored six points from three-point range, eight points in the paint, and two points from the free-throw line. While Apopka outscored South Lake 16-14, it could've been a better quarter but Apopka's defense began slipping near the end of the third. Apopka was ahead 45-40.

"The zone can pose fits. All being said, we were up 11 in the third quarter and I didn't think we managed that stretch of the game well, and all of a sudden, now you're in a dogfight. And now we are forced to make plays late," said Williams.

The Fourth quarter was another battle with Apopka and South Lake exchanging buckets nearly every possession. Apopka shot 6-for-9 in the fourth quarter while South Lake shot 5-for-12. Apopka outscored South Lake 15-14 in the fourth quarter. It came down to free throws in the final moments of this game

# Best Grilled Burger recipe also uses a 1-inch thick round of onion

Food Net-work says, "When a grilled burger is called for, this one (The Best Grilled Burgers) is our go-to. We season only the outside of each patty right before grilling to help build a nice crust. Our trick for forming the patties is a real time saver, especially if you are cooking for a crowd. You can also form them the day before; place in an airtight container with parchment paper in between to help with party-day prep." Terry Mehlhorn who rated the recipe a 5 out of 5, said, "I love thick slices of red onion on my burgers... both hot and sweet and the added crunch makes for a perfect burger!"

Sally Benton's Chicken or Turkey Gravy is practically a meal in itself. This gravy is thick and tasty with meat from your bird, and if you only had a piece of bread to put it over, you would feel happy and satisfied when you finished.

From Emily Meggett, we have Stuffed Yellow Squash and Zucchini. She says, "Back in my day, we really liked to fill vegetables with all sorts of new foods and flavors. I loved making stuffed zucchini and squash because you could use all of the vegetable parts and create a tasty side that everyone would enjoy, even the children." The picture that accompanies the recipe shows a lovely white platter laden with the golden stuffed squash and zucchini shells.

We have a cookbook called Southern Style, written by Jane Bradley. It is Volume 23 from the Collector's Series of The American Cooking Guild, copyrighted 1987. The author says, "The fact that Sally Lunn was a baker's daughter in Bath, England, in the eighteenth century is about the extent to which cooks can agree when it comes to this recipe. It is a regal loaf, traditionally baked in a ring mold, and really is a pride in Virginia, especially Williamsburg where it is commonly served. I use a decorative pan, called a kugelhofp pan, for a more dramatic looking loaf, but you can use a 9- or 10-inch Bundt or tube pan, or a large savarin ring. These pans can be purchased in specialty cookware stores and gourmet shops."

**2 pounds ground chuck (80/20)**  
**Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper**  
**Vegetable oil, for the grates**



**Four 1-ounce slices Cheddar (optional)**  
**1 large red onion, cut into four 1-inch thick rounds**  
**4 leaves green leaf lettuce**  
**4 slices beefsteak tomato**  
**4 seeded hamburger buns**  
**Mayonnaise, mustard and ketchup, for serving**  
**8 dill pickle chips**

Prepare the grill for medium-high heat. 1) Form the ground beef into four 8-ounce patties. A quick and easy way to do this is to divide the meat into 4 piles. Place a pile on the top of a deli container lid. Take a second deli container lid and place the top of it against the meat. Press down evenly and firmly and watch as a perfect patty forms. Repeat with the remaining meat. Make an indentation in the middle of each patty with your thumb to keep the burger from shrinking as it cooks. 2) Sprinkle each patty on both sides with salt and pepper. Lightly brush the grill grates with oil. Grill the patties, indentation-side up, until marked on the bottom, about 4 minutes. Flip and cook until marked and slightly firm, about 4 more minutes for medium-rare. For cheeseburgers, top with 1 slice cheese during the last minute of cooking if desired; cover the grill to melt. Remove to a plate and let rest for 5 minutes. 3) While the burgers cook, place the onion slices on the grill (try to keep them together in a disk). Cook until they are golden on one side, about 4 minutes, then flip with a metal spatula and sprinkle generously with salt. Cook on the other side until the onions are lightly charred and softened through, about 4 minutes, and transfer to a plate. 4) Right before serving, toast the buns cut-side down on the grill. Top the bottom bun with a burger patty and layer with grilled onion, lettuce and a slice of tomato. Spread the inside of the top of each bun with some mayonnaise, mustard and ketchup. Arrange the pickle chips on top. Flip over to top the burgers and secure with a toothpick if desired.

