Can girls basketball make another cinderalla run in the postseason?

Last year, around this time, the Wekiva girls basketball team was 11-9. It was heading into its final four games of the regular season before the district tournament. The girls managed to go on a phenomenal run, only losing two of their next 10 games, with one of them being the 2024 FHSAA Girls Basketball State Semifinal. It's fair to say that just because the girls' record does not scream "championship contender," they very well could be.

As of Wednesday, January 22, the lady Mustangs are 5-14, ranked last in 6A District 5, and 195th in the state according to Max-Preps and FHSAA. Wekiva has 4-7 at home this season, 0-3 away, and 1-4 at neutral ground games such as tournaments. The girls are currently sporting a two-game losing streak and have an almost 200-point scoring differential between them and their opponents this season, with Wekiva scoring 759 points and allowing 926 for a difference of 167 points or 8.78 points behind their opponent a game.

Last week, the girls went 0-2 in their contest against Haines City and Horizon. They fell 58-39 to Haines City and 51-44 to Horizon at home. I got to talk with Wekiva's head coach, Jerry Middleton, after the loss to Horizon last week, and he spoke to me about the state of the team and the season.

Middleton praised his girls for their efforts in the

tough battle against Horizon but touched on why he thinks the season hasn't gone how he and the team had expected. This included injuries to key players, available players fitting into new roles, and the need to maintain their poise in tight games.

"I think that as a unit, we still have to figure out how to master our new roles with injuries. But, with the season not going as planned right now, we have to learn how to slow the game down, just master our new roles. Like I tell our girls, 'Everything we need we have - you've just got to believe.' Not to call any other teams out, but once we click, it's going to be hard to stop us," said Middleton

The Apopka boys' basketball squad is right back to doing what they've done so well this seasonwinning. Last week, the team went 2-0 in their contests against Lake Minneola and Haines City. The team is now 15-5 on the season, 2-0 in district matchups, and ranked 43rd in the state according to MaxPreps and the FH-SAA.

The boys played two games this week, and there are just two more games next week until the end of the regular season. The Blue Darters faced University on Wednesday, January 22, at home and will have traveled today Friday, January 24, to re-

When I spoke with Scott Williams, the head coach of the Apopka boys' basketball team, this week, he told me that the team

would focus on pressure and disruption before the game against Haines City. That plan worked perfectly for Apopka.

This game was explosive! Apopka scored 29 points in the second quarter alone and created a lead Haines City had no chance of returning from. The game started slow, with Apopka actually trailing at the end of the first quarter, which was 15-7. But, as I said, the second quarter belonged to the Blue Darters, as they exploded for 29 points and kept Haines City to just 5. Going into the locker room, Apopka was up 36-20 when they trailed 15-7 just 8 minutes earlier.

I am hoping the anglers had good luck this week, and that I will have some results for my column next



Jim Keck Goin' Fishin'

Kyle at Bitter's Bait & Tackle reports that a few folks have been catchin' some specks in Lake Monroe and Lake Jesup. With this cold weather, I'm sure the speck bite is gonna be a little slow for a couple of days. Once the weather settles down for a few days. the specks should start bitin' again. If you do get a chance to do some speck fishin', make sure you take along plenty of minners. You don't want to get on'em and run out of minners, because you will be kickin' yourself in the pants for not gettin' enough to start with.

Kyle also reports that folks have been catchin' some specks up on the St. John's River around Palat-

ka on minners. The bass fishin' is still doin' good down in Palm Bay, at the Headwaters. Folks are catchin' some big bass on shiners. I keep gettin' notices of lots of bass bein' caught down there, and some bass up to 10 pounds are bein' caught

durin' each trip!

The bass fishin' here has been hit or miss dependin' where you go. Kyle reports that the bass fishin' has been a little slow and if you want to catch a big bass, you need to take some shiners with you on your next trip.

We have a new moon at the end of this month, on the 29th. You all know what I believe about the moon phases. Three days before and three days after the new or full moon will improve your chances in catchin' a big bass. It's not 100 percent a sure thing, but from all my years fishin', and from all my buddies that I have been fishin' with for a while, they'll agree with me.

I started keepin' records of my times when I fished and caught big bass. I was inspired by the Bass Professor a/k/a Doug Hannon, since passed. I had met Doug back in the 80s at a fishin' show I was attending. If you don't know who Doug is, I would suggest you do some research on his expertise in catchin' big bass. He is known for catching and releasing over 800 largemouth bass of 10 or more pounds.

Doug was a great inventor and one of the country's big-bass authorities. He wrote hundreds of newspaper articles and

he also wrote three books. He also invented a pocket guide for anglers called The Moon Clock. This pocket guide is what got me to keepin' records of my catches while I was bass fishin'. It worked for me and if you want to gain some more knowledge about Doug's approach to bass fishin', I would suggest you seek out information on the internet about Doug Hannon, "The Bass Professor".

Apopka also dominated in the third quarter, scoring another impressive 25 points while holding Haines City to 20. As the fourth quarter started, Apopka led 61-40, giving Haines City no opportunities to return.

The Blue Darters finished strong, outscoring Haines City once again in the fourth quarter with a

tamer 16 points and allowing Haines City to score 14. Apopka walked away with a weekend win of 77-54, a great showing of the Blue Darters' offensive capabilities

"Our traps created turnovers and tempo. We took advantage of the open floor, played really unselfishly, and put in a great deal of effort defensively. Doing a lot of trapping requires a great deal

of effort, and our guys did a really good job in that stretch, and things just kind of got away from them (Haines City). And, we were able to take advantage of it," said Coach Williams.

Williams also praised senior Jahi Bowden, who scored a career-high 25 points and was a huge part of the team's rapid progress. Because Apopka was so ahead, everyone got some minutes on the floor, which should help down the road when the team may need its bench to come to life.

Apopka vs. University (51-30) Win

The game against University is interesting for many reasons. First, it is vital for the playoffs, as University also belongs

to Class 7A Region 1 and is fourth in our region under Apopka, who sits second under Winter Park. It is also a sort of revenge game for many of our guys on the team this year, as University knocked them out in the first round of the 2024 FHSAA Boys State Championship Tournament.

As coach Williams told me, it's two different teams facing each other this year, but there may still be some rivalry with our guys, especially our seniors, who were all a part of the group that fell to University last year.

"Well, two different teams and two different collections of players, certainly, there is some rivalry as a program, but we really respect what University did last year and what

they're doing this year. I think they're really, really good. And so certainly, for the guys that were here last year, you would think that they know that they'll be really challenged tonight. But you know, it's about the current team and the current season for us."

This game is also crucial for regional placement in the postseason. According to the FHSAA, as of Tuesday, January 21, Winter Park is first in Class 7A Region 1, Apopka is second, Creekside is third, University is fourth, Lake Brantley is fifth, Colonial is sixth, Seminole is seventh, and Ocoee is eighth. A win or loss here could shift the regional leaderboard quite a bit.

"It's a game that has the opportunity to be huge, easily wake up tomorrow, first in the region – we could very easily wake up tomorrow, third in the region based on the results tonight. And so, obviously, when you're as close as you are to the playoffs, it creates a little bit of extra need to play our best to succeed."

Before the game, University was 13-5, 2-2 in district play, and ranked 100th in the state according to the FHSSA. Coming into the game, University was also on a five-game win streak, so they was feeling and playing very well. After facing Apopka, University only has four more games left in its regular season, so a win for Apopka was huge.

The game had a slow



start, with the first quarter being a low-scoring one that ended with Apopka and University tied at 10.

The first quarter started in University's favor as they jumped ahead 7-2 in the first three minutes of the quarter, but Apopka pushed back to hold them to just one more bucket so they could catch up.

In the second quarter, Apopka's defense began to find its footing, and the plan of trapping with pressure and double teams started to bear fruit. Apopka held University to just seven points and scored

10 in the second, creating a minor lead before heading into the locker room up 20-17.

The second half belonged to the Blue Darters, who came out after half-time to finish the job. The third quarter started slowly, but once Apopka got rolling, they were like a snowball that kept getting more unstoppable as the game continued.

The third quarter ended with Apopka up 32-25, as they began to separate themselves from University on the scoreboard. But in the fourth quarter, Apopka blew the game out of the water.

In the fourth quarter, University was evidently tentative and second-guessing itself, as well as rushing. This was their undoing. Apopka had been using traps and double teams all game to make the University ball handlers uncomfortable. However, in the fourth quarter, the University's desperation to score points to stay in

Williams after the game.

The Blue Darters completely dominated the fourth quarter on both sides of the ball, making University's mistakes and turnovers the start of easy transition points for Apopka. The Blue Darters led 40-28 with 1:24 left in the fourth quarter and let their bench in to grab some valuable minutes against a strong team.