**SALLY BENTON'S CHICKEN OR TURKEY GRAVY**  
From Sarah Benton, reader of *The Apopka Chief* newspaper  
**Turkey necks (if cut and packaged frozen, thaw and wash cut ends to remove any bone pieces left by saw blades)**  
**2 boxes chicken broth (or beef broth or vegetable broth), all in cartons (reduced sodium)**  
**1 stalk of celery sliced thin**  
**Half a good size onion sliced thin**  
A big part of what makes this gravy

so delicious is the fact that you simmer it for about 4 hours, and it is done only when the turkey meat is coming off the neckbones. Using a strainer spoon, remove cooked neck sections, then pour the rest of the broth through a strainer. Pick through contents of strainer to remove any bone bits freed by cooking. Add the meat to the broth along with thinly sliced celery and onion. Then start cooking. Add a few shakes of poultry seasoning and some tarragon along with ground peppercorn and pink sea salt if needed. Thicken with cornstarch at the end.

If you're making gravy for turkey, use the turkey neck and the giblets that come with the bird. Pull them out the day before you want to cook your turkey. You might want to hold back on the liver since liver is such a strong flavor. If you just want giblet gravy to go with a chicken dinner, use a packet of hearts and gizzards... maybe a half pound to go with a 32-ounce box of chicken broth. You don't have to use necks. You can use just chicken pieces like thighs or chicken backs and chicken wings for making something like gravy. You might consider using reduced sodium broth because when it cooks down, it can be quite salty.

**EMILY MEGGETT'S STUFFED YELLOW SQUASH AND ZUCCHINI**  
Recipe from *Gullah Geechee Home Cooking* by Emily Meggett  
**5 yellow squash**  
**2 zucchini**  
**4 slices bacon, fried until crisp, chopped**  
**1/4 cup (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, at room temperature**  
**1/2 cup breadcrumbs, plus more for topping**  
**1/2 scallion, thinly sliced**  
**Seasoning salt**

1) Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 2) In a 12-quart pot, bring 8 quarts water to a boil over high heat. (No salt added.) Add the whole yellow squash and zucchini to the pot and boil for 4 minuts. 3) After the vegetables are cooked, drain the hot water and replace it with cold water to cool the squash. When the squash and zucchini are cool enough to handle, cut each one in half lengthwise, and cut off the narrow necks of the yellow squash. Chop the squash necks into pieces. Place the necks in a bowl and set aside. 4) Remove the insides of each squash and zucchini half and add them to the necks. 5) Place the halves in a 9 x 13-inch baking dish. 6) To the squash mixture, add the bacon,

butter, breadcrumbs, scallion, and seasoning salt to taste. Mix the ingredients together thoroughly. Use this mixture to fill each yellow squash and zucchini cavity. 7) Sprinkle the top of each stuffed squash and zucchini with breadcrumbs. Pour 1/4 cup tepid water into the bottom of the baking dish to prevent the squash from burning. 8) Bake the stuffed squash for 20 to 25 minutes until the squash is cooked and slightly golden.

**WILLIAMSBURG SALLY LUNN BREAD**  
Recipe from *Southern Style* by Jane Bradley  
**1 cup milk**  
**1/4 cup water**  
**2 tablespoons sugar**  
**2 tablespoons dry yeast**  
**3-1/2 to 4 cups All Purpose flour, sifted**  
**2 teaspoons salt**  
**1/2 cup butter, melted**  
**3 eggs, beaten**  
**Additional butter for mold or pan**  
Heat milk and water until quite warm, about 110 degrees F, testing with an instant read thermometer. Add sugar and dry yeast and stir to dissolve. Set aside and allow the yeast to "proof."

Sift flour and salt, setting aside. 1) Place yeast mixture into the bowl of your mixer fitted with a beater blade. Add butter and beaten eggs and mix well. Gradually add flour. When 3-1/2 cups flour have been incorporated, batter should be very thick but not stiff. If necessary, add remaining 1/2 cup flour to make a thick batter. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise in warm place until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour. 2) Butter a pan and set aside. 3) Beat dough down with mixer or wooden spoon. Turn into prepared pan. Do not fill pan more than half full, using two pans if necessary. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise again for 1 hour or until mixture has almost reached the top of the pan. 4) Meanwhile, preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 5) Bake for 50 to 60 minutes or until bread is golden brown. 6) If bread seems to brown too quickly on top, cover loosely with foil. 7) Cool in pan for a few minutes, then turn out onto wire rack to cool. 8) Bread is best served warm but is also very good sliced and toasted. 9) Baked loaf may be frozen. When ready to serve, remove from freezer and leave bread in original wrapping. Trapped moisture in the wrapper will be reabsorbed by the bread, making it moist. When thawed, unwrap and gently heat in a 325 degree oven for 8 to 10 minutes. Serve immediately. Yield: 1 loaf, 8 to 10 inches.

The following copy is from various historical markers in the Apopka area that have been erected to specifically denote history. It is usually not convenient to stop and read the copy, but the information is important to share. As we prepare to enter a new year, it is helpful to remember the history of past years.

Lake Apopka has a long history as a farming community. Beginning in the 1940s, about 20,000 acres of wetlands along the north shore of Lake Apopka were drained and diked to create farmland in the lake's rich marsh soil. This "muck" soil, in addition to a long growing season, produced a variety of vegetables, making the area one of the top vegetable producing regions in the United States.

A rich and diverse human and cultural history grew on the farms around Lake Apopka, alongside the abundant and verdant crops that fed the nation for decades. The area's farm workers took pride in their work, which helped support the war effort of the mid-1940s. For some, it meant they could settle in the area and no longer needed to migrate with the seasons in order to make a living. Workers who moved to central Florida for farming jobs created a diverse workforce in the region. The diversity of workers included people from the Philippines, the Bahamas, Mexico, Jamaica, Guatemala, El Salvador, Haiti, and even German prisoners of war during World War II.

The farm work was arduous, requiring skill, dexterity and speed. Workers endured the Florida sun, heat, humidity, snakes and numerous biting insects. In the winter, they worked through the biting frost and cold. They spent hours stooped or crawling on hands and knees in the fields as they harvested rows of crops.

Farming directly along Lake Apopka's north shore ended in the late 1990s when a massive restoration effort began. The St. Johns River Water Management District purchased farms along the lake to protect water resources and began returning the fields to wetlands. This work reduced the discharges of fertilizers and pesticides that had caused the water to turn pea green and which had impacted area wildlife.

Masonic Lodge No. 36 of the Grand Jurisdiction of Florida was established in 1856 and is still serving under a warrant issued that year. This building was erected here in 1859; the upper story has been continually used for lodge meetings. The original lower floor was used as a post office, school, church and general store. Masons from miles around visited the community, which was known as The Lodge until the Town of Apopka City was chartered in 1882.

In 1952, due to the effects of deterioration and highway widening, the lower story was removed and replaced. Orange Lodge No. 36 is a "Moon Lodge" and meets on or before the full moon and two weeks thereafter.

The marker was erected in 1976 by City of Apopka Bicentennial Committee in cooperation with Florida Department of State.

The marker is at the intersection of East Main Street (U.S. 441) and Alabama Avenue, on the right when traveling west on East Main Street.

Public education has always been an important part of Apopka's history. In 1879, Orange County held its first institute for teacher education in Apopka.

In the early 1880s, the school in Apopka lacked a permanent building and was forced to hold its classes in rented spaces. Some parents sent their children to neighboring communities that had their own schoolhouses, such as Merrimack and Bay Ridge. This site marks the location of Apopka's first public schoolhouse, built in 1885. It was a

small three-room building that stood beside the original Apopka Baptist Church, west of the site known as the “Old Church Cemetery.”