The game ended with Apopka securing the win 51-30, going on an insane 19-5 run in the fourth quarter to put away the game. This win could have very well pushed Apopka to the top of the region, but we

will have to wait and see when the rankings are updated.

"I'm very happy for our guys, and that win will translate for us. I think now we are the one seed in the district. And I'll be interested to see if we may be jumped Winter Park, potentially, because this win will carry.

I'm kind of interested to see if we can stay focused and energized for the next 10 days against three really good teams.

You know, it's kind of uncharted territory for us, but if we're going to do the things we want to do, it's going to be really impor-

tant. So tonight was a great first step.

Apopka at Windermere (Friday, January 24, 7 p.m.)

This game was going to be a shootout before Apopka faced them in the Metro Conference Tournament, but after the Blue Darters' 68-50 loss, Apopka will be coming into this game with a vengeance. Apopka needs competition like this right now for the good of the team as we approach the postseason.

The Blue Darters look like they are set for an ex-

Wekiva vs. Horizon (51-44) Loss

The loss to Horizon was challenging for the Mustangs because they were in a tight battle for most of the fourth quarter. Horizon is a sort of rivalry game for the current girls team and coach Middleton, as they were one of the only teams Wekiva lost to in that ten-game stretch that led them to the FH-SAA Semifinal. Wekiva beat Horizon earlier this season 50-46, so they came in for revenge.

Offensively, the girls started slow, scoring 17 points in the first half and just six in the second quarter. Going into the locker rooms at half, Wekiva was trailing 21-17 and needed to find some energy on the offensive end.

Coach Middleton told me the talk at halftime was focused on ball security. He said that is their Achilles heel and something they have been working on a lot.

In the second half, the girls got right to it and went bucket for bucket, with Horizon trying to find a way to sneak ahead of them. Unfortunately, Horizon was up to the challenge and answered every Wekiva bucket with one of their own. In the third quarter, Wekiva and Horizon both scored 12 points, which kept the Mustangs at a four-point differential,

trailing 33-29.
Coach Middleton attributed the increase in their offensive production in the second half to the girls being patient and letting the game come to

"Just us being patient.
You know, sometimes,

it can transition over the course of the game. Sometimes, it speeds up. Still, you have to understand how to process the game better and understand that it's okay not to score that fast. It's okay to run an offensive set, you know? But we're getting there. Hopefully, that third and that fourth quarter film session can show the girls that this is the brand of basketball

we can play."

The fourth quarter was a battle, with each possession feeling like it could be the one that changed the game. However, a few mistakes and lapses in focus gave Horizon the chance to keep the lead and increase it as they outscored Wekiva 18-15 in the fourth quarter to seal away the win 51-44.

"Some good came from the game, especially that nice run we had in the third and fourth quarters, but we have work to do. The goal is to continue to chop wood and to find a way to perform the way we know we can when it counts going into Districts and then Regional Playoffs.

Looking Back at the Season and Ahead to the

Postseason
Coach Middleton told
me a little about how he
feels about this season as a
whole, and the one thing he
focused on was how adversity builds character.

"Myself and you know my team, but as a coach, I thrive off adverse situations. You know, my approach, my coaching staff's approach to the games, to practice, never changed. You know, because the team follows the head. So, if I'm sporadic, if I'm, you know, just going through the motions because it doesn't look like we could be a Final Four team again, then I'm doing the kids a disservice."

Middleton also said that while he is disappointed with where the team is, he still has faith in his girls and says that they should have faith in themselves.

"But as I tell them, you know, 'Faith without work is dead,' so we gotta have faith that we can do it. I know for a fact that we have the individuals to do it so we can turn it around. So I'm disappointed now, but I firmly believe we'll have something to be proud

of in the end."


As I said earlier, the girls were in a not-ideal situation last year, and they turned it all around. There is still a possibility that that will happen before the end of the season. Coach Middleton told me about the misconception of last year's Final Four team.


"And, you know, many people get confused about our success last year, and they think because of the final destination, the journey seems like it was all peaches and cream.

But nobody realizes that we lost seven out of eight games right before district playoffs, and we didn't play that well in district playoffs. The loss to Horizon in the district playoffs – when we lost by one or two points, we had 30 plus turnovers. Again, it was like, okay, we are tired of being in our own way, so we just got to keep approaching practice and the games with the right mindset and stay together.

And you know, I got a close group of girls like I had last year, and we'll figure it out. But again, adversity breeds character, so there won't be any quitting."