The Reverend Lucian Drury, minister of Apopka Baptist Church, supplemented his income by working as one of the school's teachers, and in 1889, was appointed its principal. At that time, the school had four teachers; most schools in the area had only one.

In 1891, the schoolhouse at this site burned down, forcing classes to be relocated to another building for the remainder of the year. In 1896, voters approved the construction of a new schoolhouse on Fourth Street, later Main Street. The new school opened for the 1897 school year.

The marker is on Fayette Street, 0.1 miles north of Monroe Avenue, on the right when traveling north. The marker stands in the Edgewood-Greenwood Cemetery.

The marker was erected in 2019 by The Apopka Historical Society, the City of Apopka, and the Florida Department of State.

Rock Springs is the source of the Rock Springs Run, a swift running stream with an average flow of 26,000 gallons per minute and a constant temperature of 68 degrees. The spring flows from limestone containing fossils that date back 17 million years. In 1855, the State of Florida, wanting to encourage settlement in the state's interior, awarded land near Rock Springs to William S. Delk, a veteran of the Second Seminole War. Delk later became the owner of the area's largest plantation. He used the Rock Springs Run to power his grist mill, sawmill and cotton gin. Delk's heirs sold the land to lumber companies.

In 1910, New Jersey doctor, Howard A. Kelly visited Rock Springs. Kelly, one of the founders of Johns Hopkins Hospital and an internationally recognized gynecologist, was an avid naturalist. Taken with the “sweet” spring water from the “mysterious cave,” he purchased 200 acres around Rock Springs in 1921 for use as a wildlife preserve and bird sanctuary.

Kelly and his wife gifted the land to Orange County in 1927 with the understanding that it would remain a public park open to every citizen. Orange County named the park Dr. Howard A. Kelly Park.

The marker was erected in 2015 by The Apopka Historical Society and Museum of the Apokkans, and the Florida Department of State

The marker is on Baptist Camp Road north of East Kelly Park Road, on the right when traveling north.

This little church began as a simple rectangular board and batten structure built in 1886 by the First Congregational Church on Main Street in Apopka. Services were held in the church for ten years until the Great Freeze of 1895 forced the congregation to disband. The building housed various businesses during the subsequent years, and eventually fell into neglect. In 1902, two Orange County educators, sisters Elizabeth Emma and Mary E. Dart, prevailed upon Saint Luke's Cathedral in Orlando to purchase the building for \$75 and start an Episcopal Mission. The Dart sisters, alongside other Episcopalians, restored and re-consecrated the church. Bishop William Crane Gray held the first service on November 16, 1902, in the renamed Church of the Holy Spirit. Parking issues and traffic noise forced the congregation to relocate the church to its current location in 1970. Congregation growth prompted the construction of a new church building, and the "Big Church" was consecrated by Bishop John W. Howe in 1990. The original "Little Church" serves as Holy Spirit's Memorial Garden Chapel. Both churches display Carpenter Gothic architecture and reflect the Gospel Story of Jesus Christ in stained-glass windows.

The marker was erected 2016 by The Episcopal Church of the Holy Spirit and the Florida Department of State.

The marker is at the intersection of East 6th Street and South Highland Avenue, on the right when traveling east on East 6th Street.

tween sixth and third.

Points are awarded for margin of each individual victory, round advancing to and placing sixth or higher. The advancement of each individual entry during each weight class tournament is based on a field of 32.

Five consecutive victories (six matches in total) are needed to place after losing the first match and faced by Olivencia-Grafals. Losing during the second round in the winner's bracket still requires four consecutive victories

to place. If the third match is lost in the winner's bracket, earning no worse than sixth place requires only two more victories. Achieved by Roberts, placing is guaranteed after winning the first three matches and reaching the semifinals. Five consecutive victories are also required to win an individual weight class championship.