Dixie Deviled Crab recipe only needs to bake 30 mintues as a casserole

Jane Bradley says, in her book Southern Style, "This recipe, Dixie Deviled Crab, was given to me by my Great-Aunt Florence (Mrs.



Blyth Noe) of Washington, North Carolina. In the early days of local T.V., Aunt Florence did a thirty-minute cooking segment on the Hospitality House show. She did this "live" four days a week! When asked how she continued to be so creative, she responded, "There are as many meal combinations as you have thoughts – there's no end to it." This is the easiest recipe for the most delicious deviled crab I've ever eaten. It can be baked in a casserole or in scallop shells as a main dish, or in clam shells as a first course. Aunt Florence prefers to use crab shells, but the health department frowns on this practice unless you are picking the crab yourself. She tells me that clam shells stay hotter longer because of their thickness. You can substitute ceramic or glass shells, available at specialty cookware stores.'

Cabbage: nutritious and inexpensive, is easily prepared. You simply need to open your mind and get past your (need I say, "childish") pre-formed opinions about foods that you may have thought "yucky." Here is a recipe for creamed cabbage.

From Gullah Geechee Home Cooking, Emily Meggett's Dirty Rice recipe. One-pot rice dishes are deeply rooted in West African cooking. Dirty rice is yet another dish that is well seasoned, well cooked, and comes together in just one pot, making it an easy and sure-to-satisfy dish to serve to ten hungry people. The pork sausage adds a sweet and savory flavor, and the rice gets a nice velvety texture thanks to the fat from the pork and bacon drip-

Note: I looked up the ingredient called Nature's Seasons seasoning blend that Mrs. Meggett uses in her Dirty Rice: It is a Morton Salt product, 100-percent MSG-free, that is used as a low-sodium seasoning, containing a mix of onion, garlic, salt, pepper, and other natural spices.

wonderful aunt (now deceased), with her lovely Virginia speech, had a recipe called Apple Dobbler Cake that she used to prepare for us and for her church family for special occasions. And here it is as near as I can read her recipe. If you think, "Where's the leavening agent," whenever you combine acidic ingredients with baking soda, it forms a "rising" event in the baking. In this case, the acid is found in the apples and also the brown sugar.

Our friend Dale Smith loaned us a recipe book titled The Spice of Veith. It has many great recipes and lots of miscellaneous instructions for "don't eat that!" this and that formulations. We chose the Baby Wipes directions to give you this week. *It calls for "baby bath," a tear-free cleansing bath wash and shampoo for babies. Aveeno® puts out a product for this.

DIXIE DEVILED CRAB

Recipe from Southern Style by Jane Bradley

- 1 pound crabmeat
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon yellow mustard 1 jar (4 ounces) pimento, chopped,
- with the juice 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

2 large eggs, beaten Salt and pepper to taste Butter for the dish

1) Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. 2) Pick any bits of shell or cartilage out of crab. Place crab in a large bowl. Add remaining ingredients. Using a fork, mix very well. Pour into buttered casserole or shells and bake for 30 minutes or until nicely browned and a knife, when inserted in middle of casserole, comes out clean. Individual shells will cook in 20 to 25 minutes. Serve immediately. 3) I spray shells with vegetable spray for easy clean-up. You can also give filled shells a quick spray to aid in browning and to keep crab moist. NOTE: Substitute 1 pound canned crabmeat if fresh is unavailable. Serves: 4 (casserole, scallop or ceramic shells) or fills 12 clam shells.

CREAMED CABBAGE

Recipe from PATHS OF SUNSHINE COOKBOOK 1/2 head red cabbage

Maggie Roland, my husband's 1 medium yellow onion, peeled and coarsely chopped

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1/2 teaspoon salt

- 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons light brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon caraway seed
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 large tart green apple, cored and thinly sliced

Quarter cabbage, trim off core at point of each section; cut each quarter into 1/8-inch thick slices. Set aside. Saute onion in oil in 12- to 14-inch skillet over moderate heat about five minutes or until soft. Stir in vinegar, sugar, caraway seeds, salt and pepper. Add cabbage and apple. Bring to boil, then reduce heat to moderate. Cover and cook until cabbage just wilts, about 8 to 10 minutes, tossing occasionally. Serves 4.

EMILY MEGGETT'S DIRTY RICE

Recipe from *Gullah Geechee Home* Cooking by Emily Meggett

- 4 slices bacon
- 1 16-ounce package loose pork sausage
- 1 large onion, diced
- 1 bell pepper, diced
- 4-1/2 cups (1 liter) tepid water
- 1 tablespoon Nature's Seasons 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 1-1/2 teaspoons soy sauce
- 1 teaspoon Kitchen Bouquet (optional)

3-1/2 cups long-grain white rice, rinsed

1) In a large, heavy-bottomed pot, cook the bacon over high heat until crisp. Remove the bacon - but not the oil and drippings – from the pot and allow the bacon to cool. Once cooled, cut the bacon into small pieces and set aside. 2) Meanwhile, roll the sausage into small balls. Heat the same cooking pot and cook the sausage in the bacon drippings until browned, about 5 minutes. Add the onion and bell pepper to the sausage and saute for another 5 minutes. 3) Return the bacon to the pot and add the water. Bring the mixture to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium, then add the Nature's Seasons, crushed red pepper, soy sauce, and Kitchen Bouquet, if using. Return the mixture to a boil and cook for 2 minutes. 4) Add the rice and stir with a fork.

Reduce the heat to low and cook until most of the water has been absorbed. about 30 minutes. If using a steamer, fill the bottom halfway with water, transfer the rice mixture to the top of the steamer, cover, and steam for 20 to 25 minutes, or until done.

AUNT MAGGIE'S APPLE DOBBLER CAKE

Recipe submitted by family of Maggie Roland

- 3 eggs
- 1-1/2 cups salad (vegetable) oil 2 cups brown sugar
- 3 cups plain flour
- 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 3 cups chopped apples 1-1/2 cups chopped pecans
- 1) Mix eggs, vegetable oil, and

brown sugar. Blend eggs, oil, and brown sugar well. Add flour, salt and soda. Mix well. Add vanilla, fold in chopped apples, and pecans. 2) Bake in a greased tube pan at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 1 hour. 3) While cake is still hot, pour topping over the top in the pan. Let cool completely before remov-

ing from pan. TOPPING:

1 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup milk

1 stick (4 oz) margarine or butter

1) Combine ingredients. Cook 1-1/2 minutes until thick. 2) Pour over warm cake in the pan. Cool and serve.

cellent path to the postseason with seeding, but they still need to prepare for postseason play. Apopka has played many playoffcaliber teams this year, but their dreams don't stop at just making the postseason.

The dream is a state championship. To prepare for the games they will need to endure to find themselves in that championship, adversity, like the kind they will face against Windermere, is essential for growth.

In their last matchup

with Windermere, Apopka fell 68-49 and only outscored Windermere in one of the four quarters. Windermere outscored Apopka 16-12 in the first quarter, 19-12 in the second, 18-9 in the third, and Apopka outscored Windermere 16-15 in the fourth.

"Yeah, we did a lot of things well. The things we didn't do, well, it'll be a chance for us to take a look at it and to make some adjustments, both from a player standpoint, but also from a coaching standpoint and making some adjustments to see if we can be

a little more successful," said coach Williams.

Apopka's biggest weakness in that matchup was its turnovers. Apopka gave away 24 turnovers, which Windermere converted into 27 points. The key in this game will be ball security and paint defense, as Windermere gets most of its points from these areas.

Apopka allowed 38 points in the paint in their loss to Windermere mainly because of Windermere's 6'8" power forward Terrance Drain, who is committed to playing for Lib-

erty University, a Division 1 program.

In Apopka's loss to Windermere, Drain scored 21 points, shooting 66.7 percent from the field, collecting 16 points in the paint, eight rebounds, four assists, two deflections, one steal, and one block.


Ball security, paint defense, and controlling Drain will be key to Apopka's chances of winning this game. The problem with focusing too much on Drain or on the interior leaves the perimeter open for Windermere's other players who are still elite.

On multiple occasions, Coach Williams has told me that Windermere is one of the best offensive teams in central Florida this year because of Drain and the guys that Windermere has surrounded him with, who complement his game.

Coach Williams also talked to me about how the matchup is not great for Apopka in terms of playing styles. He reiterated something a coaching friend of his says often, "styles make, fights."

"They're very, very difficult for us, not necessarily because they're better. Their personnel and what they do makes it difficult for us to do what we do. Sometimes, as one of my coaching friends likes to say, 'styles make fights,' and they just happen to be a poor matchup for us.

Still, nonetheless, I'm excited about the opportunity to go over there and dig in and fight like heck and see if we can make it even more of a good basketball game than we did last time."