The Mexico High School Bulldogs from Mexico, Missouri, and Palmerton Area High School Blue Bombers from Palmerton, Pennsylvania, traveled the farthest to compete. The long out-

of-state trip failed to deter either, though, earning second (227 points) and third place (195), respectively.

However, and with a total of 239 points, the 2024 championship was claimed by the Timber Creek Wolves. Five of the last six Bill Scott Memorial Tournaments have ended with Timber Creek among the top-five in the standings.

Finishing in order from fourth to 12th place was the Fletcher Senators (175.5), Hernando Leopards (170), host Lyman Greyhounds (165), Colonial Grenadiers (154), Sandalwood Saints

(133.5), Deland Bulldogs (124), Bishop Moore Hornets (113), Windermere Wolverines (96.5) and West Orange Warriors (95).

Three Blue Darters also fell only 5.5 points short of 13th place. Difference was the St. Augustine Jackets with 85.5 points, Mount Dora Bulldogs-84, Cocoa Tigers-82.5 and Wekiva Mustangs-80.

Falling to 16th place was perhaps the most telling statistic related to record between the first two rounds and after. Apopka was still in 10th place when the elimination semifinals (last six entries) began.

The rest of the 2024 regular season schedule is made up of the Deland Bulldogs 12 team duals (at Deland, Jan. 10-11), The Lions Den Wrestling Tournament (Lake Nona, Jan. 18), dual vs. the Bishop Moore Hornets (Apopka, Jan. 24), dual vs. the New Smyrna Beach Sharks (New Smyrna Beach, Jan. 25), the Greyhound Open (Lyman, Jan. 25) and dual vs. the Lake Brantley Patriots (Lake Brantley, Jan. 29).

Postseason meets include the District 3A-4 championship meet for dual competition (Ocoee, Jan. 8)

and the Metro Conference Championship (East River, Feb. 7-8). The District 3A-4 championship meet for individual bracketed tournaments (weight classes) is scheduled for February 22 and hosted by the Horizon Hawks. The Lake Mary Rams are hosting the Region 3A-1 championship meet on February 28 and March 1. State championships will be decided on March 6-8 at the Silver Spurs Arena/Osceola Heritage Park in Kissimmee.

as Apopka's Rafael Betancourt put the nail in the coffin with two free throws in the final seconds of the game.

Coach Williams said, "Obviously, a lot of credit to Rafi (Rafael Betancourt) for making the big free throws. Jermichael was just enormous down the stretch, doing Jermichael things, just winning interactions, rebounds, stops, you know, very slowly and subtly

helping us win."

The win for Apopka was brought to reality by the hands of Johnson, Angervil, and Rafael Betancourt. Johnson brought in 14 points shooting 50 percent from the field while also tallying nine rebounds, three assists, two steals, and a block. Angervil brought in 13 points shooting 57 percent from the field while also tallying six rebounds, one assist, and one block. Betancourt brought in 10 points on 33 percent shoot-

ing while also tallying three rebounds, two assists, one deflection, and two steals.

The Blue Darter defense was also able to keep brothers Isaiah Pina and David Pina under control. Isaiah and David on average combine for 34.2 points a game with Isaiah averaging 23.9 a game and David averaging 11.3 a game. The brothers combined for 29 points with 16 coming from Isaiah and 13 from David. While the numbers aren't far off from their average

, the brothers had to take 24 of the team's 53 shots, or 45 percent.

Williams said, "Like the job he (Jermichael) did on 35 (Isaiah Pina) - I don't have any idea how many 35 scored. I'm sure he scored because, yeah, he's very good. But very rarely was it easy for 35 and that was important. And yeah, we gave some stuff away, and number five (Zander Sio-kis) hit some threes. But, at the end of the day, if you don't let 35 beat you, you

got a chance to win."

Apopka played well against South Lake and didn't let their mistakes turn into scoring opportunities. But Apopka and South Lake performed very similarly when looking at the box score - it was the difference of a few plays and shots that determined this game.

The Blue Darters shot 41.5 percent from the field compared to South Lake who shot 39.6 percent. The Blue Darters made seven of


their 14 free throw attempts while South Lake made four of their six. Apopka averaged 1.12 points a possession while South Lake averaged 0.97 points a possession.

Apopka scored eight transition points to South Lake's zero and scored 10 points from turnovers to South Lake's five. Apopka only gave up eight turnovers to South Lake's 14.

South Lake outdid







shots came from beyond the three-point line, and finally, just 22 shots, or 6.35 percent, came from inside the arc.

The two-point shot is a great weapon and used to be a staple of professional and college basketball – but we’re now in the era of the three-pointer. The game at the professional level is built around the three-point ball so it’s only natural for that to trickle down and affect basketball at the other levels.

But I think if the boys can find more shots from inside the arc they can create another outlet for points when driving to the basket or shooting from distance just might not be working.

We are coming up on the end of the regular season for the basketball team as we cross into the new year. The last game of the regular season for Apopka is on Friday, January 31, of 2024. The boys have 12 games left including tournaments before districts and then hopefully a play-off run.

Speaking of districts, looking at Class 7A District 3, which Apopka be-

longs to, the Blue Darters sit atop the standings 2-0 in district play with wins over Lake Brantley and Ocoee. Apopka is significantly ahead of the rest of the district being 10-3 with second place held by Lake Brantley with an 8-4 record, and third held by Ocoee who is 5-6. East Ridge and West Port both have under .500 records this season. With these standings, we have a chance to hold the District Tournament at home and be the first seed.

Apopka has lost just three games this season, two of those losses came at the hands of top 50 teams (Winter Park and Evans) while one came at the hands of Lake Mary who is currently ranked 231 in Florida and 6-5 on the season.

The head coach of the boys basketball team Scott Williams talked to me a little about the losses this season and Apopka’s journey in the postseason.

“You know, right now we’re second in the region and we’re first in our district. That’s a that’s a pretty good place to be. Once again, I would love to have the Lake Mary game back. And quite honestly, would

have loved to have prepared differently for Winter Park. Winter Park right now is first in the region.”

Williams went on to say that the team has a chance to not only be a part of playoff basketball but to host playoff basketball games and be in a position to win a district tournament. He said that it’s very exciting because even though Apopka has been a very good program for many years they have only hosted one playoff game since Williams has been coaching Apopka. Williams said that the ability to host a playoff game is a huge opportunity.

When we talked last Friday after the South Lake game about this week and preparation for a Christmas break tournament Williams stressed the importance of pushing through adversity.

“Well, we’ll sleep for about 48 hours to catch up and have a nice weekend off from practice. We’ll come in on Monday and Tuesday and hopefully get better and refine some things. You know, kind of asses where we are and prepare for the Gainesville Tournament.”

Williams told me that in the tournament the boys

will be playing two teams from Georgia so that will give the boys a different level and type of competition that could prepare them for the playoffs down the road.

“The season is a grind. It’s hard. I told our guys not to be afraid of the struggle, not to be afraid of suffering. Great things happen in our lives when we’re willing to struggle and suffer through it a little bit. And, and I’m proud of our guys, because while we are far from playing our best basketball – we are still finding ways to win games. And, I that’s a that’s a quality that you kind of have to have a little something special inside for,” said Williams.

Today, Friday, December 27, and this weekend the boys will be heading to Gainesville for the Florida Get Down Tournament. Their first game on Friday at 5:30 p.m. is against The Business Engineering Science Tech (BEST) out of Atlanta Georgia. Their second game is on Saturday against Lithonia who is also out of Georgia slated for a 2:30 p.m. tipoff according to the tournament’s website.

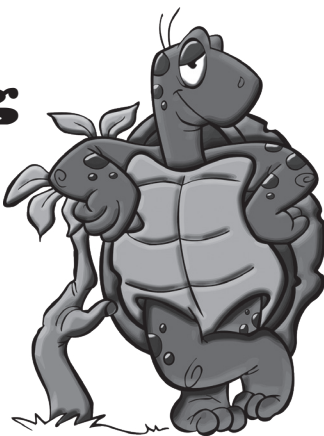