Avoid leaving pet food or dishes outside overnight. Tethered pets should be able to move a safe distance away from their food bowl.

Keep areas around outside pens and enclosures well mowed to

Before letting pets out into the yard, make noise and flash lights to startle other wildlife that could be in the yard.

Install motion detector lights around all areas of the property.

In the event of a pet treeing a bear, call your pet inside to a safe and secure area, allowing the bear time to retreat.

Black bears are most commonly attracted to neighborhoods by unsecure garbage, pet food, and the contact. bird seed; most interactions can be reduced if residents remove and secure trash with either a shed or bear-resistant trashcan and minimize the time pet food and bird seed is outside or keep those foods

Consider walking your pet on non-retractable leash which allows better control of your pet in the event of an encounter.

Bears are most active at night and during dusk and dawn. Try walking your pet during daytime hours. If that is not possible, be careful around wooded areas.

While walking your pet, bring noise makers or bear spray. Making noise will alert wildlife to your presence and allow time for it to move away from you and your pet.

If contact occurs between your pet and wildlife do not try to physically separate your pet and the animal. Retreat to a safe place; if possible spray the animal with bear spray or a water hose and make loud noises to try to break up

Hazing is an effective way to encourage wildlife to stay away from people. Making noise with your voice, an air or car horn, pots and pans, or a can full of pennies are recommended techniques.

Bear Spray can be used to deter a bear if you encounter one at close range (within 30ft). This highly effective product can be found online or through any outdoor product supplier

Protect your pets with an electric fencing enclosure. Check often to ensure that the fence is function-

Sturdy wooden hutches are the most reliable form of protection for outdoor small animal enclosures such as rabbits and guinea pigs. Securely attach a side of the cage to a permanent structure to prevent the hutch from falling over. Secure doors with locks, keep top covered and secured. In bear country, add an electric fence for further protec-

Would you like to have a hobby? Consider making casts of wild animal tracks

With a little trial and error casting with some common dog tracks, youcan develop your skills for making good casts of wild animal tracks.

Plaster can be found at any arts and crafts store in your community. Spendsome time reading the directions and figuring out measurements needed to doyour castings.

Plan ahead when you go hiking or camping. Measure out some plaster into afew plastic bags and find a suitable container for measuring water and mixing your plaster when needed. Use a container that you don't plan to use for food storage or preparation. The sandwich or snack containers are ideal for this task. You can measure your water in a measuring cup, pour it into the container and then mark the container with a marker or tape to show the water level needed when you are ready to mix your plaster.

The other items to bring will help contain your plaster around the animal track.

Cut up a cereal box into long strips about two inches wide. Find some large paper clips. You can then paper clip the cardboard strips together into ovals or circles depending on the size of the animal track(s) you want to cast. If the ground is soft, it is

a good idea to push the cardboard circle into the ground.

Materials to bring:

1. Pre-measured bags of plaster

2. Measuring/mixing container (you can find a stick to use as a stirrer) 3. Cardboard strips

and paper clips 4. Water container

5. Fluorescent marker tape or cloth strips to mark the track location.

Directions:

with water

1. Locate a track that you want to cast.

2. Paperclip your cardboard pieces together to your preferred cast size-allow at least two inches around the track. Place the cardboard circle around your animal track.

3. Measure your water to the marked line on your container.

4. Add your dry plaster powder to the water and mix thoroughly until it has a pancake batter consistency.

5. Pour your plaster into the animal track and cardboard mold.

6. Gently spread the plaster without digging into the ground below so that you don't destroy your animal track.

7. Mark the location with the florescent tape or cloth strip tied to a stick.

8. Check back in a half hour to see how the

plaster is setting. If the plaster is still soft, check back in another half hour.

9. When your plaster has hardened, remove the cardboard pieces and lift out you track.

10. Smooth the edges of your cast and avoid touching the animal track area until the plaster has dried.

11. When the cast is dry (check the directions on your plaster container), clean off any debris and use a dry paintbrush to clean off the dirt or sand.

12. On the back of your cast, use a pencil to write the location where you found the track and identify the animal* species. Include the date and your name for future reference.

Note: Remember to pack out your mixing containers. These can be reused once the plaster has dried. Avoid cleaning these containers in sinks as the plaster will clog the drain.

*The Internet has a variety of sites that show the tracks of animal spe-

FWC has information posted on its critter pages. Have fun identifying the animal tracks you find. Animal casts are good educational tools at nature centers--consider donating your casts if you want to help others learn about wildlife.
